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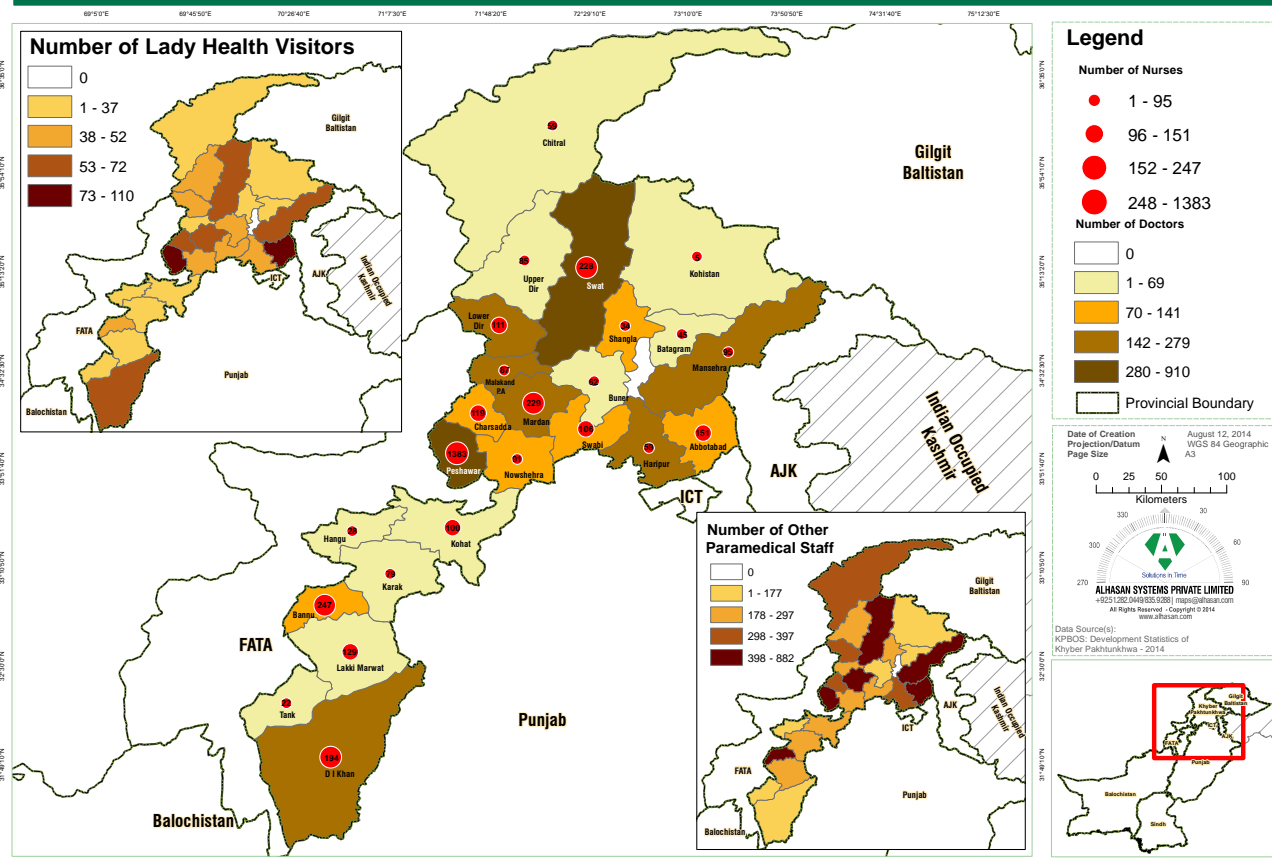

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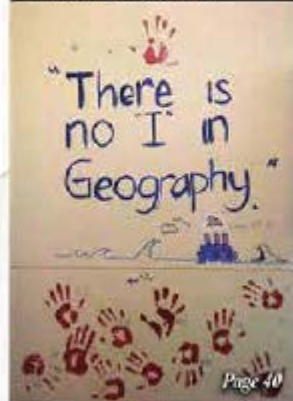
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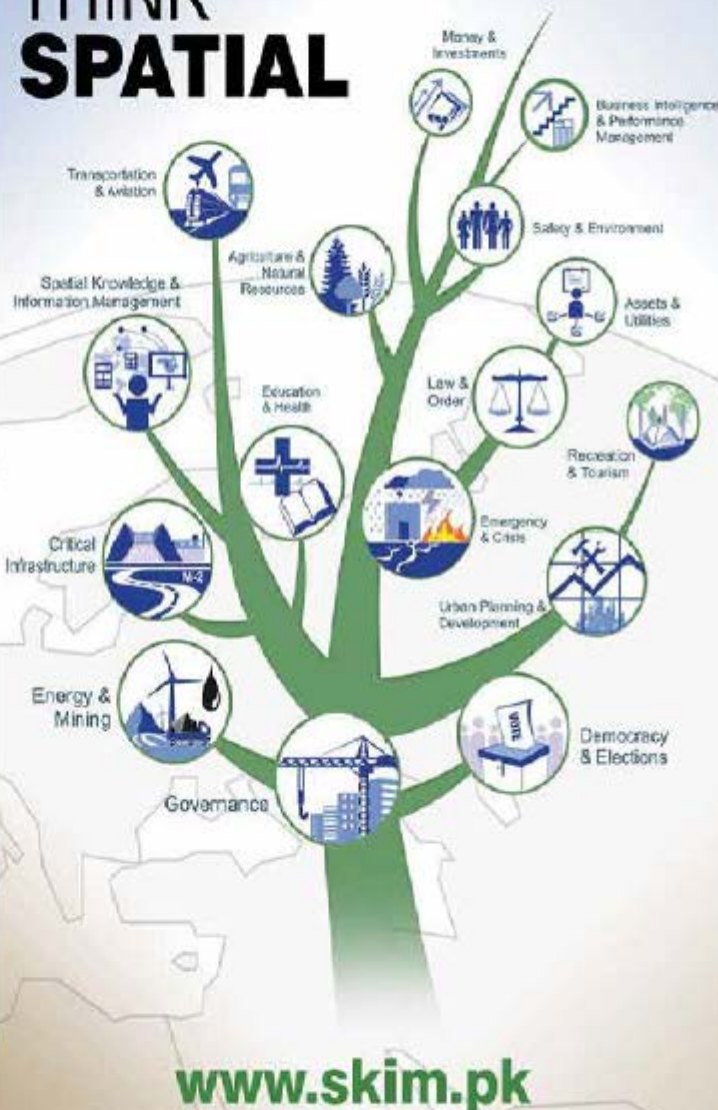

## DETAILS

**ISLAMABAD:** If new funds are not arranged soon for the faltering anti-polio campaign in the country, it is likely to halt after two months, according to sources in the Ministry of National Health Services. An official of the ministry told Dawn on condition of anonymity that the ministry was running out of funds.

The Economic Coordination Council (ECC) was supposed to approve PC I for the campaign in second week of August, but has not met owing to political crisis. Under the PC I, the Islamic Development Bank, Japan and other organizations were to provide loan of \$326 million, with the interest on the amount to be paid by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, the official said. "If the funds are not arranged in next two months, the ministry would be left with no option but to halt the countrywide polio campaign," he added. In November the World Health Organization is to review the temporary travel restrictions it imposed on Pakistan in May 2014, on the recommendation of the International Health Regulations, which made it mandatory for every person intending to travel abroad to produce polio vaccination certificate at airport. For now, it is obligatory on the government to vaccinate each person going out of the country, the official said. Lack of funds may jeopardize countrywide polio campaign "In 2012, Central Development Working Party (CDWP) gave approval to the loan. In June 2013, PC-I was revised but still it could not be approved because of one objection after another," he said.

"Once the PC-1 is approved, the funds will be transferred to World Health Organization (WHO) and the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) which are supervising the campaign," the ministry official said. "The financial problem is more for Punjab, Sindh and Baluchistan than Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) and Federally Administered Tribal Area (Fata) where funds are provided through United Arab Emirates Pakistan Assistance Program (UAE PAP)," he said.

"In case of unavailability of funds it will become impossible to pay salaries to almost 2000 highly paid communication officers who are raising awareness of polio vaccine among parents," he said.

"Most of the officers have been working for the last two years and once they leave because of delay in payment of salaries it will become difficult to hire trained officers. Moreover, stipends to polio workers have also been delayed," he said. "Vaccine could not be provided at Chaman border due to which people coming from Afghanistan could not be vaccinated for the last many days," he said. When contacted, the minister of NHS, Saira Afzal Tarar, claimed that she had been trying her best to arrange funds from alternative sources. She told Dawn that she was aware of the increasing operational cost and issue of funds. "Central Development Working Party (CDWP) approved the PC I but the Planning Division insisted that since health is a provincial subject after 18th Amendment the matter should be referred to Council of Common Interest (CCI). However, the provinces gave in writing that they had no objection on PC I so Finance Minister Ishaq Dar agreed to discuss the issue in Economic Coordination Committee (ECC) of cabinet," she said. "Meeting of ECC was scheduled in second week of August but because of political crisis representatives of different provinces did not come," she said. "I am also trying to get the funds and resolve the issue or call a meeting of ECC only on PC I for polio," she said. While replying to a question regarding non-provision of vaccine at Chaman border, Ms. Tarar said although it was provincial issue, she will inquire into it.

**BAHAWALPUR:** Commissioner Javed Akbar said on Sunday that a crackdown against illegal blood banks would be initiated and action would be taken against those selling substandard blood. He was speaking at a meeting with district officials. Akbar said district administration had noted the proliferation of illegal blood banks in Bahawalpur. He said action would be taken against those found guilty. Akbar said provision of quality blood was necessary to save lives. He urged doctors to spread awareness about the need for using quality blood.

Akbar said banners would be placed in hospitals across Bahawalpur to spread awareness regarding this. He said a toll free number would be established to help public procure quality blood. It was also decided in the meeting to computerize blood records at the Bahawal Victoria Hospital. Akbar said the step would facilitate the timely provision of healthy blood online. He said health experts would begin holding seminars on the importance of quality blood next week. The commissioner said the government was committed to providing quality health services. Akbar said zero tolerance would be shown in this regard. He said state-of-the-art blood banks would be established in the district with German assistance. Akbar said the government was establishing the country's first bone-marrow transplant center in Bahawalpur.

**LAHORE:** Pakistan Orthopedic Association with collaboration of Health Reporters Association arranged an orthopedic medical camp in Usman Auditorium, Lahore Press Club (LPC), on Saturday. A large number of LPC members and their families attended it in which tests besides free medicines were provided to patients. Senior doctors of different hospitals checked up patients. Speaking on the occasion, LPC President Arshid Ansari said aim of medical camps in the Lahore Press Club was to provide the best treatment facilities to its members.

**KARACHI:** Health officials are on high alert as the city's first Congo patient this year died at a private hospital in Azizabad on Thursday. Doctors and family members of the deceased are afraid that the virus could infect others. According to sources, 24-year-old Muhammad Kashif, a butcher and resident of Azizabad passed away at the hospital on Thursday. He was laid to rest on Friday morning. Health officials claim that all precautionary measures were taken during the burial process and steps have been taken to ensure that those who came in close contact with the deceased have not been infected. While talking to The Express Tribune, Karachi EDO Dr. Zafar Ejaz said that Kashif was a butcher by profession and probably contracted the disease from an infected animal. Top officials, including the health secretary, were informed about the death through a letter from the EDO's office, requesting the department to involve itself as threats of the



virus could multiply ahead of Eid ul Azha. "We are taking the issue seriously and are trying to take measures to control it," he said. "Officials at the private hospital where Kashif died guided the family on how to take care of the patient while our staff was there during the burial to support the family." In 2012, three people infected by the Congo virus died in Karachi. All three victims used to work with livestock.

**Symptoms:** The Congo virus or Crimean Congo Viral Hemorrhagic Fever is a tick-borne viral disease that can spread from domestic and wild animals. Initial signs and symptoms include headache, fever, back and joint pain, vomiting and red eyes. Many people who get infected also get jaundice and as the illness progresses, large areas of severe bruising, severe nosebleeds, and uncontrolled bleeding at injection sites can be seen, beginning on about the fourth day of illness and lasting for about two weeks.

