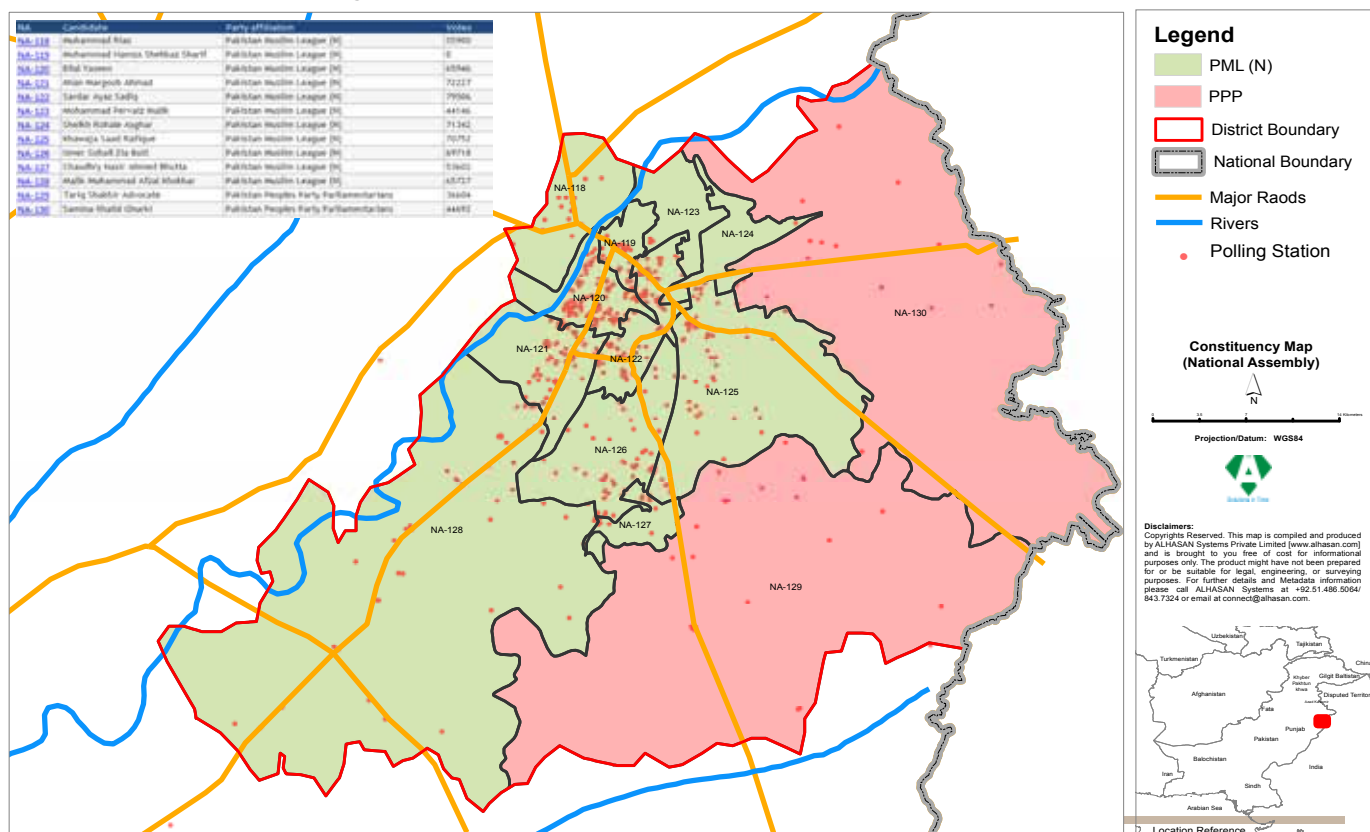

Free and Fair Election Network (FAFEN), 25th March, 2013

ISLAMABAD: Thirty-six people were killed and 87 injured in 16 incidents of political violence between March 16 and 22, 2013 across the country, compared with the preceding week when 43 were killed and 63 injured in 17 incidents, says the Free and Fair Election Network (FAFEN). Region-wise detail is given in the following table:

Bilawal leaves Pakistan, not to lead PPP election campaign: Officials

ISLAMABAD/LAHORE: Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari will not be leading the party's election campaign as party officials confirmed his departure for Dubai on Tuesday, days before the party launches its official campaign on April 4.

Speaking to Dawn.com, PPP leader Sharmila Farooqi confirmed that Bilawal had departed for Dubai. She also confirmed that the young Bhutto would not be 'physically' taking part in the party's election campaign; however, she cited "security concerns" as the reason behind the decision.

The news comes as the Press Trust of India reported that the PPP chairman had left after an argument with his father, President Asif Ali Zardari. Hasham Riaz, Bilawal's chief of staff, while speaking to Dawn.com also confirmed that Bilawal had left for Dubai. However, he dismissed reports of a rift between the father and son as "rumors". According to the report by the Press Trust of India, the PPP chairman had a quarrel with President Zardari and his sister Faryal Talpur over the party's stance on several importance issues including militancy, sectarianism and the awarding of party tickets for the upcoming general elections.

