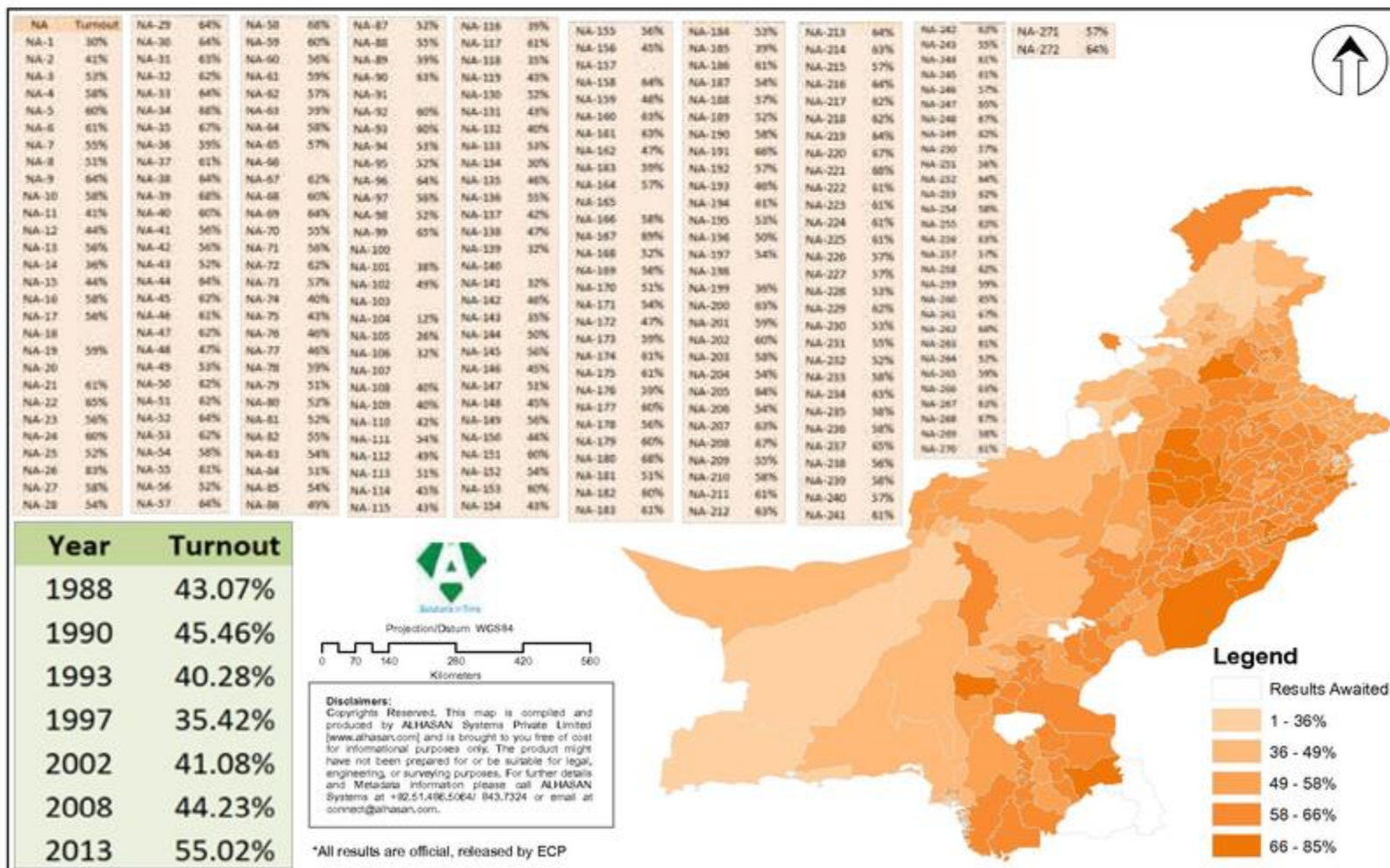

KARACHI: After much debate, allegations and counter-allegations between political parties, a partial re-run of the vote in 43 polling stations of NA-250 (Karachi-XII) concluded peacefully and efficiently on Sunday, amid tight security provided by police, Rangers and army personnel. As unofficial results from the re-polls poured in late Sunday night, Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) appeared far ahead of the pack. Dr Arif Alvi, PTI's candidate for the National Assembly seat, led with 17,541 votes – a staggering lead considering his sole rival for the constituency, Jamaat-e-Islami's Naimatullah Khan, could muster around 446 votes, despite Jamaat-e-Islami's boycott.

KARACHI: The Muttahida Qaumi Movement (MQM) has announced a series of peaceful protests across the country and abroad against PTI Chairman Imran Khan's statement holding Altaf Hussain 'directly responsible' for Saturday's murder of senior PTI leader Zahra Shahid Hussain.

Speaking at a news conference on Sunday, MQM Deputy Convener Farooq Sattar said that party workers would respond to the PTI chief's allegations by peaceful protests. "We will take up democratic and legal means against Imran Khan. We will not reply to hatred with hatred," he added.

Dr Sattar said thousands of MQM workers had been hurt by Imran's allegations against Altaf Hussain.

He also said that the MQM rejected re-polling in NA-250 and maintained the low turnout has proved that the process was a farce. "We were against these elections as people of 140 polling stations were deprived of their right to vote. These elections were biased and partial."

Separately, MQM leaders and supporters staged a demonstration outside the Hyderabad Press Club.

They burnt an effigy of the PTI chairman to condemn his statement holding MQM chief Altaf Hussain responsible for the death of Zahra Shahid. "We want to send a message that the people of Hyderabad love Altaf Hussain and they will not tolerate any mudslinging against their leader," said MQM Hyderabad zone in-charge Muhammad Sharif.

LAHORE: Fuelling doubts about the transparency of the May 11 elections, President Asif Ali Zardari has said that the returning officers (ROs) played an important role in the elections.

"If I get [the support of] these ROs, I can win the presidential election," he said while talking to a delegation of South Asia Free Media Association (Safma) at Bilawal House on Sunday. The PPP did not want to sacrifice 'another Bhutto' just for another 25-26 seats, he added.

Quashing rumours about his plans to step down, President Zardari said he would complete his constitutional term. "If I did not resign at the time of elections [to lead PPP's campaign], there was no justification for my resignation now," he said.

He said that the PPP could not run a proper elections campaign in Punjab because of the Taliban threats. Moreover, the judiciary was also against PPP, he added. "The party couldn't fight on multiple fronts simultaneously."

Despite reservations, President Zardari said that the PPP has conceded defeat and he will administer oath to the party that has won the mandate. "The opposition leader will be from the second largest party in the National Assembly," he said. "We would have no issue if PTI becomes the second biggest party and gets the opposition leader slot."

President Zardari said that the PPP lost 40 to 45 seats because of its poor elections strategy. Asked what would be the party's strategy if the 2013 elections were held again, the president said he would step down to lead PPP's election campaign.

He said that Manzoor Wattoo was made the president of Punjab chapter of PPP in view of the traditional biradri politics in the province not because of his ideological stance. Wattoo worked hard but unfortunately his efforts did not yield the desired results, he added.

He said two former premiers from his party – Yousaf Raza Gilani and Raja Pervaiz Ashraf – could not effectively lead PPP's election campaign. Gilani was busy making efforts for the recovery of his son, while Ashraf was fighting court cases against him.

President also blamed the energy crisis for the poor performance of PPP in the elections. "The PPP government could not handle the electricity crisis and this caused the party's defeat in the elections," he added.

About Sindh where the PPP has emerged as the single largest party, President Zardari said that the PPP would form a coalition government with the Muttahida Qaumi Movement (MQM), though the party has enough seats to form the next government independently.

HYDERABAD: Unidentified men attacked the election candidates of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf in Hyderabad and Mirpurkhas amidst a partial strike in the two districts on Sunday. At least three vehicles – including two cars belonging to PTI leaders – were reportedly burnt. However, the party's leaders survived the attacks.

LAHORE: Pakistan Tehrik-i-Insaf (PTI) Chairman Imran Khan has appealed to his party workers in Lahore to end their sit-in protests, DawnNews reported.

He said that the party will hold full-fledged sit in protest in Islamabad on 24th May.

Speaking to media representatives at Lahore's Shaukat Khanum Hospital, Imran Khan said that PTI workers will protest on 24th May in which he himself will participate. He also said that they will hold a large demonstration in London as well. He said that to free Karachi from fear, the PTI will continue to protest. The PTI chief was optimistic that he will be released from hospital soon. "I am hopeful that the doctors will discharge me by Wednesday," he said. "My health is improving, but there is still some pain in my spine," the PTI chief said.

LAHORE: THE Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz, which is poised to form the federal government, is not keen on borrowing more dollars from the IMF — at least not in its early months in power, despite warning of a looming balance-of-payments crisis. The party leadership feels that its plan to stimulate growth, the main plank of its economic revival strategy as outlined in its election manifesto, will be compromised by the stringent, painful economic stabilisation conditions attached with the IMF loans, and prevent it from providing relief to voters who have returned it to power in the May 11 election with emphatic victory over its rivals.

QUETTA: The PML-N, the Pakhtunkhwa Milli Awami Party (PkMAP) and National Party (NP) which together have a majority of seats in the Balochistan Assembly have agreed to form a coalition government and authorised Nawaz Sharif to nominate the leader of the house. This was announced by PML-N leader Shahbaz Sharif here on Sunday after holding discussions with the MPAs-elect of his party and leaders of the PkMAP and NP.

KARACHI: The Muttahida Qaumi Movement (MQM) has decided to sue Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf chief Imran Khan for defamation. MQM leader Wasay Jalil said that the party would sue Mr Khan for Rs50 billion for issuing statement against Altaf Hussain. Imran Khan on Saturday held Mr Hussain responsible for the murder of his party leader Zahra Shahid, drawing strong reaction from the MQM.

PESHAWAR: The upcoming Pakistan Tehreek-i-Insaf led provincial government will find it hard to turn its pro-people election manifesto into a reality without growing Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's income considerably, according to official sources.

"The PTI would find Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's existing income insufficient to finance an investment intensive programme promised under its election manifesto," said an important functionary.

Some of the senior government functionaries, in their background interviews to Dawn, said that Khyber Pakhtunkhwa was balancing its annual budget with quite a difficulty, hardly meeting its most important expenditure requirements.

"This programme (PTI's agenda) would be difficult to implement without improving the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's income levels," said an official.

The party has promised to create a bottom-up governance system establishing village level councils, focusing on the community.