**Naegleria claims another life:** A man identified as 34-year-old Muhammad Aamer died on Thursday night because of Naegleria, taking the death toll to eight. Health officials believe that water samples taken from his house in Garden West had zero chlorine levels, while officials at the Karachi Water and Sewerage Board (KWSB) claim that the area has the required level. "There was no chlorine in the water samples collected from the deceased's house," said Dr. Ejaz.

According to Azam Khan, the focal person of the committee on Naegleria, however, when they visited the area water samples indicated that they did have the required chlorine levels. So far, the committee on Naegleria has been unable to find out what is the major cause of cases in the city. Officials claim they need more time to investigate. The committee was set up in the second week of June when the first naegleria case surfaced in the city. It has officials from the health, local government departments and KWSB who monitor and maintain chlorine levels across the city. "We are making an effort to maintain chlorine levels in the city but fail to understand what's happening," claimed Khan. "People also use ground water which is sometimes contaminated. I doubt that's the reason but it needs to be looked into." Dr. Ejaz, on the other hand, believes that the real problem is the lack of chlorine. Almost 40 per cent of city did not have the required chlorine levels when the committee was set up two months ago. According to some reports, 14 per cent of the city still does not have the required level of chlorine. The health department claims that it is the responsibility of the KWSB to maintain or distribute chlorine tablets among the citizens. The KWSB, however, said that this was difficult to do as the health department had not made such tablets available to them.

### Breastfeeding week from August 25

**LAHORE:** World Breast Feeding Week will be observed in Punjab from 25th to 30th August during which awareness seminars will be organized at district headquarters to highlight the importance of breast feeding in the better health of infants and children. It was stated by the Director General Health Punjab Dr. Zahid Pervaiz while addressing a seminar at Fatima Jinnah Medical College here today. Principal FJMC Prof. Dr. Sardar Fakhar Imam, Provincial Coordinator Lady Health Workers Program (LHWs) Dr. Javed Umer, Dr. Tanvir, Prof. Munir Saleem, Prof. Maryum Malik, Prof. Nishat Maqsood, a large number of LHWs, nursing staff and community workers attended the seminar. Dr. Javed Umer informed that during the seminars at DHQ level lecturers would be delivered by the experts to sensitize the women regarding the importance of lactation. While addressing the seminar, the experts advised that breast feeding should be started immediately after birth to the infant and it should be continued for 6 months during which no other food should be given to the child and after 6 months soft food can be started along with the breast feeding. Dr. Zahid Pervaiz said that training of LHWs would be completed in the field of nutrition, breast feeding and schedule of feeding to the children. He urged upon the nursing staff and lady health workers to convey the message door to door regarding the importance of breast feeding in the health of infant. He hoped that MDGs would be achieved by improving the health of mother and child by 2015.

### Rs.121.80 billion allocated for health in budget

**LAHORE:** Minister for Excise & Taxation, Finance Mujtaba Shuja ur Rehman has said that the budget allocated for health Rs.121.80 billion which is 11.66 percent of total expenditures of the government. He said that 36 percent of development budget has been allocated for south Punjab so that maximum development projects will be completed in the less developed districts. He said that government has reserved Rs.2 billion to achieve the millennium development goals (MDGs). While talking to various delegations at his residence, Mujtaba Shuja ur Rehman said that youth are the future of the nation and government is providing them state of the art healthcare facilities to establish healthy society in the country. He said that protective healthcare programs would be continued to save the children from epidemic, communicable and non-communicable diseases. He said that Expanded Program on Immunization (EPI) aims at reducing morbidity, disabilities and mortality caused by vaccine preventable diseases. He said that the government was appointing trained lady health workers, LHVs and community midwives at health centers, especially in remote areas so that infants and mothers could be saved from fatal diseases, whereas, LHWs were being appointed in remote areas. He said the MMR in LHWs covered area is 147/100,000 live births, compared 300 to 350/100,000 to uncovered areas, therefore, the LHWs, LHVs and the community midwives were being appointed at all the health centers in remote area. Mujtaba Shuja ur Rehman said that the programs launched for the maternal and neonatal healthcare will ensure progress towards achieving the millennium development goals (MDGs) in maternal and infant health. The Minister said that in order to achieve the results of Millennium Development Goals (MDGs), the major focus is on protecting the health of people through strengthening of Primary Health Care & Disease Preventive Programs and Rs.1.80 billion are being spent for the launching of a healthcare facilities program to mother and child, whereas, at present new born mortality rate is 54/1000 which would be reduced up to 25 by year 2015.

### Advisory on effective prevention of Ebola virus

**ISLAMABAD:** The Ministry of National Health Services, Regulations and Coordination have issued an advisory to the Chief Secretaries of all provinces and relevant stakeholders to take steps on urgent basis for effective prevention of Ebola virus disease. According to

ministry's sources, the provincial officials have been asked that in the absence of effective treatment and a human vaccine, raising awareness of the risk factors for Ebola infection and the protective measures which individuals can take is the only way to reduce human infection and death. They said that in its letter, the ministry advised to reduce the risk of human-to-human transmission on the community arising from direct or close contact with infected patients, particularly with their bodily fluids. The ministry also recommended that close physical contacts with Ebola patients should be avoided and gloves and appropriate personal protective equipment should be worn when taking care of ill patients at home. Sources said that the ministry recommended that regular hand washing is required after visiting Ebola patients in hospital, as well as taking care of patients at home. Similarly, health-care workers caring for patients with suspected or confirmed Ebola virus should apply, in addition to standard precautions, other infection control measures to avoid any exposure to the patient's blood and body fluids and direct unprotected contact with the possibly contaminated environment. They said that the advisory has been issued after taking notice of the minister for National Health Services, Regulations and Coordination of unprecedented outbreak of Ebola Virus disease currently speeding in West Africa (Guinea, Liberia and Sierra Leone) with the cases of 1,378, including 746 deaths with fatality rate of up to 90 percent. They said the threat and potential for rapid spread in the region remains high, due to frequent movement of people between the affected countries related to trade and transit etc. and that its travel associated spread and risk of importation of the disease calls for immediate necessary measures. According to medical experts, Ebola virus disease (EVD) is a severe acute viral illness often characterized by the sudden onset of fever, intense weakness, muscle pain, headache and sore throat. This followed by vomiting, diarrhea, rash, impaired kidney and liver function, and in some cases both internal and external bleeding, they added.

**PESHAWAR:** The National Institute of Health (NIH) Islamabad confirmed two new wild type-1 polio cases from Federal Administered Tribal Areas and Karachi that raised the polio cases to 117 in Pakistan this year. According to the NIH report the first polio case was reported from Khyber Agency as 16 months old female child Laiba daughter of Zahid area Milward, village Shaheedo tehsil Bara, Khyber Agency was not received any single dose of Polio. The second cases was confirmed from Karachi as 12 months old Zakir Shah male child, Union Council -5, Mansehra Colony Landi Town Karachi, the parents of the child was not allowed to vaccinate their children. After these two new polio cases the polio cases reach to 117 in Pakistan in 2014 as 85 were registered from Fata while 19 cases were reported from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa while 11 cases were so far registered from Sindh.

**QUETTA:** A three-day anti polio campaign has been launched in Quetta on Monday. Earlier, on account of security issues, the drive scheduled for August 11 was delayed in Quetta and Pishin. A polio case reported in Killa Abdullah district had deprived Baluchistan of the status of being polio free for 18 months. "As many as 476,000 children below the age of five will be administered polio drops in Quetta," a health official said. He noted that over 493 mobile teams have been constituted besides 54 transit points and 95 fixed centers have been established across the Quetta block comprising Quetta and Pishin. He said that 171 area in-charges have been tasked to monitor the campaign.

**ISLAMABAD:** The Ministry of National Health Services (NHS) has sent an advisory to the Islamabad capital territory (ICT) administration, the Capital Development Authority and the chief secretaries of all provinces to take precautionary measures against the Ebola disease. In the advisory, the ministry said in the recent past West Africa (Guinea, Liberia and Sierra Leone) had experienced the outbreak of the disease where 1,378 cases had been reported with 746 deaths and fatality rate of up to 90 per cent.

The ministry warned that the Ebola virus might travel to Pakistan due to the frequent movement of people to the African countries in connection with trade and transit, etc. "Therefore, the risk of importation of the disease calls for immediate precautionary measures."

It said Ebola was a severe acute viral illness often characterized by the sudden onset of fever, intense weakness, muscles pain, headache and sore throat. This followed by vomiting, diarrhea, rashes, impaired kidney and liver functioning. In some cases, both internal and external bleeding also starts. The disease spreads through physical contacts with patients. In the absence of vaccination and effective treatment, raising awareness about the risk factors and the protective measures are the only way to reduce the chances of its spread. The risk of human-to-human transmission arises from direct or close contact with the infected persons, particularly with their body fluids. "Close physical contacts with Ebola patients should be avoided. Gloves and appropriate personal protective gear should be worn while taking care of the Ebola patients at home," added the advisory. "Regular hand washing is required after visiting Ebola patients in hospital or taking care of them at home." It said in addition to the standard precautions, healthcare workers looking after the patients with suspected or confirmed Ebola virus should apply infection control measures to avoid any exposure to the patient's blood and body fluids. Pakistan Institute of Medical Sciences (PIMS) Vice Chancellor Prof Javed Akram told Dawn that Ebola was a viral disease and the virus spread because of a close contact, sexual transmission, through saliva and blood transfusion. "The Ebola and HIV have lots of similarities but the former is more dangerous. The incubation period of HIV is almost 10 years whereas Ebola develops into a full blown disease in just a week and attacks the nervous system. The disease is endemic in West Africa," he said. In reply to a question, Dr. Akram said the virus was not endemic in Pakistan so people coming from West Africa should be screened at airports.

**LAHORE:** Adviser to Chief Minister on Health Khwaja Salman Rafique has directed the officials concerned to take action against private hospitals under the law for not participating in anti-dengue training courses. He issued the order on a complaint presented before a meeting of the

cabinet committee on dengue control held here on Monday. The participants were informed that only a few doctors of private hospitals were taking part in the case management training which showed a lack of interest in controlling the dengue disease. Headed by Khwaja Salman Rafique, the meeting was also attended by the health director general, the special branch DIG, parliamentarians and secretaries of various government departments. The committee said the dengue was quite under control even during the peak season in Punjab due to an effective strategy and better coordination. The meeting was informed that only 11 confirmed dengue cases were reported in the province during the last eight months compared to 44 cases in the same period of 2013. The committee decided to accelerate dengue surveillance activities for eradicating dengue larvae. The special branch DIG presented a report regarding the performance of various departments and institutions and also pointed out shortcomings.

**PAKISTAN:** This year's nationwide polio cases in Pakistan have touched 115 with the confirmation of seven new cases, a media report said. Seven more children in North Waziristan and Khyber provinces tested positive for polio, Dawn online reported, quoting the National Institute of Health (NIH) here. Last year 39 polio cases had been registered by this time, NIH sources said. Of the 115 cases registered this year, 84 are from FATA, 19 from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, 10 from Sindh and one each from Punjab and Baluchistan provinces, the report said.