The news agency reported sources as saying that Bilawal had an issue in particular with PPP's weak reaction to the Malala Yousufzai shooting and the bomb attacks on the Shia community in Karachi and Quetta. Bilawal was also angered by Talpur's decision to not hand over party tickets to candidates in Sindh whom he favoured, a source told the Press Trust of India.

The departure of the PPP chairman raises concerns for the PPP, the main ruling party in Pakistan for the past five years, with polls looming overhead and the party set to kick-off its election campaign. The PPP is to launch its election campaign on April 4 in Garhi Khuda Buksh. Meanwhile, a source told Dawn.com that Bilawal, who turns 25 this September and will be of eligible age to contest elections by the time of the by-elections, has decided not to take part in even the by-polls.

Punjab parliamentary committee to reconvene

LAHORE: The Punjab Assembly's parliamentary committee will reconvene to continue deliberations on the appointment of a caretaker chief minister. Earlier on Tuesday it was announced that the committee had failed to reach a consensus on the appointment and the matter would be sent to the Election Commission of Pakistan. Shortly after the announcement, PML-N parliamentary committee member Rana Sanaullah telephoned opposition members Chaudhry Zaheer and Shaukhat Basra and asked them to once again take part in deliberations. The parliamentary committee comprised of six members, three each from the government and opposition. The PML-N was represented by Rana Sanaullah, Mujtaba Shaujar Rehman and Iqbal Chunnar, while the opposition PPP and PML-Q was represented by Shaukat Basra, Zulfiqar Gondal and Chaudhry Zaheer. Nominees for the caretaker CM Punjab post include Justice (retd) Amir Raza Khan and former bureaucrat Khuwaja Zaheer proposed by the PML-N, while the opposition suggested names of senior journalist Najam Sethi and Justice (retd) Zahid Hussain.

Election commission re-describes over 300 constituencies

ISLAMABAD: The Election Commission has re-described hundreds of constituencies of national and provincial assemblies. A notification was issued on Wednesday saying 128 National Assembly constituencies and 292 provincial constituencies have been re-described.

The reason given for re-description is geographical changes in the constituencies' respective areas. The election commission has made the changes under Section 10-A of the Delimitation Act of 1974 which authorises the election commission to make any changes in the constituencies prior to the elections. National Assembly constituencies where re-description has been done include both constituencies of the capital Islamabad, 19 constituencies in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, 17 in Punjab, 34 constituencies in Sindh and three in Balochistan. Changes have been made in 292 provincial constituencies that include 73 constituencies in KP, 137 in Punjab, 66 constituencies in Sindh and 16 in Balochistan.

Punjab settles on Sethi as caretaker

LAHORE: Well-known journalist Najam Sethi was selected as caretaker chief minister of Punjab on Tuesday after marathon deliberations by the treasury and opposition members in the outgoing provincial assembly.

Mr Sethi's name had been proposed by the opposition comprising the PPP and the PML-Q. Its other nominee was retired Justice Syed Zahid Bukhari. The treasury had proposed the names of retired Justice Amir Raza Khan and Khwaja Zaheer.

"We've confidence in the person of Najam Sethi and hope that he'll show impartiality as caretaker chief minister like he has been doing impartial (political) analyses," former law minister Rana Sanaullah of the PML-N told the media outside the Punjab Assembly late on Tuesday evening even before taking the party's decision to the six-member parliamentary committee. Both the sides had been sticking to their viewpoints for three days and had almost decided to refer the matter to the Election Commission of Pakistan, as required under the law. But the PML-N leadership intervened at the last moment and called the party's negotiating team — Rana Sanaullah, Muftaba Shuja and Iqbal Channar — for a briefing.

A senior PML-N leader told Dawn that the party thought that had the matter been referred to the ECP the result would have been no different. He argued that the ECP had a majority of members likely to second PPP's choice, a 'fact' which he said was visible in the selection of caretaker prime minister. By agreeing on the opposition's nominee in the committee, the PML-N could at least try to occupy the moral high ground of honouring the opposition's opinion as well as enabling politicians to decide important issues instead of looking towards retired judges, he added. Mr Sethi is an experienced caretaker. From among all the names that have been discussed for inclusion in the interim governments tasked basically with the May 11 elections, Mr Sethi is the only one with a previous caretaker term to his credit. He was a federal minister in the caretaker set-up under Malik Meraj Khalid following the dismissal of the Benazir Bhutto government in 1996. During his student life, Mr Sethi had fought along with the Baloch against army operation in 1974. Later, he shifted to Lahore and set up a books publishing business on The Mall, before bringing out a weekly, The Friday Times. He had been picked up by security agencies during the previous regime of Nawaz Sharif in the late 1990s.

BNP-M to actively participate in May 11 polls: Mengal

KARACHI: Balochistan National Party-Mengal (BNP-M) chief Sardar Akhtar Mengal Tuesday said his party will actively participate in the May 11 general elections. Speaking to media representatives after chairing a meeting of the party's Executive Committee at his residence, he said the BNP-M is a democratic party and it believes in democratic process. However, Mengal said they will contest the elections keeping in mind "apprehensions about the rights of the Baloch people." He said the Chief Election Commissioner has been conveyed about his party's reservations.