"Each village will be governed by an empowered village council," contains its manifesto, adding "a village will have sufficient money as a 'right' to maintain services and perform functions that will become its responsibility under village councils."

The party has promised to empower village councils and provide them access to development funds for investment and infrastructure.

According to official sources, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa will need to make significant changes in its local government law which took effect on January 1 this year after the last provincial government repealed the Local Government Ordinance 2001.

"The PTI is talking about things that would require a bigger government, requiring substantial investment to implement its plans," said a finance manager.

Its plan envisages rural industrialisation by developing cottage industry and micro enterprises and promotion of small and medium enterprises through 'finance support systems, technology and market linkages.' In an effort to encourage and provide incentives for fulfilling people's housing needs, the party has promised to give innovative financing measures to facilitate the deserving. Similarly, it plans to establish 'Jawan Markaz' (youth centres) in all districts and tehsils to facilitate youths in addition to significantly increasing scholarships and free loans for deserving students. In fulfillment of an identical promise, the party will set up 'Insafgah' (one step women centres) at the union council level to provide medical, legal, economic direction, references, and aid to women. Besides, self-employed women have been promised training programmes, subsidies, and monetary incentives to increase opportunities.

It has also promised to modernise the trucking industry and introduce 'mass transport systems' in all major cities.

"All this sounds great, but it would be difficult to achieve without money," said a development planner.

The insufficient money has been an issue that none of the successive Khyber Pakhtunkhwa governments found it easy to overcome, managing funds with a higher degree of difficulty.

The last provincial government had anticipated to raise a total of Rs303 billion revenue receipts during the outgoing financial year. Of this amount, over Rs191 billion would serve the province's

current revenue expenditure requirements, including a total expenditure of Rs115.4 billion on salaries of the government employees, and Rs31.5 billion on the government's necessary operations, repair and maintenance works.

However, the next government could work around to gradually implement its manifesto by making use of the funds available for development activities.

The province, said an official, had already committed itself for at least next three years as its ongoing development schemes would take, on average, three years to complete, requiring an investment of over Rs300 billion.

"They (PTI leaders) are talking about improving social services at the village level which means more nurses, more doctors, more health equipment, and more teachers across the province," said a planner.

The PTI's manifesto promises to extend primary health care to the poor, revitalise all basic health units with doctors, staff and medicines. Similarly, it promises to make rural health centres to be the fulcrum of the primary health care delivery, improving mother and child health care and modernising all district and tehsil headquarters hospitals.

Apart from creating jobs in healthcare it promises to 'dramatically increase the number of nurses, lady health visitors, paramedics, doctors with special focus on dentists and eye doctors. The PTI has promised to ensure availability of clean drinking water and sanitation facilities across rural and urban areas.

Similarly, in the education sector, the party has promised to increase a fivefold greater investment in five years, underlying one education system across the area under its rule.

Promising a decentralised service delivery system at the district level, the party has committed to empower community to help manage schools, introduce a need-based voucher system to fund students to go to private schools to fill gaps where government schools are not enough with focus on girls education (double number of girls high schools in five years).

As per its election promise, the party would go for holding local body elections in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa within 100 days after coming into power.

"This means a lot of work to do in the months to come, overhauling the existing local government law to make it in accordance with the new government's manifesto and organising the government administrative structures at the grassroots level that had recently been wounded up by the last provincial government," said an official.

ISLAMABAD: The Election Commission of Pakistan has directed all the independent candidates to submit an affidavit stating that each one of them is joining a particular political party voluntarily and without any coercion. According to a press release issued here on Saturday, the affidavit should be duly sworn before the Oath Commissioner and shall be deposited with the Provincial Election Commissioner concerned or with the Deputy Director (Cord.), Election Commission of Pakistan Secretariat, Islamabad. Keeping in view the convenience of the candidates, they have been allowed to submit their declarations in the ECP Secretariat as well.

ISLAMABAD: The National Accountability Bureau (NAB) and the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) have stuck to their pre-election stance that scrutiny of candidates will continue after the elections, according to officials of the two state institutions. But political observers believe that these are hollow claims because after the elections the two institutions will be helpless to take any action against the elected representatives, especially those belonging to the PML-N which is set to form government at the centre and opinions.

PESHAWAR: The Jamaat-i-Islami (JI) have announced names for three ministries in the Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa provincial government. Sirajul Haq, Inayatullah Khan and Habibur Rehman have been put forward for the ministries of education, zakat and finance. Speaking to the media after a meeting, provincial Amir JI Senator Professor Ibrahim said that a consensus has been reached on Sirajul Haq, Inayatullah Khan and Habibur Rehman. He said that the final names for the three ministries will be reached after more discussions. The JI leader said that the three coalition parties will have similar number of ministries in the province.

LAHORE: Six independents elected from the Federally Administered Tribal Areas (Fata) on Monday met with Pakistan Muslim League – Nawaz (PML-N) chief Nawaz Sharif and announced their inclusion in the party, DawnNews reported.

The six independent candidates who succeeded in winning from different Fata regions met with the PML-N chief in Raiwind before joining the party.

The MNAs include Shahji Gul, Bismillah Khan, Sajid Toori, Ghazi Gulab Jamal, Bilal Rahman and Nazir Khan.

The MNAs moreover assured the PML-N leadership of their full support and cooperation for the party in government formation after it won the May 11 general elections.

PESHAWAR: Former military ruler Pervez Musharraf's All Pakistan Muslim League (APML) will unconditionally support Imran Khan's Pakistan Tehrik-i-Insaf-led coalition government in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Only APML MPA-elect Ghulam Mohammad, who is from Chitral, told Dawn on Monday that Pervez Musharraf had directed him to favour PTI in the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Assembly. PTI nominee for the chief minister's office Pervez Khattak is learnt to have welcomed the 'goodwill gesture' of former military ruler, who is being tried in the court of law on different charges.

LAHORE: President Asif Ali Zardari, in a meeting with Pakistan People's Party's ticket-bearers from Punjab on Monday, held national and international institutions responsible for the party's defeat in the general elections.

The meeting was held at Bilawal House in Lahore in which senior party leaders were also present.

Following rigging allegations by various parties in the aftermath of May 11 polls, President Zardari also claimed that his party was defeated through planned rigging.

The president has formed a probe committee, which will be headed by Senator Aitzaz Ahsan, to ascertain reasons for the PPP's resounding defeat in the recently held general elections across the country.

Pointing towards his expected exit from the presidency, he said that by the end of year, he himself will lead the party out of its current crisis.

President Zardari's term in office is due to end this September.

He said his children – Bilawal, Aseefa and Bakhtawar – will also play their role in mobilising the party again.

Former premier Yousuf Raza Gilani, former Punjab governor Sardar Latif Khosa, former PPP central Punjab president Mian Manzoor Wattoo, Chaudhry Ahmed Mukhtar and other important leaders also attended the meeting.

Meanwhile, PPP supporters gathered outside Bilawal House in great numbers to record their protest against imprudent policies of the party leadership, which they said led to its defeat in the polls.

They cited alliance with Pakistan Muslim League-Quaid (PML-Q) as the main reason for the party's downfall.

ISLAMABAD: The Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) is ready to carry out verification of thumb impressions of voters with the help of the National Database and Registration Authority (Nadra) if ordered by election tribunals set up to hear complaints about rigging or irregularities in the May 11 elections.

However, complainants will have to pay charges ranging between Rs10 and Rs15 for verification of each vote.

This was announced by ECP Secretary Ishtiaq Ahmed Khan and Nadra chairman Tariq Malik at a press conference after a meeting on Monday.

Mr Khan said that Nadra would carry out verification and present reports to the ECP and the tribunals. The commission asked Nadra to develop the software for matching voters' thumbprints with its database as early as possible.

Mr Khan said the decision to get thumb impressions of voters on electoral rolls had been made to evolve a mechanism to remove doubts and address complaints about rigging. The ECP had used a special "magnetic ink" for getting thumb impressions of voters on the recommendation of Nadra.

He said the demand for verification had come from several political parties, including the Pakistan Tehreek-i-Insaf, which would be met.

Under the constitution, the ECP secretary said, sessions of the assemblies would have to be convened within 21 days of the elections, but the commission and its tribunals would continue hearing complaints even after official results had been declared. The Nadra chairman said the organisation had a data of 96 per cent of the country's adult population.

Nadra did not have a system to verify thumbprints of voters, he said and expressed the hope that it would be able to do so in two weeks.

Soon, he added, Nadra would acquire the capability of verifying 500,000 thumb impressions per day.

Mr Malik said that the cost of required hardware and software would have to be borne by the caretaker government and the operational charges ranging between Rs10 and Rs15 per thumb impression would be paid by complainants.

NA-250 RESULTS: The ECP announced official results of election in Karachi's NA-250 constituency and PS-112 and PS-113 constituencies of the Sindh Assembly after re-polling at 43 polling stations on Sunday.

According to the results, Dr Arif Alvi of the PTI won the election in NA-250 by securing 77,659 votes. His rivals Khushbakht Shujaat of the Muttahida Qaumi Movement and Naimatullah Khan of Jamaat-i-Islami obtained 30,365 and 11,698 votes, respectively.

The MQM and the PPP had boycotted the re-polling.

The voter turnout stood at 35.48 per cent as 129,725 of 365,531 registered voters cast their votes.

In PS-112, Khurram Sher Zaman of the PTI emerged victorious with 35,560 votes and Hafiz

Mohammad Suhaib of the MQM emerged as runner-up with 22,973 votes. The turnout was recorded at 41.52pc as 67,586 of 162,754 registered voters polled their votes.

PTI's Samar Ali Khan was declared winner in PS-113 with 38,247 votes. Salim Zia of the PML-N secured 11,753 votes and the PPP's Asad Zubairi 1,414. The turnout stood at 29.06pc as 64,160 of the 220,777 registered voters cast their votes.

LAHORE: Pakistan's prime minister-elect Nawaz Sharif Monday called for peace talks with Pakistani Taliban militants at war with the government, potentially charting a course that could put him at odds with the country's powerful army. Speaking to the newly elected members of national and provincial assemblies belonging to Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N), he said that Taliban offers to talk should be taken seriously. Nawaz Sharif said "terrorism" was one of the most serious problems plaguing the country and any offer by the Pakistani Taliban to talk "should be taken seriously." "All options should be tried, and guns are not a solution to all problems," Sharif said. "Why shouldn't we sit and talk, engage in dialogue?" Sharif said the practice of toppling elected governments through street violence and agitation must be stopped now.