**KARACHI:** Health Experts on Monday warmly welcomed that launching of a vigorous crackdown against 60,000 quack doctors across Karachi city and constitution of task force for evolving strategy in this regard by Commissioner Karachi. Talking to PPI, President Pakistan Pediatric Association (PPA) Center Prof Dr. Iqbal Memon welcomed the decision of Commissioner Karachi for launching massive crackdown against quack doctors in the city but quickly added that crackdown should be started earlier as medical community had been demanding strict action against phony doctors since long. He said non-qualified doctors were playing with health and lives of citizens since long and silence of authorities concerned in this issue was matter of grave concern. He said quack doctors were posing serious threats to society and illegal practices of non-qualified doctors must be eliminated not only from Karachi but also from other parts of country. Prof Memon said quackery had major contribution to increasing number deaths and raising infections among patients in the society. He said action against non-qualified doctors should be launched with honesty, while circle of action against quacks should also be extended across the country. He suggested the Karachi Metropolitan Corporation (KMC) administration to establish clinics in slums areas of Karachi to ensure better health delivery system in the metropolis. Senior member of Pakistan Medical Association Center Dr. SM Qaiser Sajjad informed that around 650,000 quack doctors were playing with the lives of nation across the country, while 60,000 to 70,000 were involved in this illegal practice in Karachi. He said a special committee was also working under supervision of PMA against quack doctors in the city. He stressed the need for increasing level of registration of doctors in order to root out quackery. He said registration of doctors would help reduce the menace of non-qualified doctors from the country. President PMA Karachi Dr. Idress Edhi stressed the need for implementation of Health Commission Bill to eliminate quack doctors. He said PMA always raised voice for patient rights. He said doctors running clinics and private hospitals without registration should not be allowed to do so. He said accountability of doctors running the clinics and owners of private hospitals should be ensured to protect the patients and doctor rights in the society. It was pertinent to mention here that Commissioner Karachi Shoaib Ahmed Siddiqui had constituted a Task Force to launch vigorous crackdown against quack doctors across the city in a meeting held recently. The task force comprises the representatives of KMC administration, health department officials, PMA and commissioner youth team.

**KARACHI:** President Pakistan Pediatric Association (PPA) Prof Dr Iqbal Memon has said that 60 percent of children are deprived of vaccinations of various diseases like polio and measles in Pakistan every year due to various reasons, and dream of healthy society could not come true till bringing the coverage to 80-85 percent in the country. Memon said significant number of children could be saved from perishing and disability through maximum vaccinations coverage. He said only 40 to 45 percent children had been vaccinated in the country despite many steps taken by government, while the rest of children had been deprived of vaccination due to poor coverage, adverse law and order situation and socio-cultural barriers.

**PAKISTAN:** If you are suffering from chronic pain, it may affect the brain in such a way that it decreases your motivation level even after popping painkillers, says a study. People with chronic pain report feeling fatigue, depression and decreased motivation, Neil Schwartz from Stanford University in California was quoted as saying. The brain's rewiring during chronic pain may stem from the way pain prevents people from further injury, researchers said. "Acute pain is useful because it limits or stops our behavior to prevent further injury, promote healing and prevent a similar injury in the future," Schwartz added. In their study, the researchers gave mice a chocolate-flavored pellet if they poked their noses into a small hole. But it became more difficult over time, requiring dozens of nose pokes for a pellet. The injured mice still liked the reward but the pain decreased their motivation, the findings showed. Even painkillers failed to improve their performance, researcher noted. A signaling chemical called galanin was found to be the link between changes in the brain's circuits and the decreased level of motivation. The researchers also found that some of the nerve cells in the nucleus accumbency, an area of the brain associated with pain and motivation, were not responding properly.

**PESHAWAR:** The campaign is a humanitarian initiative aimed at vaccinating 3.643 million Pakistani children against polio over a period of three months. The UAE's massive campaign to vaccinate three million children under five against poliomyelitis (polio) in Pakistan was successful, the UAE Project to Assist Pakistan (UAE PAP) has announced. The large-scale preventive health initiative, under the slogan "Health for All - Better Future", is being carried out on the directives of



the President, His Highness Shaikh Khalifa bin Zayed Al Nahyan, and comes as part of the initiative of General Shaikh Mohammed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi and Deputy Supreme Commander of the UAE Armed Forces, to eradicate polio in the world.

The campaign is a humanitarian initiative aimed at vaccinating 3.643 million Pakistani children against polio over a period of three months - June, August and September, 2014. General Shaikh Mohammed had previously donated Dh440 million as a contribution in support of the global effort to eradicate polio by 2018, with special focus on Pakistan and Afghanistan. This contribution is the second one to be provided by Shaikh Mohammed for delivering life-saving vaccines to children all over the world. UAE PAP management said that June had seen the vaccination of 3,048,669 children in 23 districts in the province of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and other tribal areas in Pakistan. It said that the overwhelming success of the campaign to reach the three million mark in the first month of the three-month initiative proves the UAE's efforts, under the leadership of Shaikh Khalifa, to deliver its noble, humanitarian goals and improve wellbeing of people and health prevention against diseases and epidemics. UAE PAP also stressed on the leading role the UAE is playing in assisting needy, poor people and supporting international efforts and UN programs to protect communities from diseases and epidemic as well as crises and disasters. "Sheikh Mohamed's initiative is important for Pakistan given the fact that the targeted regions are the world's largest and deeply plagued by polio but indicators of significant success have emerged from the first day of the campaign," UAE PAP noted.

Mobile units have overcome geographical challenges that prevented previous local and international campaigns from reaching these areas, which accounted for 95 per cent of Pakistan's polio cases in the past six months, resulting in wider spread of the disease into other areas. Mobile medical teams have ventured into difficult remote mountainous regions to deliver vaccines. However, the UAE efforts were fruitful thanks to the good planning, perfect field implementation, concerted coordination between the UAE PAP and other stakeholders including command of Pakistani army, local and federal Pakistani health authorities, and the World Health Organization.

Pakistan is one of three countries where polio is still categorized as an endemic viral infection. WHO warned of the polio situation in Pakistan which reported 198 cases in 2011, the highest in ten years, compared to 58 cases in 2012 and 93 in 2013. 99 cases were registered in the first seven months of the current year compared to 24 in the same period last year. The National Institute of Health, Islamabad, has confirmed two new polio cases, one each from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and the Federally Administered Tribal Areas, bringing the nationwide tally to 104 this year so far. Officials said that refusals against oral polio vaccine (OPV) by parents had been a chronic problem as in both the new cases the affected children had not been vaccinated. They said that one-year-old Salma Bibi, daughter of Iqbal Khan, residing in Nasab Colony on Charsadda Road, Peshawar, had not received even a single dose of the OPV. "She has not been administered OPV throughout Sehat ka Insaf program because of her mother's unwillingness," the officials said. According to them, her mother didn't open the door for vaccinators as per her husband's instructions due to which her daughter got crippled. Same is the case of Hafsa, daughter of Khan Jamal, who remained unvaccinated due to her parents' defiance to let OPV administered to their child. The eight-month-old girl child lives in Milward area of Bara tehsil, Khyber Agency, where bulk of the people are under misconception that vaccination was forbidden, the sources said. In both cases, the children have not received even a single dose of OPV. The officials said that in half of the 18 cases recorded by the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa the children hadn't received any dose of OPV due to their parents' refusal. They said that the vaccinators recorded about 50,000 refusals, bulk of which came from Bannu which had nine cases in 2014 so far. The number of refusals against OPV is over 6,000 in Mardan, which has one case this year, according to officials associated with the vaccination campaign. Peshawar with seven cases in 2014 is also faced with serious problem of refusals. There are over 7,000 refusals in Peshawar which has been the main hindrance in the way of polio eradication, the officials said.

The Pakistan Tehreek-i-Insaf-led government ran Sehat Ka Insaf program in February this year under which over 800,000 children in the district were administered vaccines 12 times on weekly basis. Later, the program was extended to Charsadda, Mardan and Swabi to protect children against vaccine-preventable crippling childhood ailments, including polio. However, relevant officials say that there is no chance of eradicating polio in the province as long as the refusals exist. Lakki Marwat has one case this year, but there are 5,000 refusals, the officials said. The children missed in every campaign also pose a serious threat to the government's efforts to do away with the disease. Despite the health department's efforts to vaccinate five million children the number of refusals and missed children are the chronic issues to be addressed as soon as possible if the province is to be purged of polio, they said. The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa has also been at the receiving end of the polio transmission from Fata, which has recorded 76 cases this year. They include 57 cases from North Waziristan Agency, 10 Khyber Agency, seven South Waziristan Agency and two from Frontier Region, Bannu. With the displacement of people from North Waziristan where children have not been vaccinated since June 2012 due to Taliban's ban on vaccination, the situation has aggravated because all those unvaccinated children now live in Bannu and other parts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

**ISLAMABAD:** The Environment Protection Agency (EPA), under its ongoing anti-dengue drive, have inspected 183 sites in different localities of the city during last six days and declared them clear of dengue larva. EPA teams visited 99 tire shops, 72 junkyards and go-downs, six nurseries and six under construction sites in Gawalmandi, Chaklala, Dhoke Ali Akbar, Farooq-e-Azam Road, Asghar Mall and Kuri Road for inspection and prevention of lethal dengue mosquito's possible brought-up in the monsoon season, District Environment Officer Mian Muhammad Nawaz told APP here Friday. Although, he said, the EPA teams found no dengue larva during the inspection, but all preventive measures were being taken to keep the surroundings clear of

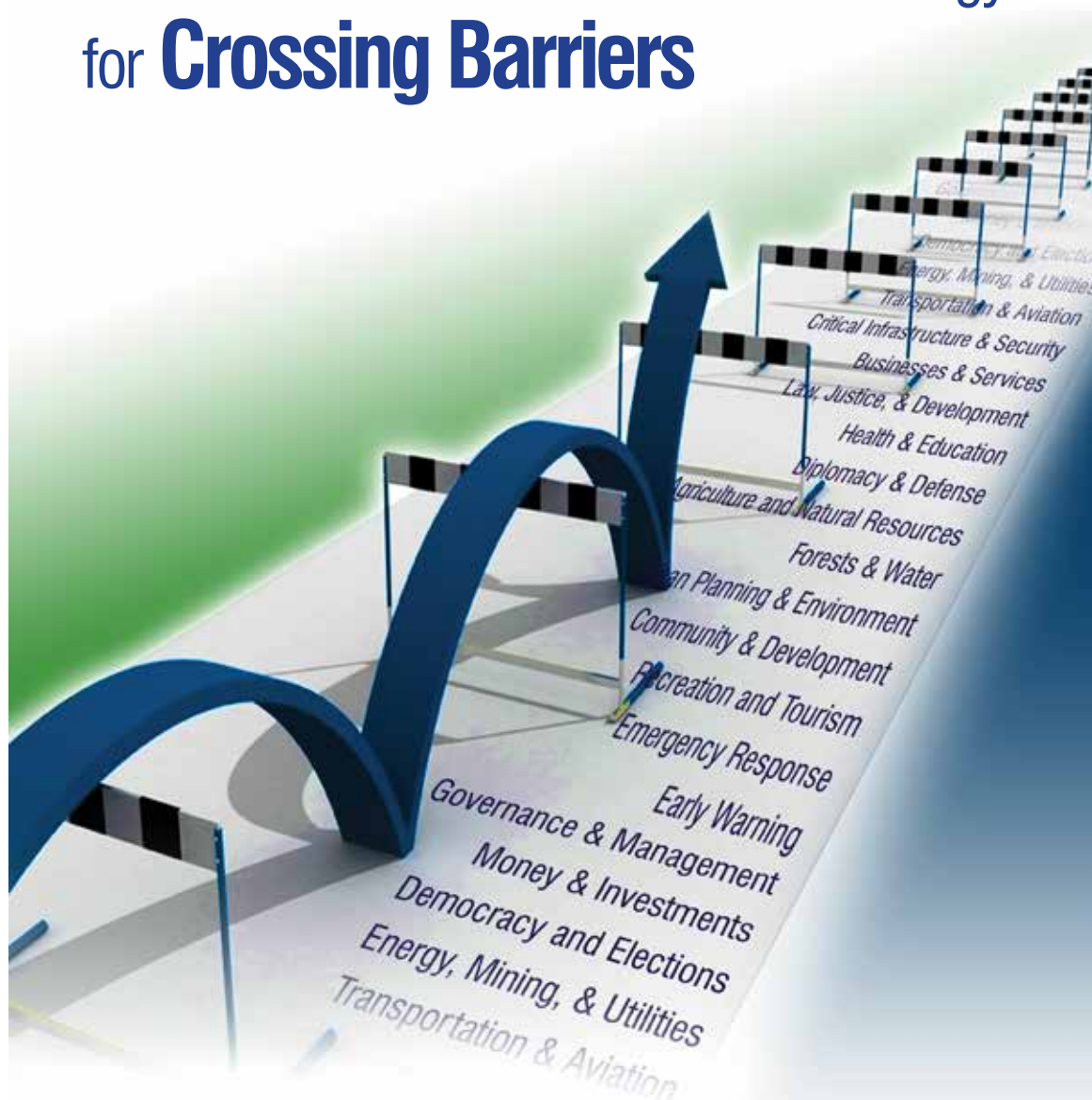

dengue mosquito.