Mengal said, "If we are elected to power, we will take oath under the Constitution of Pakistan." he BNP-M chief said a five-member committee has been formed for the preparation of manifesto and distribution of tickets. This committee will decide about electoral alliance with other political parties, he added. He, however, said talks have not been held with any political party for electoral alliance so far.

On the occasion, Malik Karim Dad, Muhammad Hasni, Malik Rehmatullah Notezai, former district nazim Mir Muhammad Hashim Notezai and others in the leadership of Haji Mir Muhammad Anwar Notezai, who belongs to Chagai district of Balochistan, announced their joining in the BNP-Mengal.

ECP receives list of defaulters

ISLAMABAD: The Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) has received a list of politicians including stalwarts of the main political parties who failed to pay their utility bills.

According to the list, hundreds of MNAs and Senators belonging to the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz, the Pakistan People's Party, the Awami National Party, the Jamiat Ulema-I-Islam, The Muttahida Qaumi Movement and others failed to pay their telephone and electricity bills. As many as 284 members parliamentarians failed to pay their telephone bills while IESCO has provided the electoral body of over 360 names of the parliamentarians who didn't pay their powers bills.

Prominent among the defaulters of utility bills include Chaudhry Nisar Ali Khan, Qamar Zaman Kaira, Makhdoom Amin Fahim, Nadeem Afzal Chan, Bushra Rehman, Anwar Alam Khan, Abdul Qadir Patel, Manzoor Watto, Firdous Ashiq Awan, Faisal Karim Kundi, Maulana Fazlur Rehman, Hina Rabbani Khar, Asfand Yar Wali Khan, Rehman Malik, Farooq Sattar, Pervez Elahi and others.

KARACHI: Muttahida Qaumi Movement (MQM) Deputy Convener, Farooq Sattar Wednesday said that his party never made any electoral alliance and it would not make any electoral alliance in the upcoming elections also, Geo News reported.

MQM, however, could make seat adjustment with the like-minded parties, he added.

Talking to media here, Farooq Sattar in an unequivocal term declared that his party would not give tickets to tax cheats, loan defaulters, those who got loans written off, looted national wealth and the fake degree holders. MQM Deputy Convener said that the big sardars and waderas are hurdles in the way of progress and resolution of issues.

Farooq Sattar said that the new delimitations of constituencies in Karachi tantamount to robbing the votes of the people. Karachi is being discriminated and we have knocked the door of court for justice as regards new delimitation, he said.

ISLAMABAD: PPP Central Secretary General, Sardar Latif Khosa has said that the party Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari will not only return home but also actively take part in the elections campaign. The PPP leader said that the party history is replete with sacrifices for the democracy and its leadership prefers death with the workers over asylum in foreign countries. Khosa denied media reports that Bilawal Bhutto Zardari has left the country due to differences with President Asif Ali Zardari.

To a question, he said the PPP leadership after completion of the process of nomination papers will formulate its strategy regarding running the election campaign.

PESHAWAR : According to sources, PML-N has also decided to allot tickets to 94 candidates out of 99 seats from KP Assembly.

It is pertinent to mention that the PML-N candidate Muhammad Afzal would contest from NA-1, Zafar Iqbal Jhagra NA-3, Ameer Muqam NA-4 while Khawaja Muhammad Khan Hoti from NA-9, Rehmat Salam Khattak NA-15, Sardar Mehtab Abbasi NA-17, Murtaza Javed Abbasi NA-18, Umar ayub Na-19, Sardar Muhammad Yousaf Na-20, Captain Safdar Na-21, while Saleem Ullah will contest elections from NA-27.

However, on 94 seats out of 99 for provincial assembly, Zafar Iqbal Jhagra from PK-40, Malik Zafar Azam from PK-41, Sardar Mehtab Abbasi PK-45, Muhammad Javed Abbasi PK-48, Raja Faisal Zaman PK-49, NA-52, Pir Sabir Shah and Ameer Muqam will contest the polls from PK-82.

ISLAMABAD: The Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) has extended the deadline for candidates to file nomination papers by two days on the demand of several political parties. According to new deadline given by ECP, the candidates will now have till 31 March to file nomination papers. The scrutiny of nomination papers would be carried out from April 2-8 and the final list of candidates will be issued on April 19.

Meanwhile, all the major parties have not yet finalized candidates from all the constituencies.

ISLAMABAD: Caretaker Prime Minister Justice (retd) Mir Hazar Khan Khoso has directed concerned authorities to adopt effective security measures for general elections, Geo News reported.

The caretaker prime minister issued these orders during a briefing by the Home Department. Officials briefed him over law and order situation in the country. Interior Secretary and others apprised the premier about the performance of various institutions.

During the briefing, Mir Hazar Khan ordered effective security measures besides enhancing intelligence cooperation with all the four provinces. He also directed for enhancing coordination with the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP).