ISLAMABAD: The Sharifs of the PML-N have asked a former bureaucrat to draw up a list of officers who will be given key assignments in Islamabad. It was revealed during background interviews with some party leaders and senior bureaucrats that Nawaz Sharif, the prime minister-in-waiting, had asked his former principal secretary and retired bureaucrat Saeed Mehdi to formulate the list. "In Punjab, Shahbaz Sharif will not be having problems in picking officers of his choice to run his administration because he was at the helm in the province until very recently. But Islamabad will be a totally new territory for the elder Sharif, for which he needs a team of experienced and honest bureaucrats," said a close aide to the Sharif family.

ISLAMABAD: Secretary Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) Ishtiaq Ahmed Khan on Sunday said legal procedure is being followed to count votes and returning officers (RO) have been directed to submit results for all seats by May 13. While addressing a press conference at the ECP Secretariat, he said that consolidated results will be compiled once ROs send in the final official data. Winning candidates will be notified soon after that, he added. The votes are being counted as per the section 39 of People Representative Act and the election commission is waiting to receive results from all the polling stations, he added.

WANA/BANNU: Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz candidate emerged as winner from NA-41 (South Waziristan), Pakistan People's Party Parliamentarians candidate from PK-71, Bannu-II, and an independent candidate from PK-72, Bannu-II, following re-polling on total 11 polling stations of tribal area and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa constituencies on Tuesday. PML-N candidate Ghalib Khan won the election for NA-41 tribal area-VI (South Waziristan), where re-polling was held at four polling stations. He got 7,950 votes while Ali Khan, an independent candidate, secured 7,648 and remained the runner-up.

ISLAMABAD: The National Database & Registration Authority (Nadra) will charge a service fee of Rs10 for verification of every thumb impression on the ballot paper from the candidate on whose demand this process will be ordered. "The government has sanctioned Rs90 million to upgrade the software to verify thumb impressions in bulk," Nadra Chairman Tariq Malik told The News when contacted. He said that the Rs10 fee to be paid by the concerned contestant was a small amount. Different government departments do charge a certain sum of money for verification of documents like educational degrees etc., he said. The service charge will cover the salaries of the staff hired for the project including the data entry operators etc. Malik was of the view that though after the up-gradation Nadra would have the capacity of verifying 100,000 to 500,000 thumb impressions every day, it would not be required to make full use of it as there would be hardly any constituency where all the ballot papers would have to be authenticated.

ISLAMABAD: It was for the first time in the history of Pakistan that turnout exceeded 55 per cent during recently held elections. However, females were once again barred from voting in some parts of country, including Orakzai Agency, where allegedly male voters cast votes on behalf of females who were forced by local elders to remain in doors. "In NA-39, female voters were forced to remain inside homes rather males cast votes on their behalf contrary to rules and regulations of the Election Commission of Pakistan," residents of Orakzai Agency told The Nation. Sources told The Nation that contestant reached a secret settlement a couple of days before the election aimed to bar women from voting. It was according to their plan that males cast votes on behalf of their females and presiding officers deputed at polling stations of the area helped them openly.

FATA senators to form separate group

ISLAMABAD: Members of the Senate belonging to the Federally Administered Tribal Areas (Fata) have decided to form a separate parliamentary group in the House and it has unanimously elected former federal minister Senator Abbas Khan Afridi as its leader. It would be a major setback to the erstwhile ruling Pakistan People's Party (PPP) since a majority of the group had been supporting it till March this year. The group would be expanded in a day or two when the independent members of the National Assembly hailing from Fata would constitute larger group consisting two houses of parliament. It is likely that eight members of the National Assembly will become part of the larger group.

The new group has its tilt towards the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) as most of the members of the group already had initial meetings with Nawaz Sharif. Well placed sources of the group told The News here on Tuesday evening that the group of Senators has authorised Senator Abbas Khan Afridi to take decision on behalf of the group after consultations with the members.

Senator Abbas Khan Afridi belongs to a well established political family of Kohat that has its roots in the tribal areas. His younger brother served as provincial minister in KP till March last before the dissolution of the assemblies. The joint parliamentary group of the Senate and National Assembly would be constituted tomorrow (Thursday), the sources added.

Senator Abbas Khan Afridi when contacted Tuesday evening confirmed the meeting of Senators and his election as group leader but clarified that the group hasn't made up its mind to support any party in either of the two houses. 'We will take a decision after the formation of the group of the two houses,' he explained.

Jl announces names for three ministries in KPK govt

ISLAMABAD: The Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) notified on Wednesday successful candidates on 805 general seats of the national and provincial assemblies. The notification revealed that the ECP had yet to receive official results of five seats — NA-269 (Khuzdar), PB-35 (Khuzdar), PK-60 (Battagram), PK-71 (Bannu) and PP-43 (Mianwali) — from the returning officers. Results of 256 general seats of the National Assembly were notified. The result for 16 seats could not be issued for various reasons, including stay granted by courts, orders for re-polling and recounting issued by the ECP, and annulment of the electoral process due to death of a candidate or postponement of polls due to law and order.

LAHORE: While President Asif Ali Zardari is yet to sign an ordinance introducing a Rs152 billion 'mini-budget', the PPP has turned its guns on the caretaker government for taking what it calls an "unconstitutional" step at the behest of "someone". "The caretaker set-up under the constitution cannot introduce a mini-budget. Only a parliament elected by the people of Pakistan can levy taxes. General sales tax can only be levied in consultations with the provincial governments and the Council of Common Interests is the right forum for the purpose," PPP's information secretary Qamar Zaman Kaira told Dawn on Thursday.

ISLAMABAD: The Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) continues to keep secret documents it is supposed to make public forthwith under the law. The documents are the lists submitted by political parties for seats reserved for women and minorities in the national and provincial assemblies and Section 47-A of the Representation of the People Act, 1976, required their immediate publication for information of public. An ECP official told Dawn on Thursday that the lists had been sealed and would be opened next week. The grounds he gave for maintaining secrecy appeared to be flimsy.

PESHAWAR: The Awami National Party (ANP) will find out causes of its defeat in May 11 polls aimed to evolve a comprehensive strategy for strengthening the party in future, said Ameer Haider Khan Hoti, former chief minister KPK while addressing a gathering of party's candidate here on Thursday.

QUETTA: Rejecting May 11 polls, majority of political parties in Balochistan have demanded fresh polls in the province, saying the establishment rigged elections to bring certain parties to power. The demand was made during an All Party Conference (APC) organised by JUI-Ideological at MPAs hostel here on Wednesday and announced to launch a protest movement from May 26. Pashtoonkhwa Milli Awami Party and National Party kept out of this meeting. JUI-ideological central leader Asmatullah, Ahle Sunnat wal Jamat Balochistan leader Muhammad Ramzan Mengal, Balochistan National Party-Mengal leader Agha Hassan Baloch, Muhammad Qasim Khan Soori of PTI, Naveed Ahmed of Jahmoori Watan Party, PML-N district level leader Malik Abdul Rahim and others expressed their resolve for re-election in Balochistan. They said they did not have trust in the Election Commission Tribunals, adding that an impartial and autonomous commission, comprising a Supreme Court judge, should investigate the misappropriations in the elections. "ECP miserably failed to protect and implement its rules and regulations across country generally and particularly in Balochistan," they said, adding that hidden forces, polling staff and others connived to turn a particular ethnic group successful in the elections.

ISLAMABAD: The Awami National Party (ANP) and independent candidates bore the brunt of pre-election violence against political candidates, party offices and meetings — most of which was caused by the Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) and its associated groups — revealed a report by the Pakistan Institute of Peace Studies (PIPS) released on Friday.

QUETTA: For the first time since the May 11 polls, key parties of Balochistan staged a collective demo outside the Provincial Election Commission premises on Sunday to protest the "fake leadership" imposed on the province through widespread rigging in the May 11 polls. Members of the All Parties Conference chanted slogans against what they alleged was a "record incident of rigging." This was the first time that major parties in Balochistan are protesting election results collectively. Earlier, parties had protested the outcome individually by holding sit-ins outside the provincial poll body office.

LAHORE: Punjab Interim Chief Minister Najam Sethi has said that Pakistan Muslim League – Nawaz (PML-N) leader Shahbaz Sharif will take oath as the new chief minister of Punjab on June 6, reported Express News. Speaking to the media in Lahore, Sethi said that the democratic government is being handed the mandate of the province in a constitutional manner. Sethi also refuted reports of being appointed as the ambassador to the US under the new government.

ISLAMABAD: The PML-N and JUI-F may not have reached the power-sharing formula at the centre, but they claim to have worked out a mechanism for holding talks with the Taliban. Sources in the two parties told Dawn that both sides had decided that the talks with the Taliban would be held through a "grand peace jirga" as suggested by all the mainstream political parties in a "declaration" of the all-party conference (APC) organised by the JUI-F in Islamabad on Feb 28.

ISLAMABAD: The first session of the newly elected National Assembly will be held on June 1, where nine members will also take oaths as MNAs, reported Express News on Monday. On June 3, the Speaker and Deputy Speaker of the house are expected to take their oaths. On June 4, nominations for a new prime minister will be accepted by the assembly. On June 5, the new prime minister will be elected and expected to take an oath accordingly.

LAHORE: The Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz has revised its priority list of candidates for reserved seats for women in the Punjab Assembly, party sources said on Monday. The sources said that some more names had also been added in the revised list and it had been sent to the Election Commission. They said that names of Zehra Wadood Fatmi, Shakeela Luqman, Asma Mamdoot, Maryam Aurangzaib, Sabiha Nazir, Amira Khan and Shazia Khuwaja had also been included in the list.

KARACHI: The Registrar of the Sindh High Court wrote a letter on Monday to the Election Commission of Pakistan expressing reservations over the set up of election appellate tribunals adding that they (the tribunals) were set up without consulting the Sindh High Court, DawnNews reported. The letter said that the election tribunals were set up in the province without consulting the Sindh High Court adding that the election tribunals were to be set up with prior consultation with the Chief Justices of the respective provincial High Courts according to the Supreme Court of Pakistan's orders. The Election Commission had approved formation of 14 election tribunals in the provinces to decide disputes during general elections within 120 days of filing of a petition.

ISLAMABAD: The poll body has been tight-lipped over 15 incidents across the country in which women were barred from casting votes on May 11 by some political and religious parties, The Express Tribune has learnt. Ten such incidents were reported in the Khanewal, Faisalabad, Sahiwal and Kasur areas of Punjab, according to a report by the Free and Fair Election Network (FAFEN). Defending the Election Commission of Pakistan, its spokesperson Khursheed Alam said that the poll body only intervenes when approached by an aggrieved party.