Seven new WPV1 cases were reported in the past week, all from Federally Administered Tribal Areas (FATA), from North Waziristan, South Waziristan and Khyber, bringing the total number of WPV1 cases for 2014 to 115. One of the newly reported cases from North Waziristan is the most recent WPV1 case in the country, with onset of paralysis on 27 July. No new cVDPV2 cases were reported in the past week. The country has reported 16 cases of cVDPV2 to date in 2014 and the most recent case had onset of paralysis on 27 May in FR Bannu, FATA. Immunization activities are continuing with particular focus on known high-risk areas.

The health of IDPs is at a high risk due to overcrowding, poor living conditions, insecurity, psychosocial distress and exposure to new environment and risk factors. Low routine vaccination coverage is another concern (WHO 14/07/2014).

- **Communicable diseases:** A rapid health needs assessment conducted in Bannu district, KP, revealed that the most prevalent disease reported is diarrhea (52%). The lowest is measles (5%). Cough/cold/fever and malaria were at 47% and 43%, respectively (Health Cluster 22/07/2014). There is a dire need for diarrhea treatment centres (WHO 14/07/2014; OCHA 07/08/2014).
- **Chronic diseases:** The prevalence of skin diseases was reported at 19%, and other diseases such as hepatitis, hypertension, tuberculosis, and diabetes were reported at 7% (Health Cluster 22/07/2014). There are no health actors present on the ground (OCHA 07/08/2014). Health facilities are overburdened and need human resource support, medicines, and supplies (OCHA 07/08/2014). As of July, stocks of medicines covered less than 5% of the estimated displaced population (WHO, 17/07/2014).
- More support is required to strengthen reproductive health interventions, especially in Bannu district, including RH kits, gynecologists, anesthetists, female doctors and nurses, laboratory staff, etc. (ECHO 01/08/2014). WHO reported that 4% of the displaced are pregnant and those in Bannu need immediate medical attention (DAWN, 18/07/2014).
- **CCHF:** A seasonal spike of Crimean-Congo hemorrhagic fever (CCHF) has recently been detected. As of 30 July, 54 cases, including 17 deaths, were reported, most in KP and Baluchistan. CCHF is endemic in Pakistan (WHO 30/07/2014).
- **Polio:** As of late July, more than 90% (96/108) of polio cases in 2014 have been reported from KP (19/108) and FATA (77/108) (Government and WHO 31/07/2014, WHO 09/08/2014). Lack of staff and proper coordination between the KP health department and administrations of southern districts is hampering the immunisation of displaced children arriving from NWA. Officials have stated that all children coming from NWA should be vaccinated on arrival (UNICEF 28/07/2014, DEWS 30/07/2014, DAWN 23/06/2014).

- **CCHF:** During this week, 4 suspected CCHF cases with 2 deaths have been reported from Baluchistan province.
- In this week, 81 out of 87 districts and 2,945 out of 3,590 health facilities have reported to Disease Early Warning System (DEWS), compared to 82 districts with 2,437 health facilities shared weekly data in week 31, 2014.
- A total of 1,288,459 patient's consultations reported in this week 32, 2014.
- In this week, a total of 50 alerts generated and timely responded. Altogether 21 alerts were for Measles; 9 for Leishmaniasis; 8 for CCHF; 2 each for H1N1, AWD and NNT; while 1 each for AJS, Dengue fever, Diphtheria, Pertussis, Typhoid fever and Scabies.

Crimean Congo Hemorrhagic Fever (CCHF) cases are reported continuously from epidemiological week 8, 2014. So far total 68 suspected cases, 25 laboratory confirmed, and 20 deaths (of these 11 laboratory confirmed) have been reported. Most of the cases are from

Baluchistan province 31 suspected (11 cases belongs to Afghanistan), 9 Laboratory confirmed and 5 deaths. 21 suspected, 11 Laboratory confirmed (6 from Afghanistan) and 8 deaths (6 Lab confirmed) were reported from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province. 3 suspected cases (1 from Afghanistan), 2 Laboratory confirmed and 2 deaths were reported from Islamabad. 12 suspected CCHF cases (4 Laboratory confirmed), 4 deaths were reported from Punjab province. While 1 suspected case was from district Sudhnuti (AJK) and was negative for CCHF.

The CCHF cases from Afghanistan are detected and reported from Quetta and Peshawar because the patients are referred for treatment (mostly self-referrals) to the Tertiary Care hospitals in both these cities. The list of CCHF cases with addresses shared with concerned person at the Ministry of Public Health Afghanistan for preventive measures at community level.

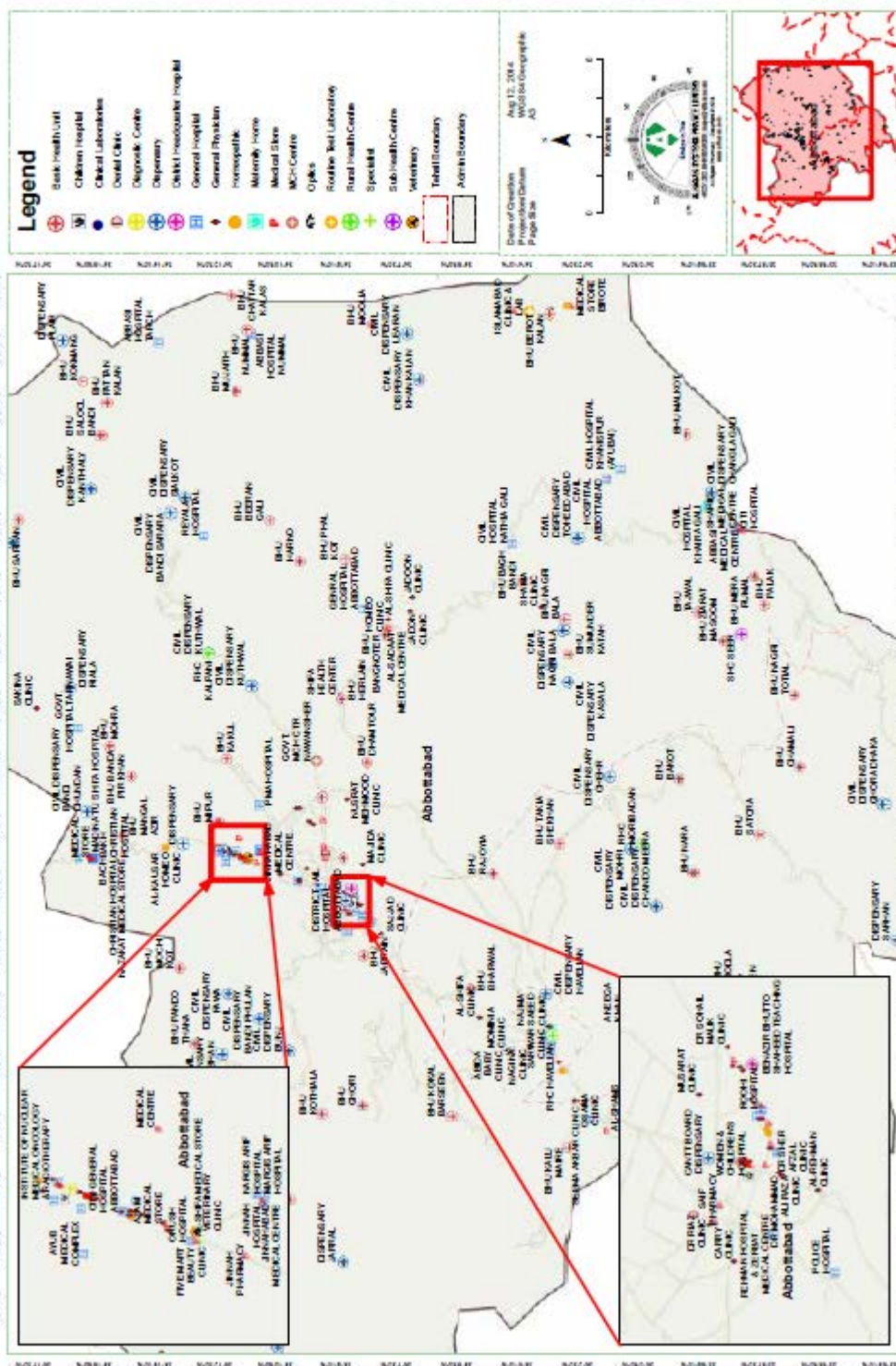

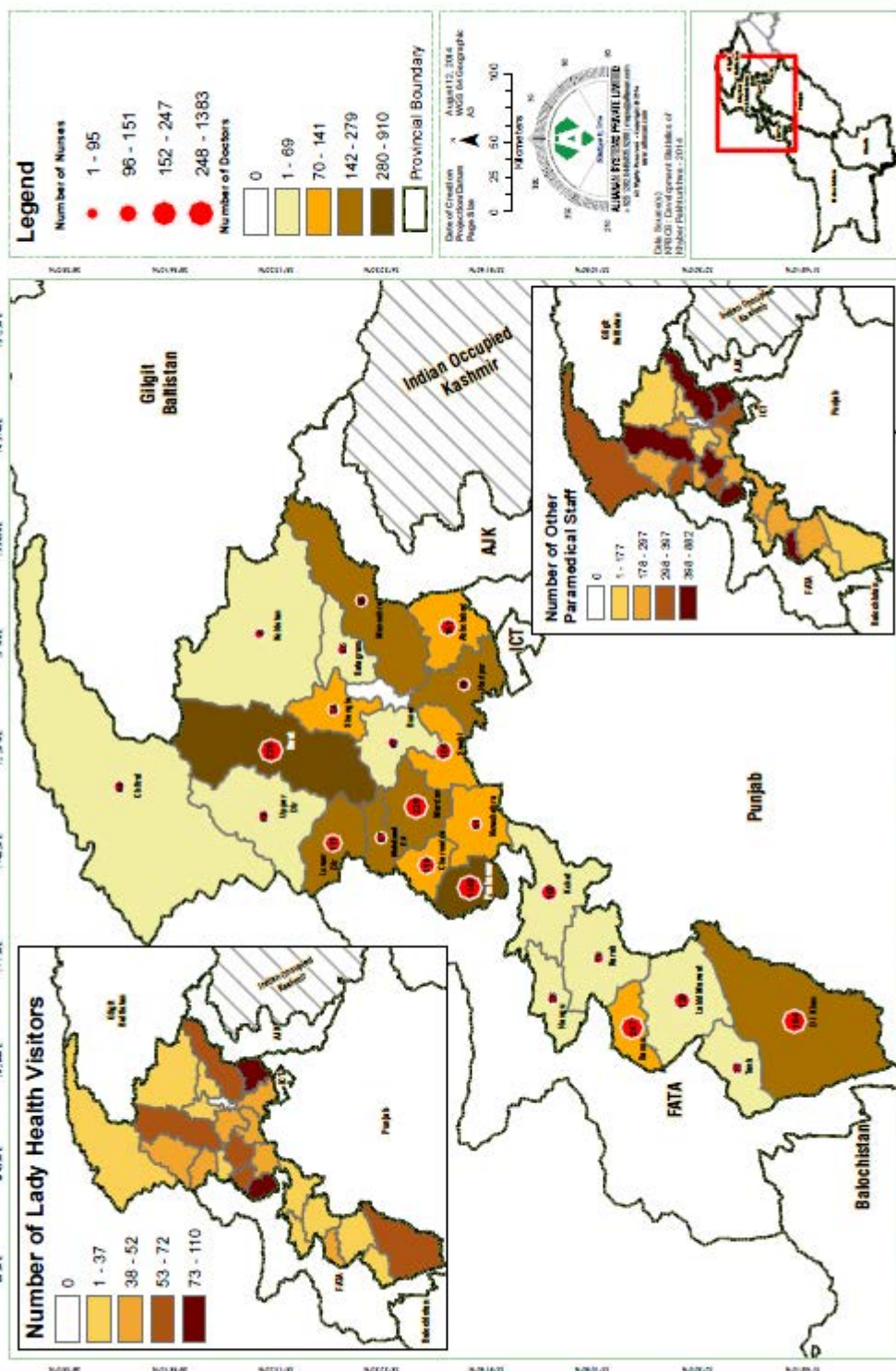

## Need for precaution

Shortage of funds and lack of cohesion between the Karachi administration and the Sindh government has raised concerns about the effectiveness of dengue control efforts in the city. As reported in this paper, the Karachi Metropolitan Corporation has failed to carry out citywide fumigation to neutralize the mosquitoes that transmit dengue, while the administration has also failed to keep an eye on tire shops. Such establishments are known breeding grounds of dengue-carrying mosquitoes, as is fresh water. The authorities cannot afford to be complacent as there were over 30 dengue-related deaths in Sindh last year, while over 6,000 people tested positive for the ailment, the vast majority of them in Karachi.