ISLAMABAD: Chief Justice Iftikhar Mohammad Chaudhry said Chairman NADRA should quit his job if he fails to provide overseas Pakistanis with the facility to vote, adding that if the Secretary Defence was asked he could have the GHQ make an e-voting software for the overseas voting process.

A three member bench headed by Chief Justice Iftikhar Mohammad Chaudhry heard the case pertaining to giving overseas Pakistanis the right to vote. During the hearing Attorney General Pakistan Irfan Qadir presented a report in court revealing that the facility providing overseas Pakistanis the right to vote would cost \$ 1.5 million. Meanwhile, Chairman NADRA told the courts that 4.5 million Pakistanis have been registered and issued NICOP cards, adding that a proposal has been given for online applications. He further added that the proposal would consist of four stages such as voter registration, voter verification, vote casting and result sharing. The Chief Justice said that voter registration has already been completed and at least ten countries where a large number Pakistanis reside must have mechanisms for voting. The Chief Justice further said polling stations should be made in embassies and consuls, adding that voters are more important than the elections as they are the real stakeholders.

The court adjourned the hearing till April 1st and has directed the Foreign Secretary, Law Secretary, Secretary Overseas Pakistanis, Secretary IT, Chairman NADRA and Election Commission Pakistan to devise a strong mechanism for overseas voting.

Armymen to guard sensitive polling stations

ISLAMABAD: Army troops will be deployed on the day of election for providing security at highly sensitive polling stations and personnel of civilian law enforcement agencies on the rest. This was decided at the second round of talks between Secretary Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) Ishtiaq Ahmed and military authorities at General Headquarters on Friday. As general elections near, spiralling violence and increasing attacks on sectarian and religious minorities are making the task of peaceful conduct of polls complicated. The meeting was held days after the top brass of armed forces at the Joint Chiefs of Staff Committee had agreed to support the ECP in providing security during elections. The army command has expressed on a number of occasions its commitment to the democratic process in the country and holding of elections on time.

Secretary ECP says commission working pressure-free on caretaker PM selection

ISLAMABAD: Secretary Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) Ishtiaque Ahmed on Saturday said the commission had two days to decide a name for the caretaker prime minister and would finalise one by tonight or tomorrow. The secretary's comments came as a consultative meeting of the ECP for the caretaker PM's selection was taking place. He said the ECP member from Sindh, Justice (retd) Roshan Isani, was set to arrive in Islamabad on Saturday evening, adding that, Isani was busy over the matter of constituencies' delimitation in Karachi. Ahmed added that the election commission was not under any kind of pressure on the matter and was deliberating over the four proposed names. The ball came in ECP's court after politicians in the parliamentary committee constituted to name a caretaker PM decided to give up and agreed to hand over the task to the election commission.

Altaf expresses no-confidence on ECP

LONDON: Muttahida Qaumi Movement (MQM) Chief Altaf Hussain has expressed no-confidence on Election Commission of Pakistan, terming the changes in electoral constituencies in Karachi as conspiracy to divide the party's vote bank. Addressing a coordination committee of the party, Altaf Hussain said the 'unconstitutional decision' was taken just few days before the general elections. He further said that people reserved a basic and constitutional right to register their protest against the 'illegal and unconstitutional act.'

ISLAMABAD: The prospective candidates filing nomination papers are making calls that it is not possible for them to open new bank accounts on 31st March, 2013 being Sunday the closed Holiday for Banks and they can not indicate the Account number in the relevant column of Nomination Form on the last date fix for the purpose, with the Returning Officers concerned.

The Election Commission has decided that all the prospective candidates who are filing Nomination Papers on 31st March, 2013 may either provide account No. of their existing account in any bank, if any or open new bank account and provide that number to the Returning Officers concerned on the day of scrutiny of their Nomination Papers.