KARACHI: With the general elections wrapped up, re-polling in Tharparkar is now in the limelight. Scheduled for June 1, the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) ordered re-elections at 47 polling stations of the district, after reports of massive rigging and snatching of ballot boxes erupted. Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Vice Chairman Shah Mehmood Qureshi, who is contesting as an independent candidate in the district, has challenged the Pakistan People's Party (PPP) in the polls.

KARACHI: Apart from the three former coalition partners in Sindh, all political parties reached a consensus on Monday for re-elections under the army's supervision in Karachi. A consultative meeting of all political parties was called at Avari Towers by the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) for post-election analysis and the city's law and order situation. The meeting was chaired by PTI vice-president Makhdoom Shah Mehmood Qureshi. The party's provincial president Nadir Akmal Khan Leghari told The Express Tribune that his party had sent 'across-the-board invitations' but the Muttahida Qaumi Movement and the Awami National Party representatives preferred to stay away.

MINGORA: The son of a Pakistan Muslim League – Nawaz (PML-N) leader was killed and six others sustained injuries in a bomb blast in Mingora, Swat, Express News reported on Tuesday. According to initial details, PML-N leader Jaja Mian's son was in his car when a remote-controlled roadside bomb exploded. The injured, including three women, were taken to a nearby hospital. Security forces cordoned off the area soon after the attack.

QUETTA: Balochistan High Court has withheld the distribution of Balochistan assembly reserved seats for women and minorities following a petition filed by National Party (NP) on Monday. NP vice president Dr. Ishaq Baloch had filed a petition through Advocate Zahoor Shahwani in BHC which said that the NP had secured seven provincial assembly seats while one independent candidate had joined the party. But the Election Commission has just issued notification of six candidates, Dr. Ishaq said in his petition and added that the ECP is not issuing the exact details of their successful candidates due to the pressure by their rivals. Referring to article 47-A of the constitution, he pleaded that unless the final results are announced, the distribution of minority and women seats of the assembly could not take place.

ISLAMABAD: The Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) Monday issued details of the votes polled in favour of political parties in the general elections.

According to details, 19 political parties couldn't get a single vote for the National Assembly seats, while other 18 parties were unable to secure 100 votes. The ECP said the political parties which got the maximum votes were PML-N, PTI, PPP, MQM and JUI-F. Qaumi Watan Party (QWP),

Mazdoor Kisan Party, Pakistan Green Party and Pasmanda Awami Tehreek couldn't get a single vote in the May 11 polls. Tehreek-e-Masawaat of Musarrat Shaheen got only 99 votes in the general elections.

QUETTA: The Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) on Tuesday issued a notification, confirming the victory of Sardar Akhtar Jan Mengal, the president of the Balochistan National Party-Mengal, in the election for PB-3 (Khuzdar-III) seat. According to the official results, Sardar Mengal bagged 16,824 votes while his opponent Attaur Rehman Mengal got 7,830 votes. Also on Tuesday, the ECP announced distribution of the seats reserved for women and minorities among various parties in the Balochistan Assembly. According to the announcement, out of 14 seats reserved for women and religious minorities, four each have been allotted to the PML-N and Pakhtun-khwa Milli Awami Party (PkMAP), three to National Party (NP), two to JUI-F and one to PML-Q.

KARACHI: The Sindh High Court (SHC) on Tuesday directed the Election Commission of Pakistan to decide an application of a Muttahida Qaumi Movement's candidate against rigging in the provincial assembly constituency PS-114 Karachi. Rauf Siddiqui alleged in the petition that one of his rival candidates, Irfanullah Khan Marwat of the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz, made the entire polling staff of the constituency hostage and rigged the election. His counsel, Farogh Naseem, submitted that grave irregularities and violations of the provisions of the election laws had been committed, resulting in Marwat being declared as returned candidate. He said the petitioner also filed an application under Section 103-AA of the Representation of People Act 1976, which was still pending before the Election Commission of Pakistan. He prayed to court to order re-polling in the constituency and restrained the respondent from taking oath as a member of the provincial assembly.

LAHORE: The Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz got lion's share in the parliamentary reserved seats by grabbing, so far, 95 of the 201 seats as notified by the Election Commission of Pakistan on Tuesday. There are 216 reserved seats in the national and four provincial assemblies out of which 31 are reserved for minorities while the rest are for women. The names of 15 women lawmakers are yet to be notified. By securing 36 reserved seats in the National Assembly and 57 in Punjab Assembly, the PML-N gets a clear majority in both assemblies. Of the 342-seat NA, the PML-N secured at least 175 including 144 general seats whereas in the 370-seat PA, the PML-N, by bagging 57 reserved seats including 50 of women and seven of minorities, acquired 266 seats. The party has at least 219 general seats in the PA. With eight more women-reserved seats in the NA and seven in the PA expected to go to the PML-N, Nawaz Sharif's party would be securing at least 183 seats in the NA and 273 in the PA.

ISLAMABAD: The Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) on Tuesday ordered the recounting of and verification of thumb impressions on votes polled in two National Assembly and seven Punjab Assembly seats. After allegations of rigging on PP-39 (Khushab-I), PP-43 (Mianwali-I), PP-205 (Multan-XII), PP-9 (Rawalpindi-IX), PP-257 (Muzaffargarh-VII), PP-155 (Lahore-XIX) and PP-156 (Lahore-XX) as well as two National Assembly seats, including NA-125 (Lahore-VIII), the commission ordered the recounting and thumb impressions' verification. It is pertinent to note that activists of the Pakistan Tehrik-i-Insaaf (PTI) had alleged rigging during the election for NA-125 and had staged a sit-in to register their protest over the result from the said constituency. Earlier, Khawaja Saad Rafique of the Pakistan Muslim League - Nawaz (PML-N) was said to have won from the seat securing over 120,000 votes and defeating PTI's Hamid

ISLAMABAD: PPP's secretary general Sardar Latif Khosa has severely criticised PML-N chief Nawaz Sharif for his statement that only the decision taken by the people of Punjab in the May 11 elections was wise. Addressing a news conference at the PPP's central secretariat on Wednesday, the former Punjab governor accused Mr Sharif of spreading hatred through such controversial remarks. Speaking at a function held in Lahore on Tuesday to commemorate the 15th anniversary of the country's nuclear tests, Mr Sharif, in his own interpretation of the voting pattern in each federating unit, had said: "Punjab's decision was wise, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's emotional, Sindh's traditional and Balochistan, a tribal province, voted for the PML-N."

ISLAMABAD: The kith and kin of top political leaders have once again grabbed a lion's share of the reserved seats for women in both the National Assembly and provincial assemblies. Some of them managed the feat without actually winning in the recent general elections. Wives, daughters and close relatives of seasoned politicians punched their ticket to the NA and provincial assemblies under the 33% quota reserved for women. Some of the lucky women, who lost on May 11, are now members of the assemblies via the reserved seats route. Currently, there are 70 reserved seats in the NA, 60 for women and 10 for minorities. There are 137 seats reserved for women in the four provincial assemblies. In the Punjab Assembly, 61 seats are reserved for women, 37 seats in the Sindh Assembly, 25 in the Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa Assembly and 14 seats in the Balochistan Assembly.

SHABQADAR: Aisha Gulalai-i is the young-st MNA to be nominated on reserved seat for women. Gulalai maintained she would raise the issue of reserved seats for women from Fata in the National Assembly. "Fata has no such quota, and I will raise the issue on the floor of the house as this is discriminatory against women," she promised. "Fata should be demarcated as a separate province with its own governor and chief minister," urged Gulalai while sharing her views on the tribal belt's designation. She added Fata's natural resources should be explored and that the PTI had proposed a local body election system which should be implemented in the region.

ISLAMABAD: A faction of the Balochistan National Party led by Sardar Akhtar Mengal (BNP-M) has submitted documentary evidence of manipulation against its candidates in the May 11 elections before the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP). In a petition filed before the ECP, the party's vice president Sajid Tareen alleged that results for one National Assembly and two Balochistan Assembly seats in Panjgur district were announced despite that fact that polling had been postponed by the district returning officer (DRO) on May 11.

KARACHI: The European Union (EU) has congratulated the people of Pakistan for voting on May 11th, the election day, and said that the practice have brought the two regions together. This was said by Pierre Mayadun, deputy head of an EU delegation to Pakistan, during a seminar organised by the Area Study Centre for Europe (ASCE), Karachi University (KU), at a local hotel.

"The EU has faced many challenges in its past, but these challenges only made it stronger every time," he said. "Despite all its achievements, we believe that the EU model should not be copied in any other region of the world. Every region should find its own model of development, keeping in view its culture and history," he added.

KU Vice Chancellor Professor Dr Muhammad Qaiser said that the process of European integration had been a driving force for trade, innovation and growth. It has delivered tangible benefits for all Europeans.

Earlier, ASCE Director Professor Dr Uzma Shujaat said: "The European Union, in just half a century, has gone from being an association of six countries to a strong union of 27 states."

Today, the EU represents a new and potentially more successful international actor.

After the devastating effects of both World Wars, Europe, especially France and Germany, realised that something needed to be done to avoid future conflicts and wars and for that purpose, they introduced common history books in their academic institutions, said French Consul General in Karachi Christian Ramage.

"The EU is successful due to peace in the region. Until 1940's, peace was unthinkable in Europe but after 1950, war became unthinkable," he said. "Today, European countries are closer than ever before, for instance, you just need a single Schengen visa to visit 26 European countries."

German Consul General in Karachi Dr Tilo Klinner said that having a difference of opinion was normal, while not having one was abnormal.

He said that the present day debates in Europe surrounded the formulation of better policies, just like in Pakistan people at different forums were debating over bringing the right energy policies.

"I think the EU has no problem. There problem might lie with those expecting too much from this union," he said. "I hope that the EU will overcome its financial problems soon."

Klinner also said that despite the present financial problems of the EU, no member state wanted to leave this union because they were realising the benefits of being a part of it.

Italian Consul General in Karachi Roberto Franceschini said that it was often believed that immigration created many challenges for a country but the EU was determined to continue its positive immigration policies to continue to enjoy the competitive edge over other regions.

ISLAMABAD: Three independent MNA-elects from Federally Adminstrated Tribal Areas (FATA) on Wednesday joined Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N). At the same time, four independent candidates decided to retain their status, while Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) and Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam-Fazl (JUI-F) each bagged one independent candidate.