Apart from the dengue threat, the metropolis has also witnessed at least eight deaths caused by *Naegleria fowleri*, more commonly known as the 'brain-eating amoeba', over the past three months. The dangerous amoeba, found in warm, fresh water, usually proves fatal if water containing it enters the nasal cavity. What is needed from the provincial and civic authorities is

a robust response to both of these public health threats. In the case of dengue, the methods successfully employed by the Punjab government can be replicated. After all, while a few dengue cases have been detected in Punjab this year, the number of dengue victims is nowhere near the levels of previous years, which saw a high number of fatalities. This is mainly because the Punjab administration has been carrying out a proactive vector-control campaign while doctors in the province are also now better trained to effectively treat dengue. The Sindh authorities need to launch an effective campaign against dengue now, before the threat balloons. Where *Naegleria fowleri* is concerned, the Karachi Water and Sewerage Board need to ensure proper chlorination of water, as this can neutralize the threat. One figure suggests up to 40pc of Karachi's water is not properly chlorinated.

Equally important are awareness campaigns in the media advising citizens about precautions to take against dengue and the hazardous amoeba.

## Anti-polio drive faltering

Efforts to eradicate polio from Pakistan have been dealt yet another blow at a time when fresh cases from all over the country are creating fear. All the campaigns conducted over the years have depended on mostly female vaccinators and Lady Health Workers (LHW's) to administer the drops. They are poorly paid for what has become dangerous work and dozens have been killed by those that oppose the vaccination drives. It is now reported that LHW's who were due to carry out the latest drive are boycotting the campaign on the reasonable grounds that they have not been paid for the past three months. Furthermore, about 300,000 children in North and South Waziristan and parts of the Khyber Agency are going to miss their drops because of the poor security situation. The boycott means that the 2.8 million children who were the target group may miss being vaccinated, but the LHW's are adamant they will not begin work unless they are paid.

There are 16,300 vaccinators, most of them from poor families. They are dependent on their meager salaries to

feed their families; and they rightly point out that they can hardly be expected to care for the children of others when they cannot feed their own. Considering that the number of cases of polio reported this year in Pakistan far exceeds that of last year and 85 of the 117 reported cases were from the Federally Administered Tribal Areas, it is grossly incompetent of the administration to delay the pay of the very people who are in the front line of the battle for its eradication. If you do not pay your troops in the end they will mutiny, and that is precisely what the LHW's have done. Eradicating polio appears ever further from the national grasp, and it is occurrences such as this which are entirely the making of the local and provincial administrations, that are going to prolong the persistence of this crippling and preventable disease in Pakistan. It is an abdication of collective civic responsibility to the detriment of the children of the nation, to say nothing of its effect on our international standing. Pay the LHW's what they are owed and get the anti-polio campaign back on track.