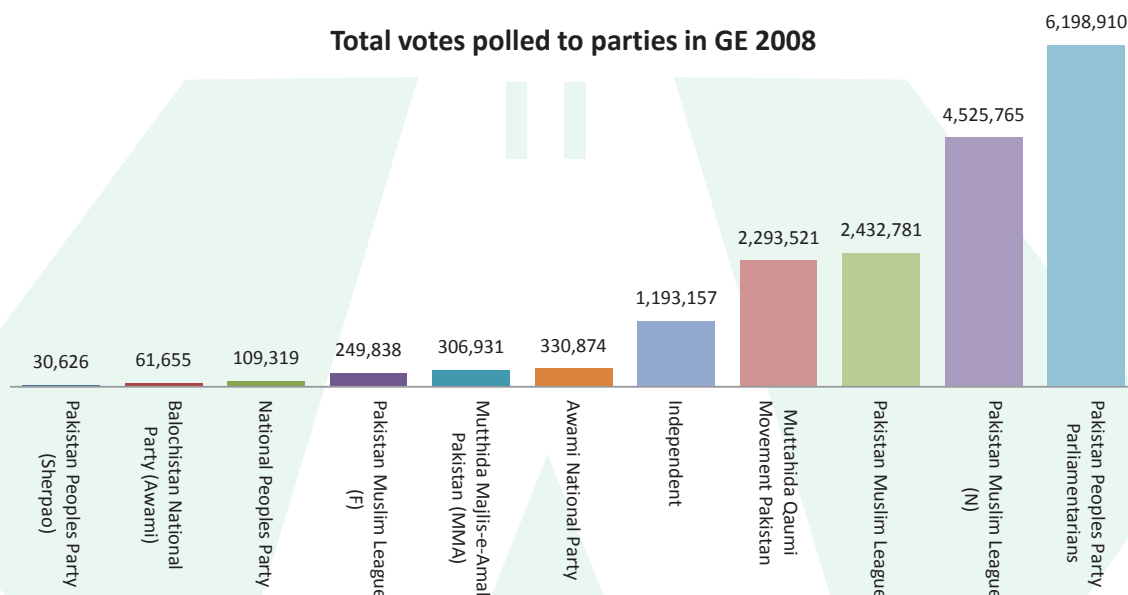

The date of poll will remain the same as was notified earlier. The above mentioned Programme shall also apply to the seats reserved for Women and non-Muslims in the National Assembly and Provincial Assemblies of the Punjab, Sindh, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Balochistan.

Note:- The offices of the Election Commission as well as the offices of District Returning Officers and Returning Officers will remain open on 30th, 31st March, 2013, 6th and 7th April, 2013.

The Pakistan Political Palette

The Pakistan Political Palette is dotted with multi hues. Parties that have been there, seen it, done all, the wannabes waiting for their turn, individuals who have returned from yonder wanting to grab a part of the action. You name it, Pakistan has it. The trailer promises an action packed thriller. Grab your bag of pop corns everyone!

First there are the traditional arch rivals: PPP and PML-N. The five years of PPP governance have been marred by increase in terrorism, inflation, energy crisis. There are charges of widespread corruption. Whereas it is true that PPP could have improved upon its governance, it is also true that after the 18th Amendment- a number of issues laid at the federation door were the responsibility of the provincial governments. PML-N and MQM cannot today, legitimately claim to oppose PPP after having governed their respective provinces/areas for the term. They were as much a part of the overall government as was PPP. Faraz Khan posting in Express Tribune Blogs published 11th Feb. 2013 shares that according to the Punjab government, 30 billion rupees were spent on the Lahore Metro Bus Service. Overall the entire allocated money for Punjab infrastructure development is Rs63 billion which means that 50% or half of the development budget of Punjab was spent in Lahore. This excludes the cost of the underpasses and overhead bridges built in Lahore. Compared to this Rs 16.5 billion was allocated to the Health sector and Rs25 billion development budget for education in Punjab for the current year. From this 25 billion a total of Rs5 billion was spent on giving away laptops.

The province's annual average growth rate of 2.5% between 2007 and 2011 lagged far behind the 3.4% for the rest of Pakistan, according to the Lahore-based Institute of Public Policy (IPP). No smaller energy generation plants were set up although Punjab is badly hit by

power cuts, destroying businesses and disrupting normal life.

Under MQM's tutelage, Karachi burned for five years. It continues burning today. Karachi is the hub of multiethnic people. The demographic makeup of the city has changed over the past few years, leading many to believe that the ongoing violence is a turf war being fought between MQM & ANP. Former Interior Minister Rehman Malik places target killed people in past five years at 1,363 (Published 7 Sept 2012: Express Tribune). By any common sense standards this is a highly under estimated account. It will be pertinent to note here that Karachi was under MQM Mayor-ship from 2005 till 2010. Delimitation of constituencies is seen as a negative by MQM – which will be at a defensive position and might lose some constituencies, though it will remain the majority party of the Karachi. MQM is already in court against the delimitations in Karachi.

Bringing in the new colors of the Political Palette is the PTI. The supporters of PTI are enthusiastic about the chances of their party in the forthcoming elections. Some over exuberant even claim a clean sweep. Brig. Farooq Hameed Khan® in an article published in a local newspaper states, "While October 30 kindled the candle of hope for Pakistan's future, March 23 lighted the flame of a 'Naya Pakistan'. On both occasions, Imran Khan displayed vision of a statesman and a national leader." PTI has made an electoral alliance with JUI- a step that makes sense since PTI lacks rural grounding and is restricted to urban areas only. It may stand to gain by this alliance. However, others point towards lack of any policies by PTI to bring about the much touted 'Naya Pakistan.' They also claim PTI lacks a well-knit team of people to achieve the claim. Induction of fall-outs of other parties, now close to the PTI Chief has not helped. That PTI will erode the vote bank of PML-N in Punjab owing to the

latter's bad governance is a foregone conclusion.

To what degree they are able to harness their support and convert it into votes remains to be seen.

An unexpected entrant in the arena was Tahir-ul-Qadri. He claimed to "get rid of electoral dictatorship." He raised questions about the integrity of the candidates in light of Article 62 and 63 of the Constitution. Mr Qadri insisted that before elections are held, a system must be put in place to probe the integrity of candidates. Since his party will not be contesting the forthcoming elections, some believe, his entry in the foray was aimed to build pressure in order to wean out the candidates who have failed to come up to the standards constitutionally laid down and flagrantly violated.