LAHORE: The Punjab Assembly will elect its new speaker on June 3, while the province will get its new chief executive on June 5. Governor Punjab, Makhdoom Ahmad Mahmood has summoned the session on June 1. As per rules of business of the Punjab Assembly 1997, the returned candidates will take oath in the beginning of the first session on June 1, that would be administered by the incumbent speaker, Rana Muhammad Iqbal khan, the assembly sources confirmed to Daily Times on Tuesday.

QUETTA: Acting Chief Election Commissioner Justice Tassaduq Hussain Jilani on Wednesday ordered election tribunals to dispose of all cases in 120 days.

He said the general elections were fair and transparent and this time turnout in Balochistan was graceful as compared to previous tenures.

Justice Jilani, who arrived on one-day visit to Quetta, was talking to reporters at the airport. He said that he had received complaints from different corners of the country about delay in the disposal of petitions. That is why the number of election tribunals has been multiplied, with the direction that all the cases should be disposed of within 120 days, he added. He said that approximately 90 percent polling was fair and transparent but unluckily some negative-minded sections of the society committed rigging, making the transparency of the elections doubtful.

LAHORE: While the PML-Q put its weight behind the National Party's candidate Dr Abdul Malik, the PML-N leadership failed on Thursday to resolve differences among contenders for the post of Balochistan chief minister. After a four-hour meeting with the leaders of various parties and MPAs-elect from Balochistan belonging to the PML-N, NP and Pakhtunkhwa Milli Awami Party (PkMAP), incoming prime minister Nawaz Sharif could not pick one from among the three contenders — Dr Malik of the NP and Sardar Sanaullah Zehri and Nawabzada Changez Marri of the PML-N. The NP and PkMAP have 18 members in the provincial assembly, while the PML-N has 14 seats and PML-Q five. According to sources, the three aspirants could not be persuaded by Mr Sharif on Thursday to agree on one among themselves, the discussion will continue on Friday. Since the Balochistan Assembly's first session is due on Saturday, Mr Sharif will have to resolve the impasse by then.

Turnout claims are misleading

The large number of people that came out to vote on May 11 is seen as a sign of democracy.

And it seems that this election witnessed a considerably higher voter turnout than past elections. The numbers, undoubtedly, are promising.

Take NA-1 Peshawar where PTI chief Imran Khan trounced ANP's Ghulam Ahmed Bilour. The Election Commission claims that the turnout in this Peshawar constituency, a city that suffered a number of terrorist attacks in the recent past, was almost twice that of 2008.

According to the ECP website, the turnout in 2008 in NA-1 was 22.97 per cent, while on May 11 it was 46.18.

This means that the turnout increase from 2008 to 2013 is 100 per cent, which is huge.

However, a closer look at the figures shows that the number of registered votes in the constituency in 2008 was actually higher than in 2013. In 2008, 387,083 voters were registered here; by 2013, the Election Commission had revised this down to 320,578, a decrease of 17 per cent in the voters registered for this seat.

The revision occurred due to two reasons — one the Nadra/ECP effort to remove 'fake votes' that had entered the rolls prior to the 2008 elections and the addition of new voters who became eligible to vote after the 2008 elections.

However, this exercise means that NA-1 ended up with a lower number of registered voters in 2013 than in 2008. As a result, it is not possible to compare the turnout rate of 2008 with that of 2013.

This is why the claims of the ECP as well as others about a higher voter turnout are misleading at the very least.

Take NA-23, Kohistan. Here the ECP claims that the turnout increased from 17.77 per cent to 40.24. But this too is misleading. In 2008, the number of registered voters here was 317,734, but in 2013, it had come down to 127,028, resulting in a 60 per cent decrease from 2008.

How can the increased turnout of a voter list that is less than half of what it was in 2008 clearly depict the increase in number of votes polled in 2013?

At the same time it is next to impossible to calculate the accurate turnout figures now that the numbers of registered voters have been rectified.

This cannot be done because neither Nadra nor ECP have made public the figures removed and/or added to the electoral rolls. The lack of information on how many votes were fake (and were removed) and how many were new (and were added) between 2008 and 2013 means that the new registered voters numbers on their own can be of no help.

The only way to get some sense of the change in the voter turnout from 2008 to 2013 is to compare the actual number of voters that polled in 2008 and then in 2013 in each of the 272 constituencies.

In this way, it is possible to relate the exact increase in the number of people who turned out to vote.

However, this method assumes that all polled votes in the 2008 elections were genuine, which is also a faulty assumption — if there were fake votes present, chances are some of them would have been polled.

Nonetheless, this method will be a far better indicator of the number of people who voted.

Hence, for the NA-1 case, the increase in the votes polled is 66.5 per cent and NA-23 witnessed a 9.5 per cent decrease in the number of votes polled.

As the table shows, these discrepancies are present in a number of constituencies.

However, this can be rectified if the ECP releases the details of the votes removed from each constituency since the 2008 elections and the ones it added. It should also provide details on how many of the removed votes were duplicate and how many bogus.

This will allow analysts to more accurately determine the polling percentage in 2008 and may make it easier for them to analyse the 2013 results.

Voting positions: PTI won more popular votes than PPP

ISLAMABAD: Around 112 parties contested the 2013 elections. The Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N), however, emerged as the largest party – both in terms of the number of seats it won in the National Assembly, and the votes it bagged.

The PML-N fielded 220 candidates for 270 seats in the lower house of parliament. The party won 125 seats and secured 14,794,188 votes, according to the data gathered by the Free and Fair Elections Network (FAFEN).

The Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) emerged as the second biggest party, securing 7,563,504 votes. Imran Khan fielded 232 candidates. The party, however, only won 27 seats in the National Assembly.

With 31 seats in the National Assembly, the former ruling party – the Pakistan Peoples Party-Parliamentarians (PPPP) – clinched the third position. It received 6,822,958 votes.

The May 11 election was allegedly tainted by a series of anomalies. Independent candidates emerged as the fourth strongest parliamentary force, bagging a total of 5,773,494 votes, and winning 32 seats in the lower house.

The Muttahida Qaumi Movement (MQM) fielded 205 candidates for the National Assembly, but secured 18 seats from Karachi and Hyderabad for the lower house with 2,422,656 votes.

Maulan Fazlur Rehman's Jamiat Ulama-e-Islam-Fazl fielded 131 candidates and won 10 seats. The party secured 1,454,907 votes countrywide.

The performance of the once ruling Pakistan Muslim League-Quaid was very unimpressive. In all, the party fielded 53 candidates but won only two National Assembly seats with 1,405,493 votes. The Pakistan Muslim League-

Functional, which is limited to Sindh, fielded 28 candidates and won five seats, securing 1,007,761 votes.

The Jamaat-e-Islami (JI) fielded 166 candidates but won a dismal three seats from Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa only. The JI, allegedly known for its pro-establishment approach for arranging 'dharnas' against elected governments in the past, fetched 949,394 votes in the current elections.

Out of the 58 candidates fielded by the Awami National Party (ANP), the former ruling party in Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa, only one emerged victorious. The ANP managed to get only 450,561 votes. The party says attacks and threats from the Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) was one of the main reasons why it could not carry out its election campaigns effectively.

The Muttahida Deeni Mahaz, an umbrella grouping of several religious parties, could not secure any seat in the lower house. The 87 candidates fielded by the bloc, however, won 359,589 votes.

The Pakhtunkhwa Milli Awami Party (PkMAP) won three seats in the National Assembly, fetching 211,989 votes. The party had fielded 30 candidates.

Sheikh Rashid Ahmed's Awami Muslim League Pakistan fielded 16 candidates and could win only one seat from Rawalpindi. It bagged 93,051 votes. The party with the lowest votes was Pakistan Awami Inqalab with a lone candidate receiving seven votes