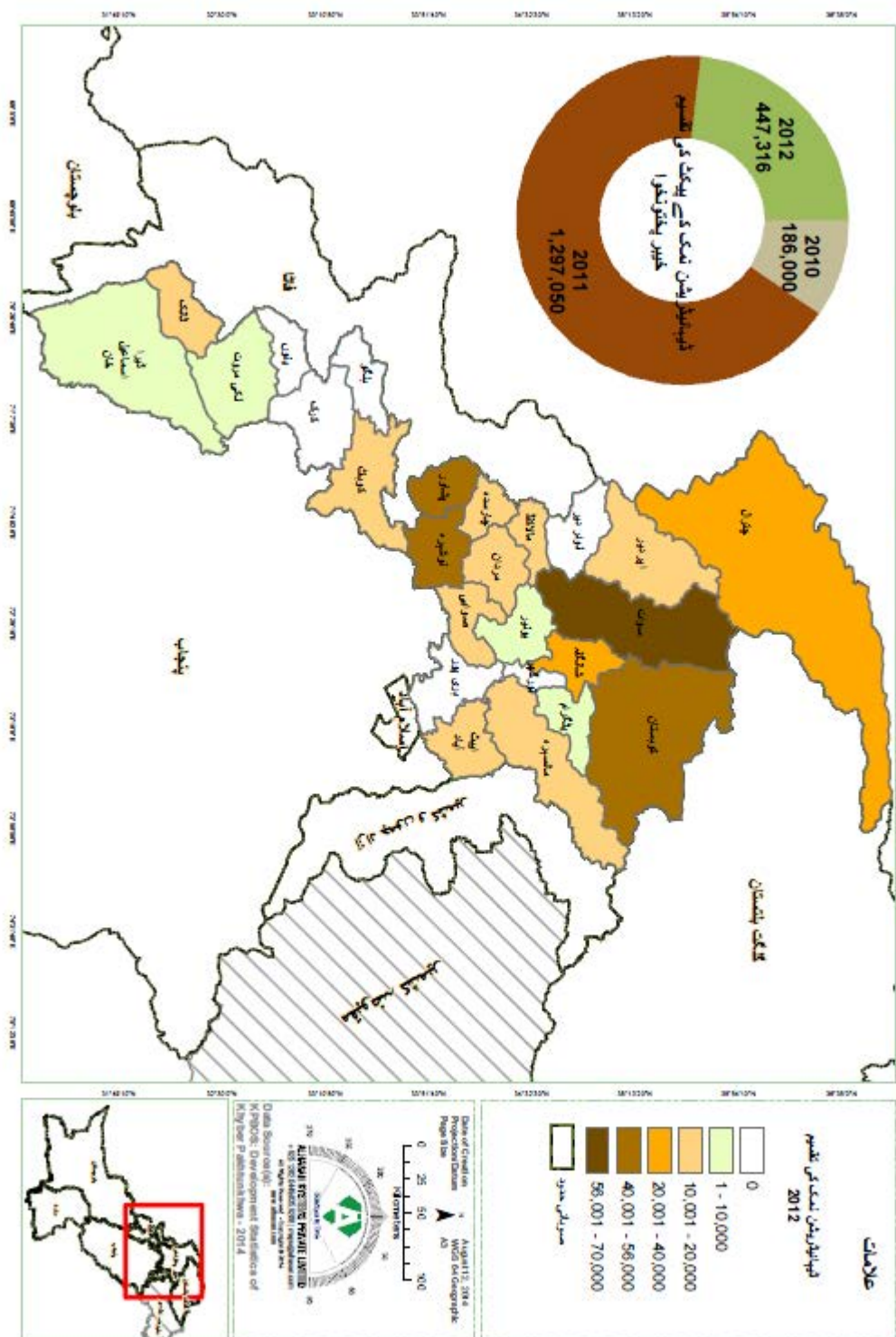


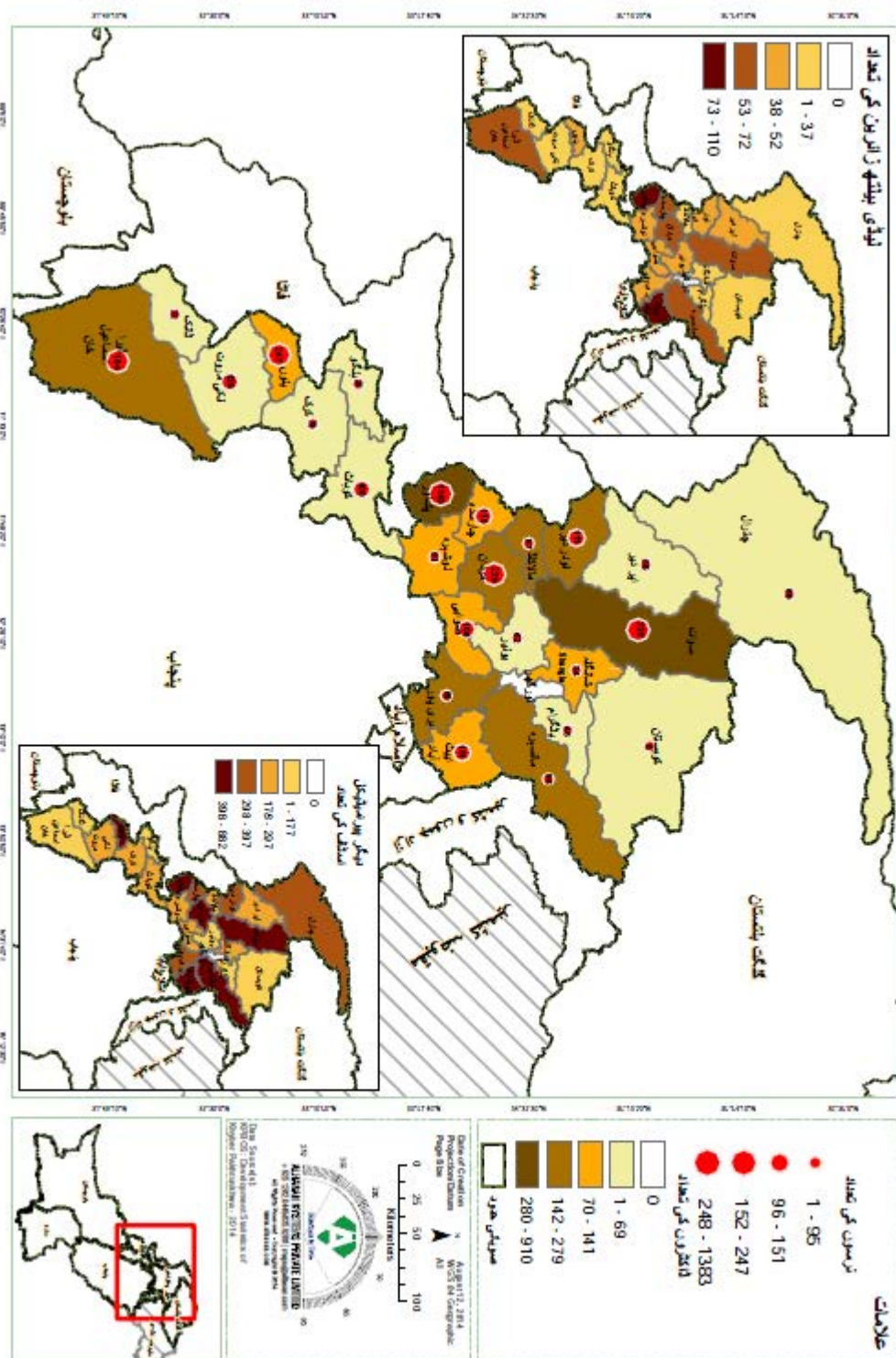

کراچی (اسٹاف رپورٹر) دنیا بھر میں ایک ارب سے زائد افراد فشار خون کا شکار ہیں اور دس سال بعد یہ تعداد 5 ارب سے تجاوز کر جائے گی۔ بلند فشار خون اسٹروک، ذیابیطس اور دل کے امراض کا باعث بنتے ہیں۔ ان خیالات کا اظہار ڈاکٹر فریال طارق نے ہائی بلڈ پریشر اور ذیابیطس تشخیص اور علاج کے موضوع پر سیمینار سے خطاب کرتے ہوئے کیا۔ اس موقع پر مہمان خصوصی نوید کامل، وقار الدین عارف، ڈاکٹر طالب چوہدری، ڈاکٹر شاد عیسیٰ، شاہد احمد خان، حنا بتول، ڈاکٹر مزل یار خان، ڈاکٹر صبیحہ عیسیٰ، ڈاکٹر نہال عیسیٰ، ڈاکٹر فرقان، عبدالرحیم، ڈاکٹر فرحان عیسیٰ اور دیگر بھی موجود تھے۔ انہوں نے کہا کہ دنیا بھر میں 70 لاکھ افراد حرکت قلب بند ہونے کے باعث انتقال کر جاتے ہیں اور 50 سے 60 لاکھ افراد اسٹروک کے مرض میں مبتلا ہو جاتے ہیں۔ پاکستان کی 18 فیصد آبادی بلند فشار خون کی کسی نہ کسی حد تک شکار ہے جس میں سے مرض 97 فیصد آبادی انتہائی نوعیت کے بلند فشار خون میں مبتلا ہے جو قابو سے باہر ہے۔ انہوں نے کہا کہ شہروں میں رہنے والی 45 سے 55 سال کی عمر کی خواتین کی اکثریت بلند فشار خون کے مرض میں مبتلا ہیں بچوں میں بلند فشار خون گردوں، غدود کی بیماری یا کسی خاص وجہ کے سبب ہوتا ہے۔ تاہم ان بیماریوں کے علاج کے بعد بچوں میں بلند فشار خون کا مرض خود بخود ٹھیک ہو جاتا ہے۔ 40 سال کی عمر تک کے افراد میں بلڈ پریشر زیادہ ہو تو گردوں کا فنکشن ضرور چیک کریں۔ 70 سے 80 فیصد تک افراد گردوں کی چند بیماریوں کی وجہ سے بلند فشار خون کا شکار ہو جاتے ہیں۔ انہوں نے مزید بتایا کہ ذیابیطس پوری دنیا کیلئے ایک مسئلہ کی صورت اختیار کر گیا ہے۔ پاکستان میں تقریباً 70 لاکھ کے قریب افراد اس مرض کا شکار ہیں۔ طرز زندگی تبدیل نہ کرنے اور باقاعدگی سے علاج نہ ہونے کے سبب یہ مسئلہ مسلسل پھیل رہا ہے اگر یہی صورتحال رہی تو 2030 تک یہ تعداد 43 کروڑ 80 لاکھ ہو جائے گی بدلتی ہوئی طرز زندگی وزن ورزش کا فقدان کے باعث یہ تیزی سے پھیل رہا ہے اس میں خون میں گلوکوز کی تعداد نارمل سے ہٹ کر بڑھ جاتی ہے جسم میں انسولین نامی ہارمون کی کمی ہو جاتی ہے جس کی مقدار میں انسولین بن رہی ہوتی ہے اس کا اثر جسم کے خلیوں پر نہیں پڑتا۔ ترقی پذیر ممالک میں 12 سے 20 فیصد بالغ آبادی ذیابیطس میں مبتلا ہے پاکستان دنیا میں اس مرض میں مبتلا ہونے والوں میں سات ویں نمبر پر ہے، سیمینار کے اختتام پر مہمان خصوصی اور ڈاکٹرز کو شیلڈ پیش کی گئی ہے۔

## ڈینگی سرویلنس سیل فعال ہونے کے امکانات معدوم ہو گئے

کراچی (سید محمد عسکری، اسٹاف رپورٹر) صوبائی حکومت کی عدم توجہ کی وجہ سے ڈینگی سرویلنس سیل کو اس سال بھی فنڈز جاری نہیں ہو سکے ہیں جس کی وجہ سے ڈینگی سرویلنس سیل کے فعال ہونے کے امکانات معدوم ہو گئے ہیں۔ ذرائع کے مطابق گزشتہ سال صوبائی حکومت نے ڈینگی سرویلنس سیل کو 42 ملین روپے کی رقم جاری کرنی تھی مگر وہ جاری نہ ہو سکی مگر اس کے باوجود سیل کام کرتا رہا لیکن رواں سال بجٹ میں سیل کیلئے 500 ملین روپے رکھے گئے تھے جو تاحال جاری نہیں کئے گئے ہیں اس سلسلے میں محکمہ صحت نے پی سی ون بھی تیار کیا تھا جس میں 4 مہینے کا ابتدائی منصوبہ بنایا گیا تھا۔ پی سی ون کے مطابق یکم اپریل کو سیل کو فعال ہونا تھا مگر تاحال یہ فعال نہیں ہو سکا ہے جبکہ اگست کا آغاز ہو چکا ہے اور اس مہینے ڈینگی کے مریضوں میں اضافہ ہو جتا ہے اور انہیں پلیٹ لٹس کی ضرورت بھی پڑتی ہے۔ ذرائع کے مطابق چند ماہ کے دوران 100 سے زائد کیسز ڈینگی کے رپورٹ بھی ہو چکے ہیں تاہم سیل فعال نہ ہونے کی وجہ سے اعداد و شمار جاری نہیں ہو سکے نہ ہی ہلاک ہونے والے کی تفصیلات مل سکیں۔

کراچی (بابر اعوان / اسٹاف رپورٹر) عباسی شہید اسپتال میں صفائی کی حالت دگرگوں، جا بجا کچرا پڑا ہونے کے باعث مریضوں اور تیمارداروں کو شدید پریشانی کا سامنا، اسپتال کے مرکزی دروازے سے متصل سڑک سیوریج کے گندے پانی سے بھری ہوئی ہے۔ دیواریں سیاسی جماعتوں کے پوسٹرز، کڑی کے جالوں اور پان، گنگے کے نشانات کے باعث گندی ہو رہی ہیں۔ فرش پر ڈسپوزبل گلیوز، سرنجیں، اشیائے خوردونوش کے ٹیکس، جوس کے ڈبے، دواؤں کی پرچیاں، سگریٹ کے ٹیکس اور دیگر اشیاء بکھری رہتی ہیں جبکہ فرش پر پان گنگے کے نشانات بھی ہیں لیکن ان کی صفائی کے لئے کوئی اقدامات نہیں کیے جارہے ہیں۔ جس کے باعث مریضوں، ان کے ہمراہ آئے تیمارداروں اور ڈاکٹرز کو بھی پریشانی کا سامنا کرنا پڑتا ہے تفصیلات کے مطابق شہر کے تیسرے بڑے سرکاری اسپتال عباسی شہید میں صفائی کی حالت ناگفتہ بہ ہے۔ دیواریں سے رنگ اکھڑ رہا ہے پیشتر کھڑکیاں ٹوٹی ہوئی ہیں دروازے خستہ حالی کا شکار ہیں۔ فرش پر جا بجا پان گنگے کے نشانات اور کچرا بکھرا رہتا ہے۔ جبکہ مرکزی عمارت میں جا بجا کچرا بکھرا رہتا ہے جس کو صاف نہیں کیا جا رہا۔ ایم ایس عباسی شہید اسپتال ڈاکٹر مشہود الظفر فاروق کا اس سلسلے میں کہنا ہے کہ ہمارے پاس سوپرز کی کمی ہے اس سے قبل ہمارے پاس 120 سوپرز تھے لیکن اب صرف 60 سوپرز رہ گئے ہیں شہر کے دیگر علاقوں کی طرح اسپتال میں بھی پانی کا شدید بحران ہے جس کے باعث بھی گندی رہتی ہے اور ہمارے پاس فنڈز کی بھی کمی ہے جس کے باعث یہ صورتحال پیدا ہوئی ہے اس کے علاوہ لوگوں کو بھی چاہیے کہ وہ صفائی کا خیال رکھیں لوگ اپنے گھروں میں پان لگا کھا کر نہیں پھینکتے لیکن اسپتال کے فرش کو گندا کر دیتے ہیں ان کا کہنا تھا کہ میں نے عید کا بعد چارج سنبھالا ہے اور تمام معاملات کو دیکھ رہا ہوں عنقریب تمام مسائل کو حل کر دیں گے۔

بالا (نامہ نگار) میڈی پینلز پارٹی کے رہنما سید علی حسن شاہ کی جانب سے لگائے گئے مفت طبی کیپ میں 200 سے زائد مریضوں کا علاج کیا گیا۔ ڈاکٹر زاہد، عبید اللہ، ظہیر میمن، نظام الدین اور دیگر ماہر ڈاکٹروں نے مختلف امراض میں مبتلا مریضوں کا علاج کیا اور دوائیں دیں۔

بدین (محمد حنیف ذی / نامہ نگار) فنڈز کی عدم دستیابی کے باعث بدین کے مثالی تھیلیسیما سینٹر میں زیر علاج سینکڑوں معصوم بچوں کی زندگیاں دانو پہ لگ گئیں سندھ حکومت سینٹر کو ہر سال دو کروڑ روپے بجٹ جاری کرتی تھی مگر حالیہ بجٹ میں ایک روپیہ بھی نہ رکھا گیا ہے صورتحال کے سبب سینٹر کی بندش کا خدشہ بھی پیدا ہو گیا ہے۔ سندھ حکومت نے حالیہ بجٹ میں بدین کے تھیلیسیما سینٹر کے بجٹ رکھنا ہی مناسب نہ سمجھا ہے حکومت کی جانب سے ہر سال سینٹر کو دو کروڑ روپے کا بجٹ جاری کیا جاتا تھا جو سینٹر میں زیر علاج بچوں کی ادویات کی خریداری اور ملازمین کی تنخواہوں میں استعمال کیا جاتا تھا مگر حالیہ بجٹ میں سندھ حکومت نے حیرت انگیز طور پر سینٹر کے لئے دو کروڑ کی بجائے ایک روپیہ بھی بجٹ میں نہ رکھا ہے جس کے نتیجے میں سینٹر میں زیر علاج سینکڑوں مریض بچوں کی زندگیاں بھی دانو پہ لگ گئی ہیں تھیلیسیما سینٹر کی انتظامیہ کے مطابق سینٹر میں 501 تھیلیسیما زدہ اور 60 سکل سیل لیبیسیا کے مریض بچے زیر علاج ہیں جن کے علاج معالجے پر تقریباً چالیس سے پچاس ہزار روپے ماہانہ اخراجات آتے ہیں اور ان تمام سینکڑوں بچوں کو سینٹر میں علاج کی مفت سہولت فراہم کی جاتی ہے مگر سندھ حکومت کی جانب سے اس سال ان بچوں کے علاج کے لئے جاری کئے جانے والے تمام فنڈز کا جاری نہ کیا جانا لمحہ فکریہ ہے جس کے منفی نتائج مریض بچوں پر اثر انداز ہونگے اور انکا علاج معالجہ متاثر ہو گا جن سے انکی زندگیاں کا سنگین خطرات لاحق ہو سکتے ہیں انہوں نے بتایا کہ سینٹر میں نہ صرف بدین بلکہ ٹھٹھہ تھر پارکر عمرکوٹ ٹنڈو محمد خان ٹنڈو الہیار اور دیگر اضلاع کے مریض بچے علاج معالجے کے لئے لائے جاتے ہیں جن کا بالکل مفت علاج کیا جاتا ہے جو فنڈز کی عدم دستیابی سے ناممکن ہو جائے گا انہوں نے بتایا کہ فنڈز کی عدم فراہمی کے سبب سینٹر میں کام کرنے والے چھپیس ملازمین کو بھی گزشتہ ماہ کی تنخواہیں نہ مل سکی ہیں۔ سندھ حکومت کی جانب سے تھیلیسیما سینٹر کو فنڈز کی عدم فراہمی پہ ضلع کے سماجی و عوامی حلقوں نے بھی تشویش کا اظہار کرتے ہوئے کہا ہے کہ تھیلیسیما سینٹر بدین نہ صرف سندھ بلکہ ملک کا مثالی سرکاری ادارہ ہے اور تھیلیسیما زدہ بچوں کے علاج کے لئے مثالی خدمات کے باوجود اسے نظر انداز کرنا غریب مریضوں اور انکے اہل خانہ پہ ظلم کے مترادف ہے انہوں نے پی پی پی کے شریک چیرمین آصف زرداری اور چیرمین بلاول بھٹو زرداری سے اس ضمن میں اپیل کی کہ وہ سندھ حکومت کے اس ظالمانہ عمل کا فوری طور پر نوٹس لیں اور فنڈز کی فوری فراہمی کو یقینی بنا کر سینکڑوں غریب بچوں کی زندگیاں بچائی جائیں۔