The side-dish is the re-entry of Former President General Pervez Musharraf. Columnist Cyril Almeida said Musharraf the politician today evokes the memory of Imran Khan from a decade ago: a high-wattage name, lots of media coverage, and absolutely no impact on the electorate. This may or may not turn out to be true in light of the welcome received by him on his return to Pakistan. Notwithstanding the challenges, both legal and otherwise, his party will manage to cull some seats, if they contest. Musharraf had declared the rally by Tahir-ul-Qadri a success saying in unequivocal terms, "I have supported them from the beginning."

The three vote-cinching parties offer different goodies to the people. PML-N with its glossy manifesto, making wild promises- especially in relation to countering energy crisis-solutions suggested neither workable nor practical. PPP mainly banks on the Bhutto legacy and the fact that being the only national party, it has access to the Pakistani People. There are many populist promises thrown in, that work. MQM, talks about everything under the

sun from education, poverty alleviation & empowerment, health, urban development and so on. One may pose the question, as to why these were not acted upon in these five years- maybe a query for another day!

Then there are the motley of smaller regional parties, smaller religious parties, the independents...all wanting a piece of the pie!

The million dollar question is: which way will the camel sit? And no, the Army is not taking over. The facts are different: that the 'electable' will carry weight, electoral alliances will be cobbled together between the smaller/newer parties with one aim: to oppose PPP. Will their joint seats succeed in forming the government? Who will head that alliance? PTI Chief? Will PTI lose on table failing to carry

other winners with it? Or, will PPP succeed in proving itself to be the only nationalist party it states in its manifesto? With whom will PML-N and MQM throw in their lot? One would not undermine PPP's negotiation abilities.

One thing is clear. It will be a hung parliament with more cooks joining in to make the broth.

PPP to lead in the polls: Survey

A survey done by a German company has said that the Pakistan People's Party (PPP) will continue to lead at the ballot box at the next elections.

The survey by Heinrich Boll Stiftung showed that 29 per cent of the people surveyed would support the PPP, the highest number for any political party surveyed by the company.

Nearly 25 per cent said they would support the main opposition party, the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N), led by former Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif.

This survey is in sharp contrast with the last IRI survey that was done on 4,997 people, 32 per cent of whom preferred the PML-N as preferred majority party in the federal parliament.

This figure was up from 28 per cent from the last survey that the agency conducted over two months in July and August last year.

Another 20 per cent supported the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) led by former cricketer Imran Khan.

Citing strong polling figures for the PTI, the survey also noted that the post election government would have to stand up to a strong political opposition.

In the 2008 elections that were boycotted by the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) under the leadership of Imran Khan, the PPP won 30.8 per cent of votes, while the PML-N came second with 23.1 per cent.