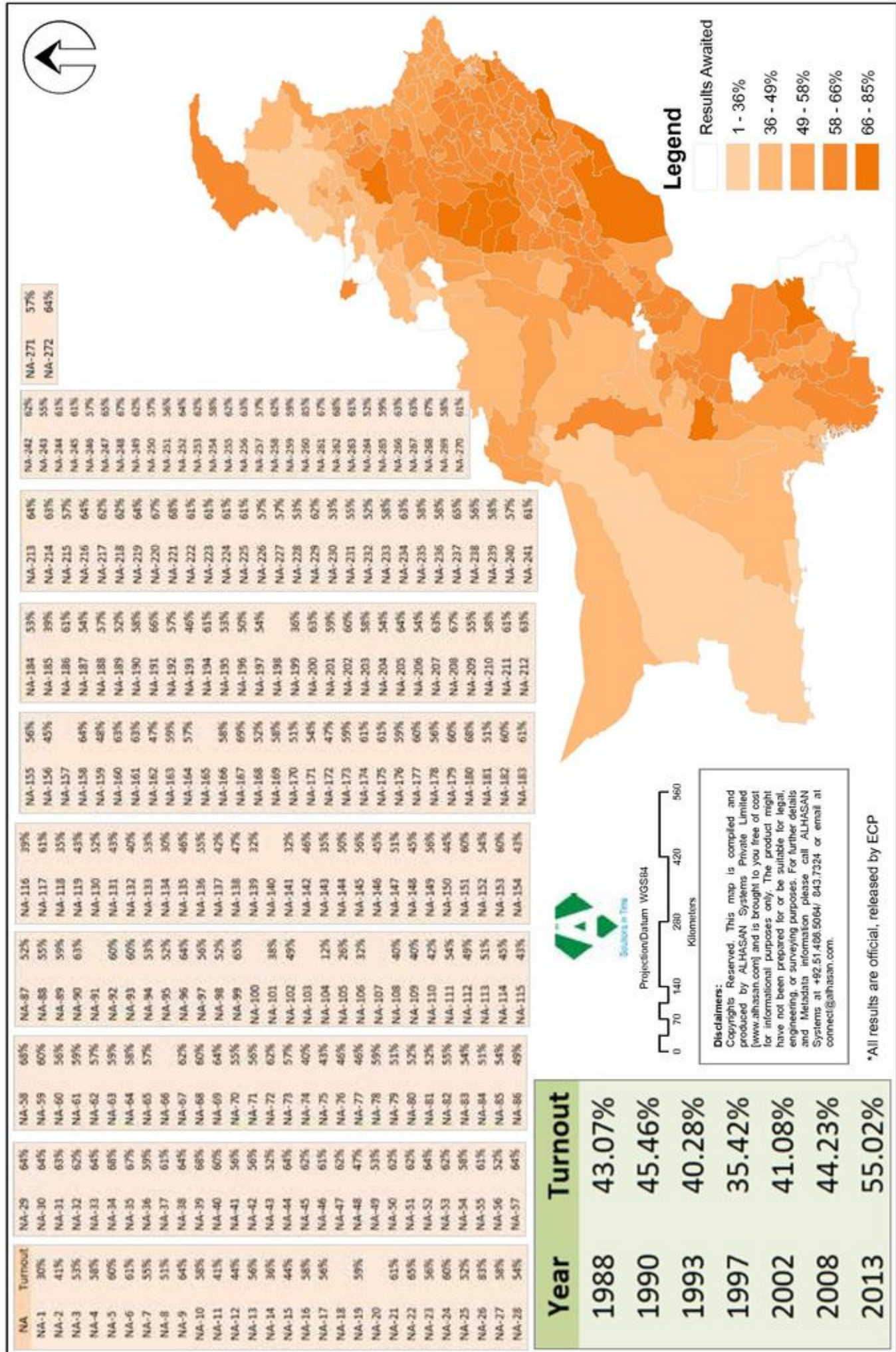

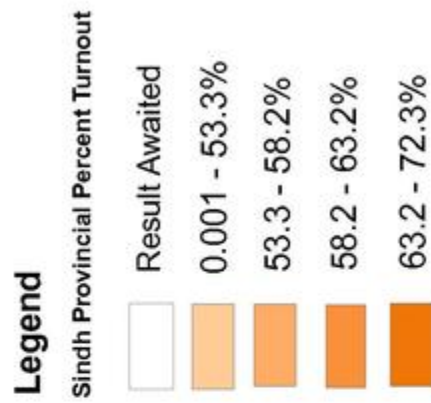

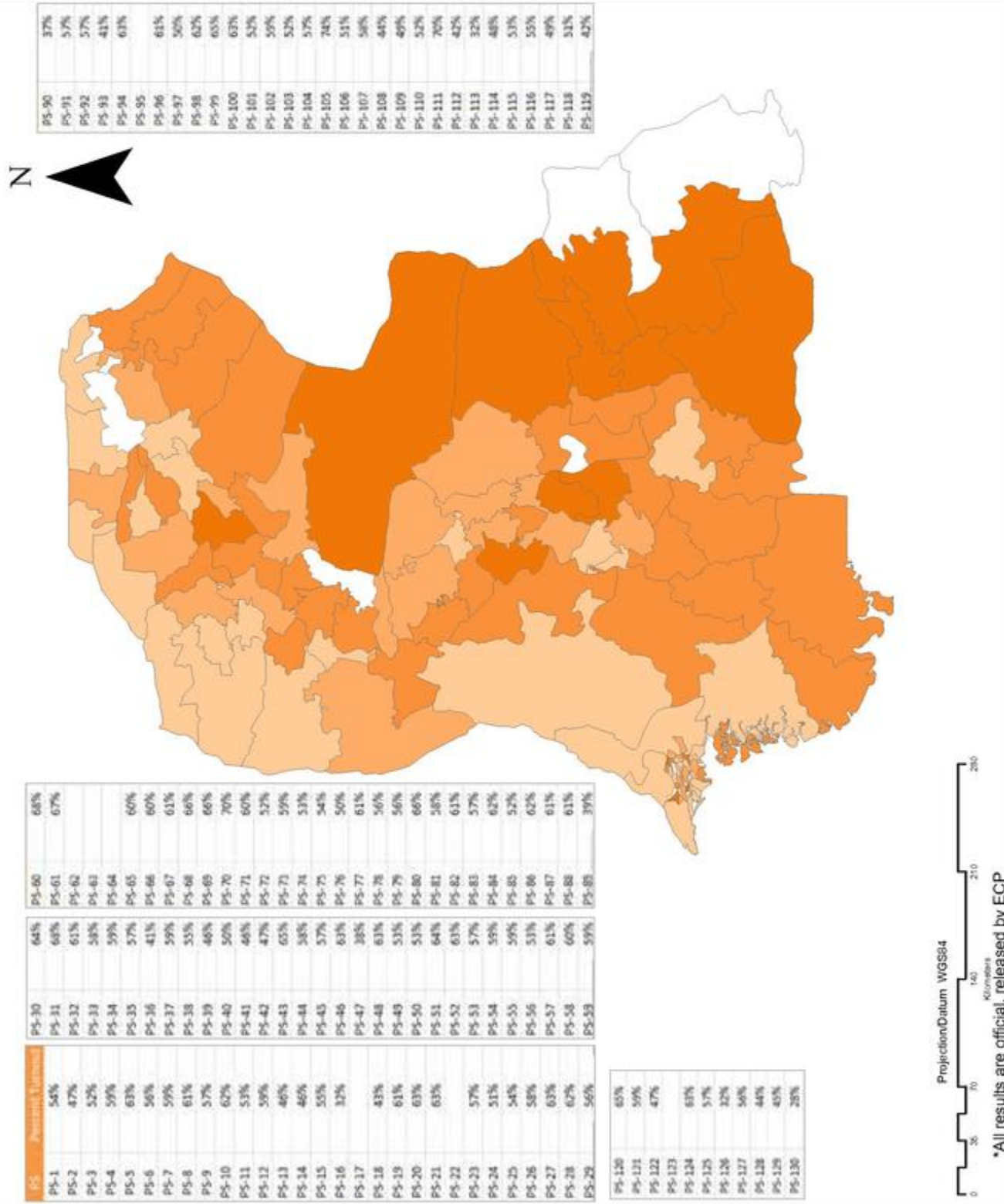
General Election-2013: NATIONAL ASSEMBLY PERCENT TURNOUT



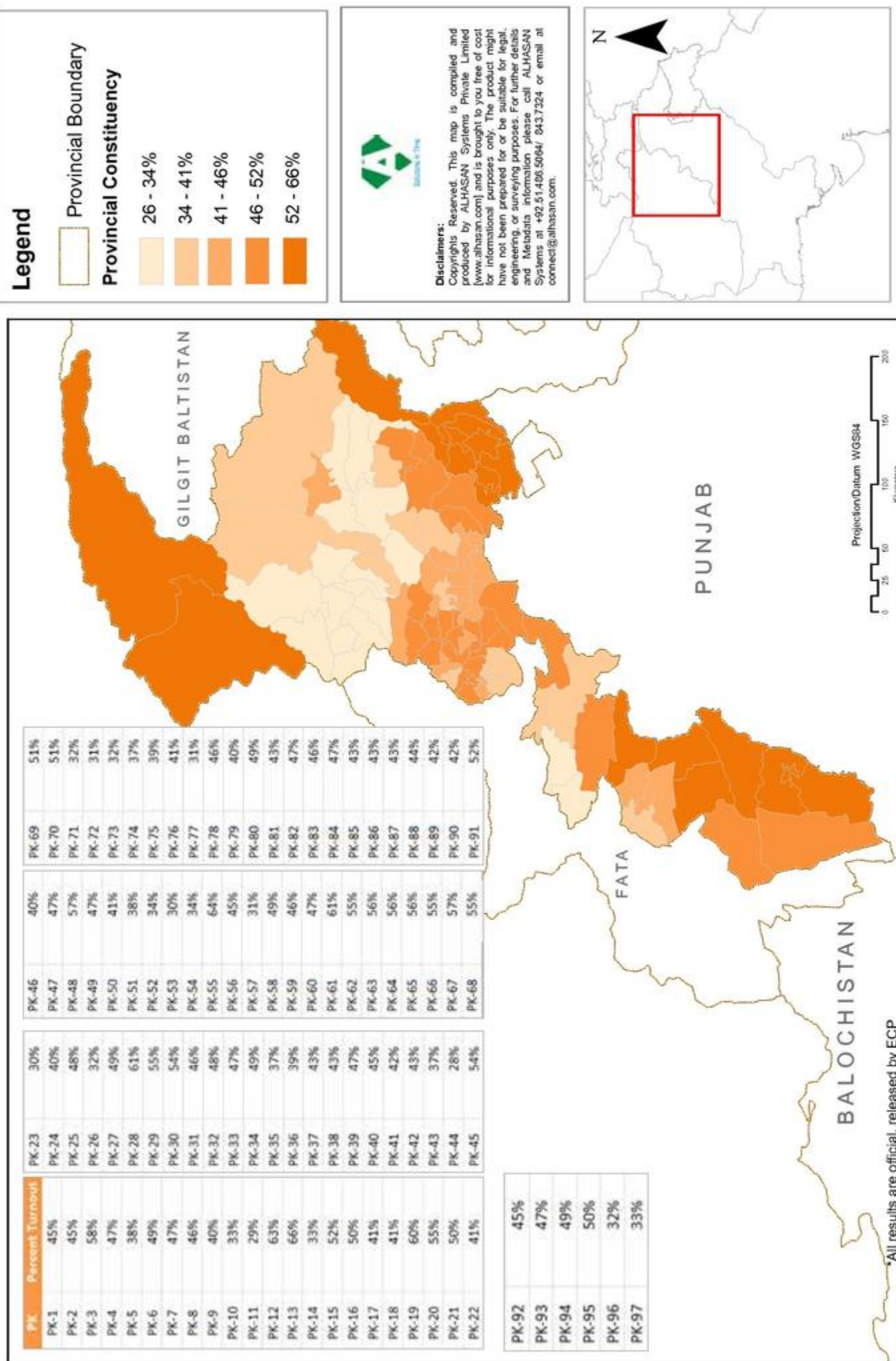
General Election-2013: SINDH PROVINCIAL ASSEMBLY PERCENT TURNOUT