اسپیشل ایکس رے، بیریم سولیو، بیریم میل، آئی وی پی، آئی وی یو اور دیگر تمام قسم کے کریڈیکل ایکس رے کیے جاتے ہیں جسم میں کوئی غدود یا خون کے بہاؤ میں رکاوٹ ہو تو تشخیص کے لئے اس مشین کے ذریعے ایکس رے کیے جاتے ہیں۔ لیکن یہ مشین 2010 سے خراب پڑی ہے جس کو ٹھیک کرانے کے لئے کوئی موثر اقدامات نہیں کیے جا رہے ہیں جس کے باعث مریضوں کو شدید پریشانی کا سامنا کرنا پڑ رہا ہے اگرچہ اس مشین کا متبادل موجود ہے لیکن یہ مشین جدید ہے جس میں کم وقت میں زیادہ ایکس رے ہو جاتے ہیں جبکہ دیگر مشینوں میں دگنا وقت لگتا ہے جس کے باعث مریضوں کو بہت انتظار کرنا پڑتا ہے اکثر و بیشتر انہیں واپس گھر بھیج دیا جاتا ہے اور اگلے دن بلایا جاتا ہے اس تمام صورتحال سے مریض سخت نالاں رہتے ہیں اس سلسلے میں انچارج شعبہ ریڈیالوجی ڈاکٹر طارق محمود کا کہنا تھا کہ یہ بات درست نہیں کہ یہ مشین 2010 سے خراب ہے اس مشین کو متعدد بار ٹھیک کرا چکے ہیں لیکن یہاں بجلی کا مسئلہ رہتا ہے اس عمارت میں 50 سال قبل وائرنگ ہوئی ہے پھر پانی کا رساؤ بھی رہتا ہے جس کے باعث آئے دن یہ مشین خراب ہو جاتی ہے ہم نے شعبہ ریڈیالوجی کے لئے نئی عمارت تعمیر کرائی ہے اور اب اس مشین کو اسی عمارت میں تنصیب کیا جائے گا جس کے بعد اس کی خرابی کا مسئلہ حل ہو جائے گا۔ امید ہے کہ نئی عمارت میں شعبہ ریڈیالوجی اسی سال کے ماہ اکتوبر میں فعال ہو جائے گا۔

کراچی (بابر اعوان / اسٹاف رپورٹر) عباسی شہید اسپتال میں سیکورٹی کے ناقص انتظامات کے باعث ڈاکٹرز اور پیرا میڈیکل اسٹاف عدم تحفظ کا شکار ہے۔ ڈاکٹروں کو سیاسی و مذہبی جماعتوں کے کارکنوں، مشتعل اور بااثر افراد کی جانب سے زدوکوب کیا جاتا ہے۔ اکثر و بیشتر لیڈی ڈاکٹروں پر بھی تشدد کیا جاتا ہے۔ تفصیلات کے مطابق عباسی شہید اسپتال شہر کا تیسرا بڑا سرکاری اسپتال ہے جہاں بڑی تعداد میں شہری علاج کیلئے آتے ہیں جبکہ شہر میں جاری امن وامان کی غیر تسلی بخش صورتحال کے باعث فائرنگ اور دیگر واقعات میں ہلاک و زخمی ہونے والے افراد کو بھی بڑی تعداد میں یہاں لایا جاتا ہے، اس دوران زخمیوں اور لاشوں کے ہمراہ ان کے عزیز واقارب اور سیاسی و مذہبی جماعتوں سے وابستہ کارکنان بھی آتے ہیں جو اپنے عزیزوں اور رفقاء کی ہلاکت پر اشتعال میں آکر ڈاکٹروں اور دیگر عملے کو تشدد کا نشانہ بناتے ہیں۔ عباسی شہید اسپتال میں یہ صورتحال معمول بن گئی ہے جس پر بالخصوص ڈاکٹر خوفزدہ اور عدم تحفظ کا شکار رہتے ہیں۔ ایک ڈاکٹر نے نام نہ بتانے کی شرط پر جنگ کو بتایا کہ جب کبھی اسپتال میں کسی سیاسی یا مذہبی جماعت کا کارکن دم توڑ جاتا ہے تو ڈاکٹرز سہم جاتے ہیں کیونکہ اس کے بعد مشتعل کارکن یا ان کے ہمراہ آئے عزیز واقارب ڈاکٹروں کو تشدد کا نشانہ بناتے ہیں۔ ایک مرتبہ سیاسی جماعت کے کارکنان کے مشتعل ہونے پر کچھ ڈاکٹر خوفزدہ ہو کر دیواریں بھلانگ کر دوسرے وارڈز کی طرف بھاگے اور گرنے کے باعث ایک ڈاکٹر کی ٹانگ بھی ٹوٹ گئی۔ انہوں نے بتایا کہ ڈاکٹرز اس سلسلے میں میڈیا سے بھی ناراض دکھائی دیتے ہیں کہ جب ڈاکٹروں پر تشدد کیا جاتا ہے تو میڈیا چپ سادھ لیتا ہے۔ ذرائع کے مطابق اسپتال انتظامیہ کی جانب سے متعدد بار اس سلسلے میں شکایات بھی درج کرائی گئی ہیں اور اعلیٰ حکام سے مطالبہ بھی کیا گیا کہ اسپتال میں ریجنرز کو تعینات کیا جائے مگر تاحال اس سلسلے میں کوئی پیش رفت نہیں ہوئی۔ اسپتال کے ڈاکٹروں کا مطالبہ ہے کہ اسپتال میں ریجنرز کو تعینات کیا جائے تاکہ اس طرح کی صورتحال پیش نہ آئے۔ اس سلسلے میں ایم ایس عباسی شہید اسپتال ڈاکٹر مشہود الظفر فاروق سے متعدد بار رابطہ کرنے کی کوشش کی گئی مگر ان سے رابطہ نہ ہو سکا ان کے موبائل پر ایم ایس بھی کیے گئے مگر کوئی جواب موصول نہیں ہوا۔

کراچی (رپورٹ: جاوید رشید) بھارتی وزارت صحت کے حکام نے فلپائن، سری لنکا، ملیشیا، سنگاپور، نیپال، تھائی لینڈ کے 1720 ایڈز کے مریضوں کو تلاش کر کے جمعہ کے روز بذریعہ طیارے ان کے ممالک بھجوا دیا ہے۔ ”جنگ“ کو اپنے رابطے سے معلوم ہوا ہے کہ ان چھ ممالک لوگ قانونی طور سے بھارت کے مختلف شہروں میں کافی عرصہ سے قیام پذیر تھے۔ گزشتہ ماہ جولائی 2014ء میں وزیر صحت ڈاکٹر ہریش وردھن کی خصوصی ہدایت پر ایڈز کے مریضوں کے حوالے سے علاج معالجہ کی سہولتوں کا حکم نامہ وزارت صحت کو حکام کو ملا تھا۔ ساتھ ہی وزیر صحت نے لکھا تھا کہ غیر ملکی ایڈز کے مریضوں کو جانچ کر کے فوری ان کے ملکوں کو بھجوا دیا جائے۔ یہ بھی معلوم ہوا ہے کہ تمام بھارتی ایڈز پورٹس پر مختلف ٹیسٹوں کے ساتھ اب ایڈز کی جانچ کرنے کی بھی سہولتیں فراہم کی گئی ہیں۔ ایڈز کے غیر ملکی مریضوں کو صرف علاج کرانے کی حد تک میں رکھا جاسکتا ہے۔ سیاحت کے لیے آنے والے ایسے افراد کو فوری واپس کردینے کا حکم نامہ جاری کیا گیا ہے۔ بھارت میں 88 ہزار افراد ملکی، غیر ملکی ایڈز کے امراض میں مبتلا ہیں۔ خصوصاً پیشہ ور جنسی کاروبار کرنے والے مرد، خواتین میں یہ مرض زیادہ پایا جاتا ہے۔ دہلی ان دنوں ایڈز کے امراض کے مریضوں کی بھرمار ہے۔ وزارت صحت نے اس حوالے سے ایک ہنگامی آپریشنل طبی کیپ قائم کر دیا ہے۔ جس کا دائرہ دہلی کے دونوں بڑے ایڈز پورٹس تک بڑھا دیا

عباسی شہید اسپتال میں سیکورٹی کے ناقص انتظامات، ڈاکٹرز اور پیرا میڈیکل اسٹاف کو عدم تحفظ کی شکایت

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بھارت، ایڈز کے 1720 غیر ملکی مریضوں کو واپس بھجوا دیا گیا

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معاندے کے تحت ایک کمپنی کے سپرد کیا گیا ہے اور معاندے کی رو سے 5 سال تک اگر سینئر میں کوئی بھی خرابی ہوئی تو اس کو ٹھیک کرانا متعلقہ کمپنی کے ذمے ہے۔ لیکن پھر بھی حیرت انگیز طور پر خرابی کی صورت میں کمپنی سے رابطہ نہیں کیا جا رہا۔ میڈیکل سپرنٹنڈنٹ سول اسپتال پروفیسر ڈاکٹر سعید قریشی کا اس سلسلے میں کہنا تھا اس مشین کو ٹھیک کرانا کمپنی کے ذمے ہے ٹھیک نہ کرانے کی صورت میں کمپنی کو بلیک لسٹ کر دیا جاتا ہے اور یہ حکومت کا کام ہے کہ وہ کمپنی سے مشین ٹھیک کرائے بہر حال اس سلسلے میں کوششیں کی جا رہی ہیں۔

**کوٹری (نامہ نگار)** کوٹری میں مضر صحت پریشر گوشت کی فروخت کے سبب ہیپاٹائٹس کے مرض میں اضافہ۔ شہر میں مضر صحت پریشر گوشت کی فروخت کا سلسلہ ایک مرتبہ پھر منظم انداز سے جاری، کوٹری شہر، بہار کالونی، لطیف چوک، غریب آباد، خورشید چوک، خدا کی بستی سمیت 20 سے زائد مراکز پر پریشر مضر صحت گوشت فروخت ہو رہا ہے جس کے استعمال سے لوگوں میں بیماریاں پھیل رہی ہیں دوسری جانب ڈاکٹروں کی رائے میں پریشر گوشت سے ہیپاٹائٹس کے مرض کو فروغ حاصل ہو رہا ہے کوٹری سمیت ضلع بھر میں پریشر گوشت کی دھڑے سے فروخت کا ضلعی انتظامیہ کو علم ہونے کے باوجود انسانی جانوں سے کھیلنے والے قصابوں کے خلاف کوئی کارروائی نہیں کی جارہی۔ مذبح خانہ کی موجودگی کے باوجود عام جگہوں اور شاہراہوں پر لاغر اور بیمار جانوروں کا ذبیحہ جاری ہے شہریوں نے ضلعی انتظامیہ سے مطالبہ کیا ہے کہ فوری طور پر پریشر مضر صحت گوشت فروخت کرنے والے قصابوں کے خلاف کارروائی کرتے ہوئے ان کے پرمٹ منسوخ کئے جائیں۔