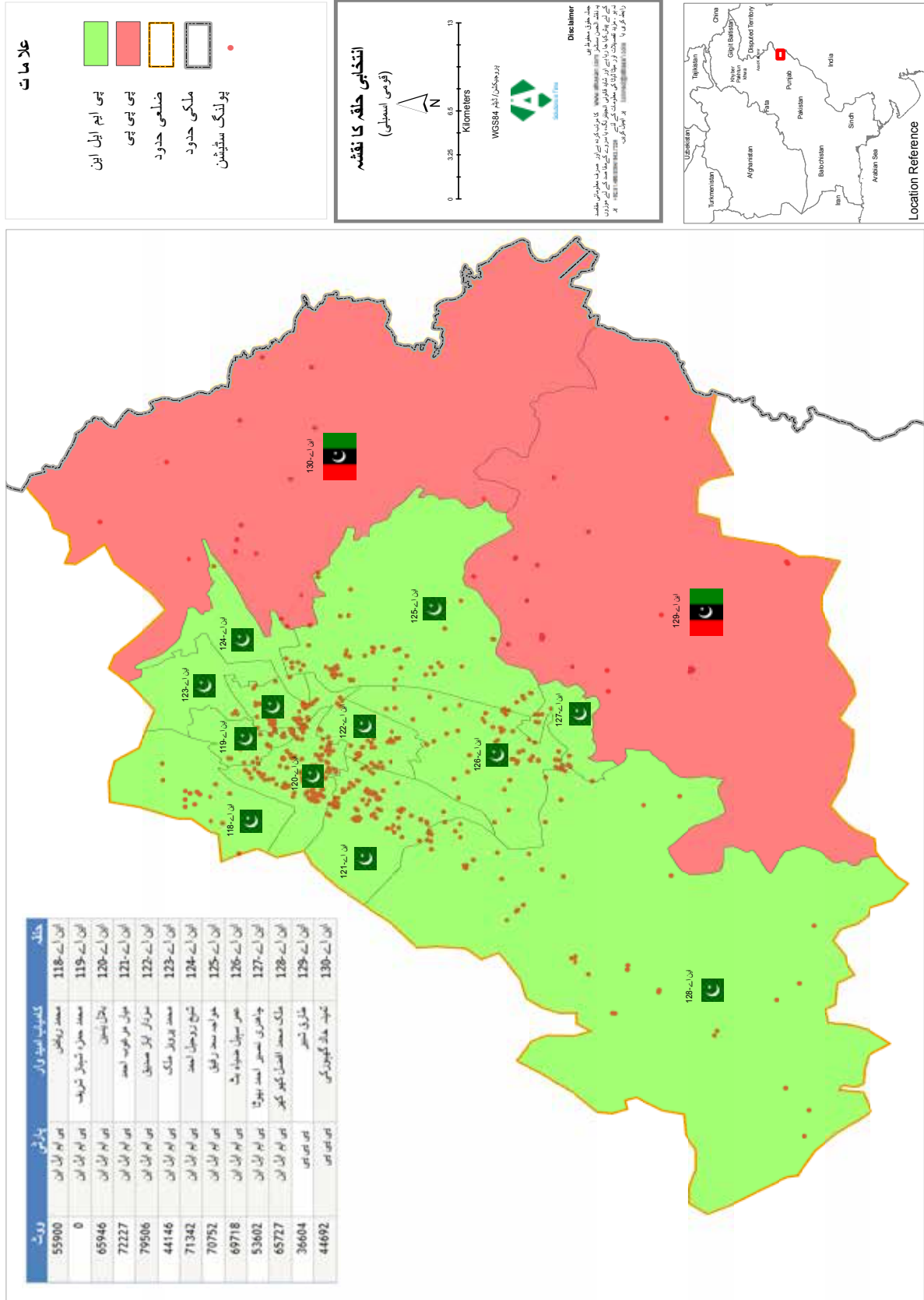

Comparison of National Contituecy Boundaries Vs Settlement Density FATA

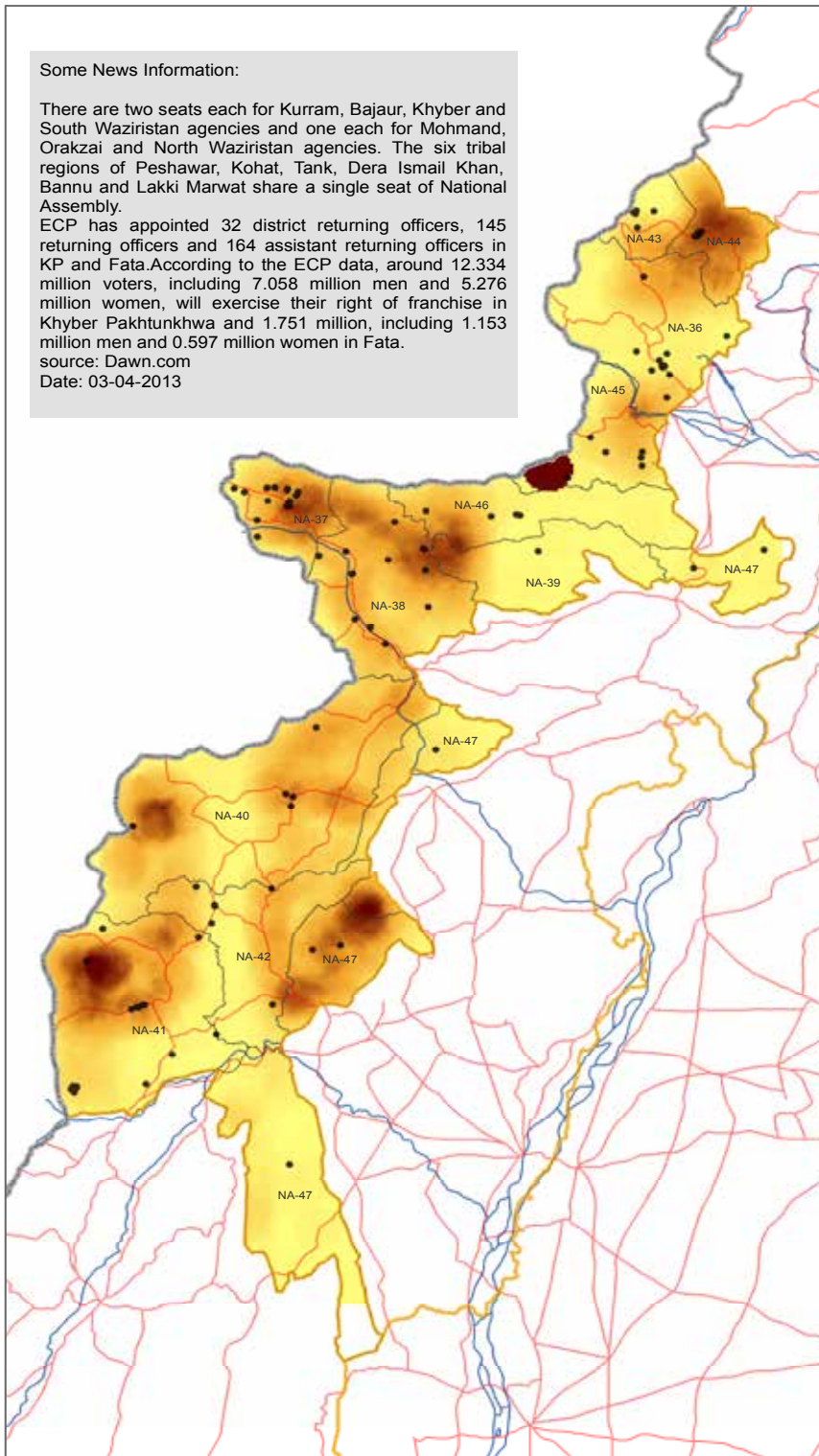
Some News Information:

ECP has appointed 32 district returning officers, 145 returning officers and 164 assistant returning officers in KP and Fata. 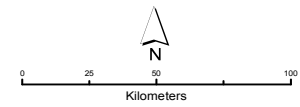

مغربی پاکستان میں جمہوریت کا سورج دسمبر 1971 کی سیاہ تاریک رات کے بعد طلوع ہوا اور اس دور میں عوام میں سیاسی شعور اور اپنے حق رائے دہی کی طاقت کا احساس بیدار ہوا۔ قطع نظر سیاسی جماعتوں کے سیاسی منشور اور انتخابی نعروں کے عوام میں عملی سیاست میں حصہ لینے کا شوق بیدار ہوا اور لوگوں کی بڑی تعداد اپنی اپنی پسند کے لیڈران اور سیاسی جماعتوں کی چاہت میں گرفتار ہوئی۔ 1977 کے انتخابات پارلیمانی سیاست میں درخشاں حیثیت کے حامل ہوتے اگر ان پر دھاندلی کا بد نما دھبہ نہ لگا ہوتا۔

جولائی 1977 سے دسمبر 1985 تک شخصی، ذاتی آمریت کا دور دورہ اور بعد ازاں آمریت کے زیر سایہ غیر جماعتی انتخابات کے ذریعے ایک نیم جمہوری حکومت کا قیام عمل میں لایا گیا ہے جسے بعد ازاں آمریت کی ذاتی خواہش کے بھینٹ چڑھا دیا گیا۔

اگست 1988 کے بعد پاکستان میں جمہوریت کا ایک عشرہ اس طرز پر گزرا کہ کرپشن، دھاندلی، بے ایمانی، بے روزگاری، مہنگائی، ذاتی مفادات کی سیاست اور چور بازاری جیسی لعنتیں اور بیماریاں جمہوریت کا اڑھٹا نچھوٹا رہیں، آمریت کے لئے ایسے حالات دعوت سے کم نہیں ہوتے لہذا اکتوبر 1999 میں جمہوریت کا زمانہ پھر سے آمریت کے سایہ تلے چھپ گیا تاوقتیکہ 2002 کے الیکشن عام انتخابات ہوئے اور ان انتخابات کے نتیجہ میں ایک بار پھر باوردی آمریت اور جمہوری حکومت ساتھ ساتھ حکمرانی کرنے لگیں۔

2008 مارچ سے 2013 تک پارلیمانی جمہوریت کا چوتھا دور شائد پہلا دور ہے جس میں سیاسی و حق رائے دہی کی آزادی پر کوئی حقیقی اور شدید قدغن سامنے نہیں آئی۔ لہذا اس حوالے سے امید کی جاتی ہے کہ آئندہ آنے والے الیکشن چونکہ آزادانہ اور منصفانہ اداروں کے زیر اہتمام ہونے جارہے ہیں تو ایک ایسی حکومت کا قیام عمل میں آئے گا جو حقیقی معنوں میں جمہوری حکومت کہلائے جانے کی حقدار ہوگی کیونکہ تمام آزادانہ ذرائع اس امر پر متفق ہیں کہ تقریباً 50 فیصد سے زائد ووٹر آئندہ

ووٹرز کی تعداد میں 3 لاکھ افراد کا اضافہ ہو گیا جس کے بعد یہ تعداد 68 لاکھ سے بڑھ کر 71 لاکھ ہو گئی۔

یقیناً جمہوریت ایک ایسا طرز حکمرانی ہے جس میں عوام کی نمائندہ حکومت عوام کی خدمت کے لیے موجود ہوتی ہے اور وہ حکومت ریاست کی کثیر آبادی کی سماجی، سیاسی، اخلاقی، اور مذہبی تنظیم کا عملی عکس ہوتی ہے۔ کسی بھی جمہوری حکومت کا جائزہ اس معاشرے کی حقیقی تصویر پیش کر دیتا ہے۔ درج شدہ تمام بحث کو اگر اسلامی جمہوریہ پاکستان میں جمہوری ارتقا اور جمہوریت کے خدوخال کی جانچ کے لئے اصول بنایا جائے تو افسوس ناک حیرت کا سامنا کرنا پڑتا ہے کیونکہ پاکستان میں جمہوریت کا ارتقاء اس کی پیدائش سے بہت پہلے ہونے کے باوجود مثبت انداز میں پروان نہیں چڑھ سکا۔