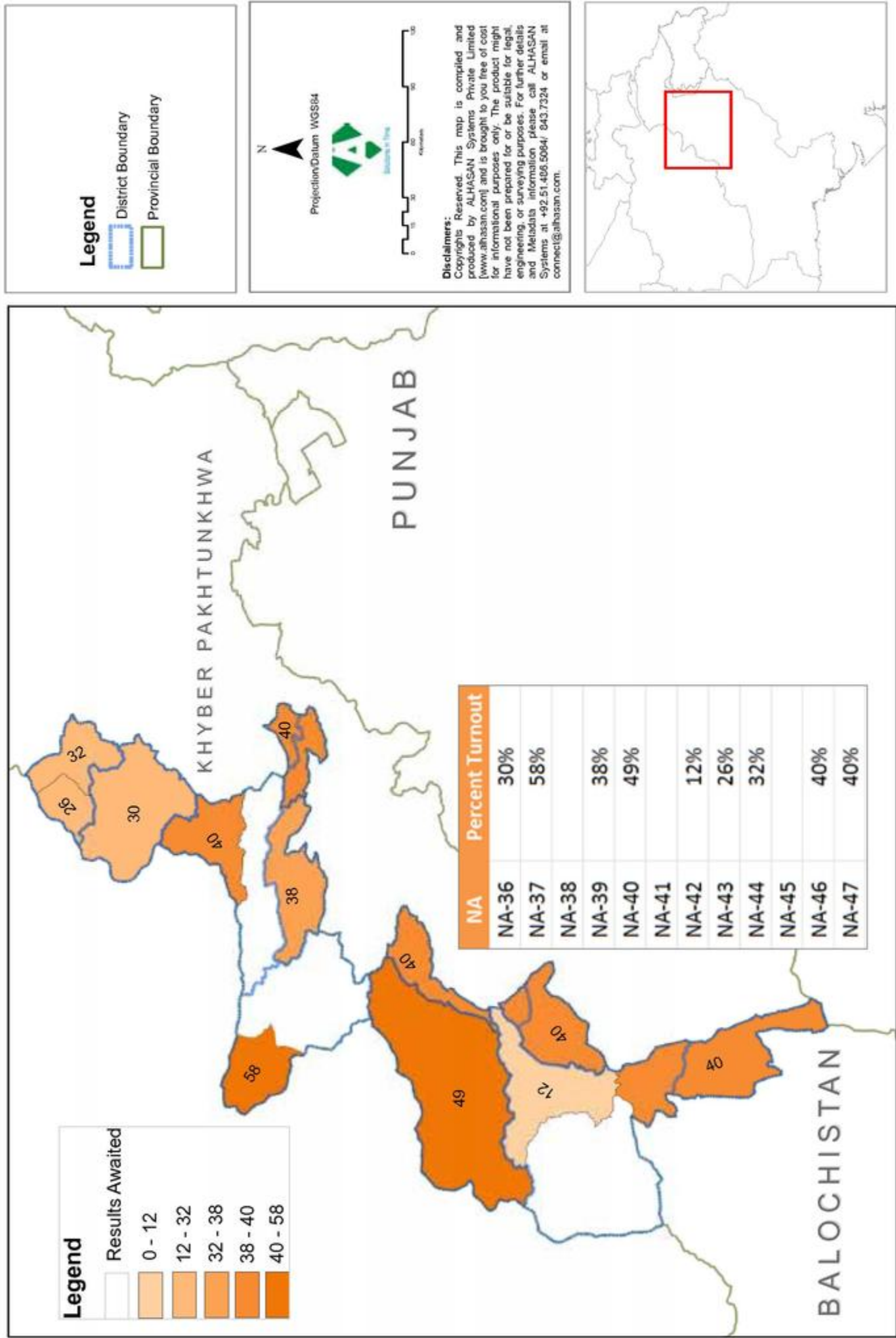

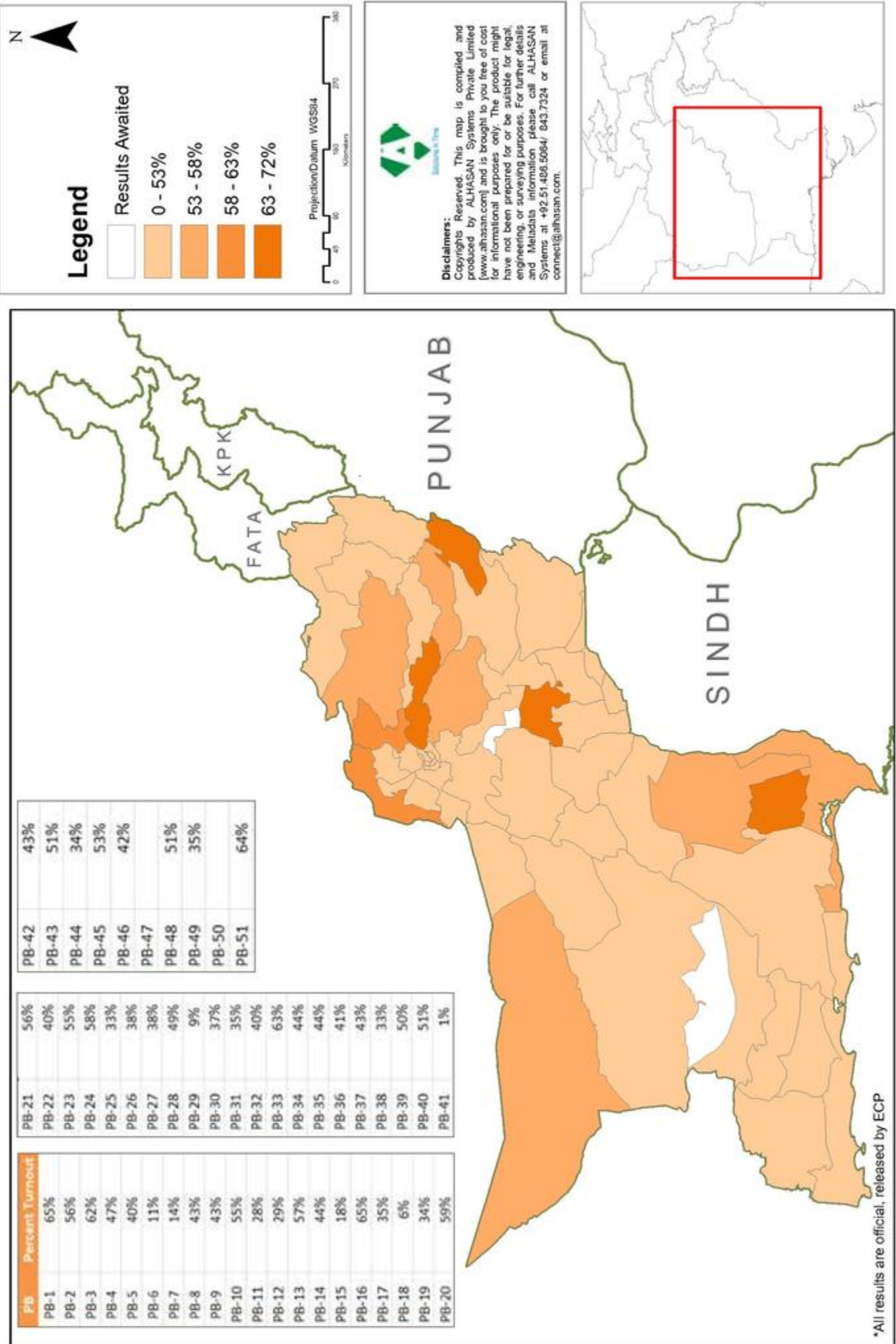
General Election-2013: KHYBER PAKHTUNKHWA PROVINCIAL ASSEMBLY PERCENT TURNOUT

پاکستان پیپلز پارٹی کی تباہی کا آغاز اسی روز ہو گیا تھا جس روز محترمہ بینظیر بھٹو نے ایک ریٹائرڈ جنرل پرویز مشرف کے ساتھ خفیہ سیاسی سودے بازی کرتے ہوئے NRO پر آمادگی کا اظہار کیا۔ 2008ء کے قومی انتخابات میں پاکستان پیپلز پارٹی کو ایوان اقتدار میں لانے میں محترمہ بینظیر بھٹو کی شہادت.... ”ہمدردی کا ووٹ“ بن کر کارگر ثابت ہوئی لیکن اس اقتدار میں ”وصیت کے نام“ سے صدارت کی کرسی بھی پاکستان پیپلز پارٹی کی تباہی کا باعث بنی۔ نظریاتی اور وفادار کارکنوں کی بھاری تعداد اپنے پارٹی رہنماؤں کے طرز عمل سے بیزار ہو کر چھوٹے چھوٹے گروپوں میں تقسیم ہوتی چلی گئی۔ حد تو یہ کہ پارٹی میں ایسے ایسے لوگ بھی شامل ہو گئے جو کہ کسی طرح سے بھی پارٹی کی سیاست سے وابستہ نہ تھے۔ اور پھر جس قلم سے ذوالفقار علی بھٹو کی پھانسی کے حکم پر دستخط ہوئے اسے بطور تحفہ جنرل ضیا الحق مرحوم سے لینے والے چودھری ظہور الہی مرحوم کے فرزند چودھری شجاعت حسین اور ان کے کزن چودھری پرویز الہی صدر آصف علی زرداری کے دست و بازو بن گئے۔ یہ وہی لوگ تھے جن کو صدر آصف علی زرداری نے ”قاتل لیگ“ کے نام سے پکارا تھا۔ دراصل یہ ہی لوگ پاکستان پیپلز پارٹی کے لئے خود کش بمبار ثابت ہوئے۔ ذوالفقار علی بھٹو نے 28 اکتوبر 1967ء کو لاہور میں ایک پریس کانفرنس کے دوران پاکستان پیپلز پارٹی کی تشکیل کا اعلان کیا۔ پارٹی نے اپنے منشور میں جن چار نکات کو اپنی پارٹی پالیسی میں اپنانے کا اعلان کیا۔ ان میں 1۔ اسلام ہمارا دین ہے 2۔ سوشلزم ہماری معیشت ہے 3۔ طاقت کا سرچشمہ عوام ہیں شامل تھے۔ یہ بھی کہا جاتا تھا کہ ”بھٹو ہر اس گھر میں بستا ہے جس کی چھت ٹپکتی ہے“ لیکن موجودہ پارٹی میں طاقت کا سرچشمہ صرف اور صرف دولت کی چمک، لوٹ مار، جھوٹ، فریب اور سیاسی جوڑ توڑ بنی ہوئے رکھا گیا اور ٹپکتی چھتوں کو بہتر بنانے اور غریبوں کو چھتیں فراہم کرنے کی بجائے خود اپنے لئے ”سرے محل سے لے کر بلاول ہاؤس“ تک نئے نئے محل تعمیر کروائے گئے۔ پیرس لندن اور امریکہ میں جائیدادیں خریدی گئیں۔ سوئٹزر لینڈ کے بینکوں میں قومی دولت لوٹ کر محفوظ رکھی گئیں۔ اصل میں یہ ہیں وہ عوامل جو اس پارٹی کے زوال کا باعث بنے۔ ایوان صدر کو جیالوں کا ہیڈ کوارٹر بنا کر ایوان صدر کی غیر جانبدار حیثیت کو سوالیہ نشان بنا دیا گیا۔ محترمہ بینظیر بھٹو کی تصویر کے سائے میں حکومت چلائی گئی اور خود جیالوں کو بھی دھوکہ دیا گیا۔ راجہ پرویز اشرف اور قمر الزمان کارہ جیسے لوگ عوام کی عدالت میں جانے کا بار بار تذکرہ کر کے اپنے سیاسی عزائم سے خوش ہوا کرتے تھے۔

آج ان کے تمام کے تمام خواب دھرے کے دھرے رہ گئے۔ وفاق کی سطح پر پاکستان پیپلز پارٹی اپنا وجود کھو چکی ہے۔ صدر مملکت آصف علی زرداری اپنے پورے دور اقتدار میں آج تک ایوان صدر اسلام آباد، بلاول ہاؤس کراچی، لاہور، لاڑکانہ اور نوڈیرہ تک ہی محدود رہے ہیں اور یا پھر بیرون ملک اپنے دوروں کے دوران لندن، دوہئی، پیرس اور امریکہ میں اپنے مالی امور کی جانکاری کے لئے مصروف رہے ہیں۔ قومی سلامتی کے محافظ رحمن ملک کو قوم کی سلامتی کے لئے لازم قرار دیا گیا اور وہ اپنی فرائض کی ادائیگی میں سیاسی مخالفین کے ساتھ جوڑ توڑ اور لین دین کے لئے پاکستان سے باہر دوہئی اور لندن تک ہمہ وقت دوروں پر رہے۔ ملک کے اندر غیر ملکی ہاتھوں کی مداخلت کا تذکرہ تو کرتے رہے لیکن کوئی توڑ نہ کیا جاسکا جس کا نتیجہ آج پورے ملک میں مختلف مافیاز کا قبضہ ہے جو کہ بلاشبہ اندرونی سیاسی گروپس کی پشت پناہی کے ثبوت فراہم کر رہے ہیں۔ کراچی اور بلوچستان میں ان مافیاز نے اپنے بچے گاڑ رکھے ہیں اس کی تمام تر ذمہ داری گزشتہ پانچ سالہ دور حکومت میں وزارت داخلہ کی نااہلی اور ناقص کارکردگی ہے پاکستان پیپلز پارٹی کی اندرونی صفوں میں رحمن ملک کے خلاف زبردست نفرت پائی جاتی تھی لیکن صدر مملکت کی قربت ان کو ہر مشکل گھڑی میں محفوظ راستہ فراہم کرتی رہی۔ بھٹو کے مزاروں کو اقتدار کا رستہ قرار دے کر وہاں عوامی اجتماعات پر قومی سرمایہ ضائع کیا گیا۔ خود جیالے حیران ہیں کہ آخر کن وجوہات کی بنا پر رحمن ملک، اویس مظہر ٹپی اور حسین حقانی کو حکومتی اداروں میں بے جا اہمیت فراہم کی گئی اور حتیٰ کہ حساس اداروں میں رحمن ملک اور حسین حقانی کو جس انداز میں فری ہینڈ دیا گیا یہ ملک کے قومی اداروں کے لئے سوالیہ نشان ہے۔ کبھی ہندو اور کبھی قلم کی سازش کا تذکرہ ہوا۔ گو کہ قوم کو گمراہ کیا جاتا رہا۔ بلاول زرداری کو بھٹو بنا کر بھی پارٹی میں کوئی

پاکستان میں حالیہ انتخاب میں کامیابی حاصل کرنے والی جماعتوں کا ڈرون حملوں کے خلاف موقف زیادہ سخت ہے
بعض اوقات پیغامات ڈاک، زبان یا اشاروں کی مدد سے دیے جاتے ہیں لیکن کئی مرتبہ اس میں سے کسی کی بھی ضرورت نہیں رہتی۔

آپ کی کارروائی سب واضح کر دیتی ہے۔ یہی پالیسی اکثر شدت پسندی کے خلاف بظاہر جنگ میں دو اتحادی پاکستان اور امریکہ بھی ایک دوسرے کو دینے کے لیے کرتے ہیں۔

لیکن ایک دہائی بعد آپ اس کے نتائج پر نظر ڈالیں تو خیبر پختونخوا کم از کم کوئی خاص فائدہ نہیں ہوا۔ ترقی کی شاہراہ پر وہ پیچھے ہی رہا اور شدت پسندی نے جو سراسر وقت اٹھایا وہ مسئلہ قبائلی علاقوں سے نکل کر سوات جیسی جنت نظیر وادی کو بھی اپنی پیٹ میں لے گیا۔
حالیہ انتخابات میں ایک مرتبہ پھر خیبر پختونخوا میں ایک نیا تجربہ کیا گیا ہے۔ عمران خان کی پاکستان تحریک انصاف نے غیر معمولی کامیابی حاصل کی۔ یہ ایک ایسی جماعت تھی جس نے بد عنوانی کے خاتمے کے علاوہ ایک بڑا نعرہ ڈرونز کو گرانے کا لگایا۔

تحریک انصاف کو ووٹ دینے کا مقصد

خیبر پختونخوا کے ووٹرز نے شاید پاکستان تحریک انصاف کو ووٹ نہ تو ڈرون گرانے کے نعرے پر دیے نہ بد عنوانی کے خاتمے پر لیکن جس بڑے مقصد کے لیے ووٹ دیے وہ شاید امن و امان کی صورتحال میں بہتری کی امید تھی۔

خیبر پختونخوا کے ووٹرز نے شاید اسے ووٹ نہ تو ڈرون گرانے کے نعرے پر دیے نہ بد عنوانی کے خاتمے پر لیکن جس بڑے مقصد کے لیے ووٹ دیے وہ شاید امن و امان کی صورتحال میں بہتری کی امید تھی۔
لیکن آج جب ہم خیبر پختونخوا اسمبلی کی حلف برداری کی تقریب دیکھ کر ایک 'نئے پاکستان' کی نہ سہی 'نئے خیبر پختونخوا' کو ابھرتے دیکھ رہے تھے امریکی جان لیوا بغیر پائلٹ کے طیاروں نے انتخابی چھٹیوں کے بعد ایک اور وار کیا ہے۔

نئی صوبائی اسمبلی اور عمومی طور پر تمام پاکستان کو امریکی پیغام کافی واضح تھا کہ جب ان کے خیال میں ہدف قدرے سامنے ہو تو ان کی انگلیاں ہٹن دہانے سے نہیں چوکیں گی۔

تاہم یہ اکثر ابہام رہتا ہے کہ آیا خیبر پختونخوا کا کتنا اختیار ہے قبائلی علاقوں کے امور پر۔ فلانا کا انتظام مرکزی حکومت صوبائی گورنر کے ذریعے چلاتی ہے۔ اس میں صوبائی حکومت کا کوئی عمل دخل نہیں ہوتا۔ لہذا اگر امریکی فوج خیبر پختونخوا کے لوگوں کو کوئی پیغام دینا چاہتی تھی کہ انہوں نے ڈرون کے خلاف ووٹ دیا ہے تو ایسا سمجھنے میں وہ غلط ہے۔

امریکی صدر براک اوباما کی گزشتہ دنوں ڈرون سے متعلق پالیسی تقریر سے واضح تھا کہ ایک ایسے ملک میں جس کے خلاف اعلان جنگ نہیں کیا ہو ڈرون حملوں کا کوئی جواز نہیں لیکن چونکہ انہیں خطرہ ہے تو لہذا وہ یہ حملے کم یا زیادہ تعداد جتنی بھی ہو جاری رکھیں گے۔

ایک ایسے صدر کے منہ سے یہ بات کوئی زیادہ اچھی نہیں لگی جو امن کا نوبل انعام بھی حاصل کر چکے ہوں۔ لیکن ڈرون کی زبان امریکیوں نے بولنی ہے سو وہ بولتے رہیں گے چاہے ہدف بننے والے ملک کی نمائندہ پارلیمان اس کے خلاف قرارداد منظور کرے یا صوبائی اسمبلی

یو ایس ایڈ کے سربراہ، امریکی سفیر مسٹر کروکر اور ایکی پیٹرین نے الیکشن کمیشن آف پاکستان کے چکر لگانے شروع کر دیئے تھے اور ان کا موقف یہی تھا کہ آئندہ کے الیکشن میں پاکستان سے باہر بیٹھی ہوئی سیاسی شخصیت کا حصہ لینا بین الاقوامی مفادات میں ہے اور ان کا اشارہ محترمہ بے نظیر بھٹو کی طرف ہی تھا۔ امریکی سینٹ کے بھی جو وفود الیکشن کمیشن کا دورہ کر کے آئندہ کے انتخابات کا جائزہ لینے اور بریفنگ کے لئے آتے رہے ان کا ایک ہی موقف تھا کہ پاکستان کے انتخابات میں تمام سیاسی جماعتوں کی شمولیت بہت ہی ضروری ہے۔ امریکی تھنک ٹینک نے الیکشن کمیشن آف پاکستان پر دباؤ ڈالا کہ الیکشن کمیشن آف پاکستان میں پولیٹیکل پارٹیز ایڈوائزری سیل قائم کیا جائے۔ جس میں پاکستان کی بڑی سیاسی جماعتوں کی نمائندگی ہونی چاہئے۔ اس نقطہ نظر کو تسلیم کرانے کے لئے امریکی تھنک ٹینک نے پاکستان میں بیرونی امداد حاصل کرنے والی این جی اوز کی خدمات حاصل کیں اور انہوں نے الیکشن کمیشن آف پاکستان پر یلغار کر دی الیکشن کمیشن آف پاکستان کے اس وقت کے چیف الیکشن کمشنر جسٹس ریٹائرڈ قاضی محمد فاروق نے ان کے موقف کو مسترد کرتے ہوئے کہا کہ آئین میں ایسی کوئی گنجائش نہیں ہے جس کی رو سے الیکشن کمیشن میں سیاسی پارٹیوں پر مشتمل ایڈوائزری سیل کی تشکیل کی جائے۔ میں نے بطور وفاقی سیکرٹری الیکشن کمیشن آف پاکستان کے اس آئینی موقف کو امریکی تھنک ٹینک سے منظور کرایا اور اسے یہ باور کرایا کہ چونکہ پاکستان میں سیاسی جماعتیں ایک دوسرے کے موقف سے متضاد نظریات رکھتی ہیں لہذا الیکشن کمیشن آف پاکستان اپنی آئینی ذمہ داریوں کو پورا کرنے میں ناکام رہے گا۔ چونکہ امریکی تھنک ٹینک کو پاکستان کی تمام بڑی سیاسی جماعتوں کا ادراک تھا، انہوں نے ہمارے موقف کو تسلیم کر لیا۔ بد قسمتی سے عالمی نے ان پر نگاہ رکھی اور اپنے مہروں کے آگے لانے میں اہم کردار ادا کیا۔ امریکی Establishment حکومت نے پاکستان میں 1954ء سے سیاسی مداخلت شروع کر دی تھی۔