**میرپور خاص (نامہ نگار)** میرپور خاص شہر ان دنوں شدید آلودگی کی لپیٹ کی میں ہے جس کے باعث مختلف امراض تیزی سے پھیل رہے ہیں۔ اسپتالوں میں مریضوں کا ہجوم لگا رہتا ہے اور انسانی جانوں کو شدید خطرہ پیدا ہو گیا۔ تفصیلات کے مطابق سخت گرمی کے موسم میں بھی سرد ہواؤں، آموں کی مہک، درختوں کی خوشبو اور صحت و صفائی کے حوالے سے سندھ کے مشہور شہر میرپور خاص ہے۔ آلودگی کی سب سے بڑی وجہ حکومت سندھ کی لا تعلقی، ضلعی اور بلدیہ انتظامیہ کی غیر ذمہ کے شہریوں کو شدید آلودگی کا سامنا داری اور عدم دلچسپی ہے۔ گلی، محلوں، سڑکوں بازاروں کے علاوہ شہر کے اطراف کے علاقوں میں کوڑے کرکٹ کے ڈھیر لگے ہوئے ہیں اور آئے دن کچرے کے ڈھیروں میں آگ لگا دی جاتی ہے جس سے پوری فضا دھوئیں سے آلودہ ہو جاتی ہے۔ علاوہ ازیں شہر بھر میں نکاسی آب کا نظام ناکارہ ہونے کی وجہ سے مختلف رہائشی اور کاروباری علاقوں میں سیو ریتج کاپانی جوہڑوں کی شکل میں جمع ہو گیا ہے، جس سے سخت تعفن ہی نہیں پھیل رہا ہے بلکہ اس سے مچھروں اور زہریلے حشرات الارض کی افزائش بھی ہو رہی ہے۔ شدید آلودگی اور مچھروں کی بہتات کے باعث خارش، آنکھوں، نزلہ، زکام، ملیریا اور بخار سمیت دیگر امراض میں مسلسل اضافہ ہو رہا ہے۔

**ٹنڈوالہ یار (نامہ نگار)** پاکستان بھر میں معصوم بچوں کو پولیو جیسے مہلک مرض سے بچانے کے لیے ہر ماہ پولیو ویکسین دی جاتی ہے تاکہ بچے اس موذی مرض سے محفوظ رہ سکیں۔ ملک بھر کی طرح ٹنڈوالہ یار میں بھی پولیو مہم کے دوران گوٹھ داد جروار کے رہائشی عبد الجلیل لونڈ کے 4 سالہ بچے ساجد لونڈ کو پولیو کے قطرے پلائے گئے تو اس کی حالت خراب ہو گئی اور اس کو سول اسپتال ٹنڈوالہ یار میں داخل کر دیا گیا جہاں فوری طور پر ڈاکٹروں کی ٹیم نے اس بچے کا معائنہ کیا اور ٹیسٹ کروائے۔ اس موقع پر 4 سالہ بچے ساجد کے والدین نے الزام لگاتے ہوئے کہا کہ ہمارے بچے کو بخار تھا، اس حالت میں اس کو پولیو کے قطرے کی پوری شیشی پلائی دی گئی جس کی وجہ سے اس کی حالت خراب ہو گئی اور جسم کے ایک حصے کام کرنا چھوڑ دیا جس کے بعد ہم اس کو فوری طور پر سول اسپتال ٹنڈوالہ یار لے آئے جہاں ڈاکٹروں نے اس کا معائنہ کیا ہے۔ اس حوالے سے رابطہ کرنے پر جنگ کو ایم ایس سول اسپتال ڈاکٹر علی مراد ملانوں نے بتایا کہ اگر بچے کو زیادہ مقدار میں دوائی دی جاتی تو اس کو فوری طور پر الٹی اور دست لگ جاتے مگر ایسا نہیں ہوا۔ ان کا کہنا تھا ایک بیماری ہے جس کو اسے ایف پی (چائلڈ ہیو فلیجیا) کہا جاتا ہے وہ ہو جاتی ہے اور ہمیں اس کا شک ہے اور پولیو اگر ہوتا ہے تو 14 دن کے بعد ظاہر ہوتا ہے، اچانک نہیں پھر بھی ہم نے اس بچے کا سٹی اسکین سمیت دیگر ٹیسٹ کروائے ہیں اور اس کا اسٹول (پاخانہ) لیکر فوری طور پر اسلام آباد بھیجا جائے گا وہاں سے رپورٹ آنے کے بعد پتہ چلے گا کہ اس کو کون سی بیماری ہے۔

کراچی (باہر علی اعوان / اسٹاف رپورٹر) سول اسپتال میں سرکاری دواؤں فروخت کرنے کا انکشاف۔ مریض دواؤں کے لئے ٹھوکریں کھاتے پھرتے ہیں تفصیلات کے مطابق شہر کے دوسرے بڑے سرکاری اسپتال، سول اسپتال میں سرکاری دواؤں فروخت کرنے کا انکشاف ہوا ہے ذرائع کے مطابق سول اسپتال کے مرکزی میڈیکل اسٹور، شعبہ حادثات اور اوپی ڈی میں کام کرنے والے چند افراد دواؤں فروخت کر دیتے ہیں پھر ان دواؤں کو ہول سیل اور پرائیویٹ میڈیکل اسٹورز پر بیچا جاتا ہے جو دواؤں موجود ہوتی ہیں وہ بھی اپنے جاننے والے مریضوں میں تقسیم کر دی جاتی ہیں جن مریضوں کے اسپتال میں تعلقات ہوتے ہیں وہ تو کسی طریقے سے دواؤں حاصل کر لیتے ہیں لیکن غریب مریض دواؤں کے حصول کے لئے ٹھوکریں کھاتے پھرتے ہیں ان سے کہا جاتا ہے کہ دواؤں ختم ہو گئی ہیں آپ ایک ہفتے بعد آکر پتہ کیجیے گا لیکن ہفتوں گزرنے کے بعد بھی انہیں دواؤں مہیا نہیں کی جاتیں مجبوراً انہیں خریدنی پڑتی ہیں اس ساری صورتحال سے مریض شدید پریشان رہتے ہیں ذرائع کے مطابق دواؤں فروخت کرنے والوں نے باقاعدہ ایک مافیا کی شکل اختیار کر لی ہے اور اسپتال انتظامیہ ان کے سامنے بے بس ہو گئی ہے۔ میڈیکل سپرنٹنڈنٹ سول اسپتال پروفیسر ڈاکٹر سعید قریشی سے جب استفسار کیا گیا تو ان کا کہنا تھا کہ اس طرح کی شکایات سامنے آرہی تھیں جس کے باعث ہم نے پورا نظام کمپیوٹرائزڈ کر دیا ہے اب دواؤں بیچنے کا احتمال باقی نہیں ہے دواؤں بیچنے میں ملوث ملازمین کے بارے میں ان کا کہنا تھا کہ ایسے ملازمین کو ہم ملازمت سے فارغ نہیں کر سکتے تاہم ان کا دوسرے شعبوں میں تبادلہ کر دیا جاتا ہے

کراچی (اسٹاف رپورٹر) ایسپلائز ویلفیئر ایسوسی ایشن جامعہ کراچی کا ایک اجلاس ایسوسی ایشن کے دفتر میں منعقد ہوا جس کی صدارت ریحان صدیقی صدر آفیسرز ویلفیئر ایسوسی ایشن نے کی۔ اجلاس میں آفیسرز ویلفیئر ایسوسی ایشن اور صدر ایسپلائز ویلفیئر ایسوسی ایشن محمد فرحان خان وارا کین، کوآرڈینیٹیشن کمیٹی اور ملازمین کی بھاری تعداد نے شرکت کی۔ اجلاس میں کراچی یونیورسٹی میڈیکل انشورنس پالیسی پر بحث کی گئی اور تمام اراکین و ملازمین سے فرد افراد رائے لی گئی جس میں ملازمین کی بڑی تعداد نے پالیسی پر اپنے تحفظات کا اظہار کیا چنانچہ طے پایا کہ جو پالیسی میڈیکل کے حوالے سے پہلے جاری ہے اس کو ہی جاری رکھا جائے البتہ اس میں مزید بہتری لائی جائے، موثر بنایا جائے اور چیک اینڈ بیلنس رکھا جائے۔ ایک اور فیصلہ کیا گیا کہ جامعہ کراچی کے ہسپتال میں موجود اسپتالوں کی تعداد میں مزید اضافہ کیا جائے۔ آخر میں صدر ایسپلائز ویلفیئر ایسوسی ایشن وارا کین نے نئی انشورنس پالیسی کے حوالے سے ایک قرارداد پیش کی جس کو اکثریت نے مسترد کر دیا جبکہ جامعہ کراچی کے میڈیکل کے حوالے سے درپیش معاملات کو فی الفور حل کرنے کی قرارداد کو منظور کر لیا گیا

میرپور خاص (نامہ نگار) سول اسپتال میرپور خاص مختلف سنگین مسائل سے دوچار ہے، کروڑوں روپے مالیت کی مشینری اور آلات ناکارہ پڑے ہیں، مختلف امراض کے ڈاکٹرز کے عہدے خالی ہیں، ادویات کی خریداری میں مبینہ بے قاعدگیوں کی بازگشت ہے، اور غریب مریضوں کو شدید چوتھے بڑے شہر اور ڈیڑھ ٹنل ہیڈ کو اثر میرپور خاص میں واقع سول اسپتال حکومت سندھ اور محکمہ صحت مشکلات ہیں۔ تفصیلات کے مطابق سندھ کے عدم توجہ، سیاسی دباؤ، اور کرپشن کی وجہ سے ایک طویل عرصے سے شدید مشکلات سے دوچار ہے، اور غریب مریضوں کو نجی اسپتالوں اور ڈاکٹروں کے رحم و کرم پر چھوڑ دیا گیا ہے، رپورٹ کے مطابق کروڑوں روپے مالیت کی لیتھوٹریسی مشین ایک عرصے سے ناکارہ پڑی ہے، مختلف شعبوں میں اسٹینتھو اسکوپ اور بی پی آپریٹر ناکارہ ہیں، جو مریضوں کی مشکلات میں مزید اضافے کا باعث بنے ہوئے ہیں۔ مختلف امراض کے اسپیشلسٹ، میل اور فی میل ڈاکٹرز کے عہدے خالی پڑے ہیں، مختلف ڈاکٹر اثر و رسوخ کی بنیاد پر مختلف شفٹوں میں ڈیوٹی دینے سے گریز اور من مانی کرتے ہیں، ادویات اور دیگر سامان کی خریداری کے حوالہ سے اسکیڈل سامنے آتے رہتے ہیں، اور حال ہی میں لاکھوں روپے کی ادویات کی خریداری سے متعلق تحقیقات میں اہم انکشافات سامنے آئے ہیں، لیکن رپورٹ کو خفیہ رکھا جا رہا ہے، اسپتال کے مختلف شعبوں کی عمارتیں خطرناک قرار دینے کے باوجود کام کر رہی ہیں جس سے کسی بھی وقت کوئی بڑا سانحہ پیش آسکتا ہے۔

کراچی (باہر علی اعوان / اسٹاف رپورٹر) سول اسپتال کی ایم آر آئی مشین خراب، مریضوں کو شدید پریشانی کا سامنا۔ تفصیلات کے مطابق سول اسپتال کی ایم آر آئی مشین گزشتہ دو سال سے خراب ہے۔ تقریباً ساڑھے 3 کروڑ روپے مالیت کی یہ قیمتی مشین اپنی تنصیب کے 1 ماہ بعد ہی خراب ہو گئی تھی جسے ٹھیک کرایا گیا تھا 2 ماہ بعد پھر یہ مشین خراب ہو گئی جسے تاحال ٹھیک نہیں کرایا گیا جس کے باعث مریضوں کو شدید پریشانی کا سامنا کرنا پڑ رہا ہے اور انہیں پرائیویٹ اسپتالوں سے ایم آر آئی کرانا پڑ رہا ہے۔ واضح رہے کہ میگنٹک ریسوننس امیجنگ (ایم آر آئی) ایک مہنگا ٹیسٹ ہے جس کی پرائیویٹ اسپتالوں میں فیس 4 ہزار روپے سے لیکر 20 ہزار روپے تک ہے جبکہ سول اسپتال میں یہ سہولت مفت فراہم کی جا رہی تھی مگر انتظامیہ کی نااہلی کے باعث 2 سال گزرنے کے باوجود اس مشین کو ٹھیک نہیں کرایا گیا۔ ذرائع کے مطابق سول اسپتال کا ایم آر آئی اینڈ سٹی اسکن سینٹر 5 سالہ

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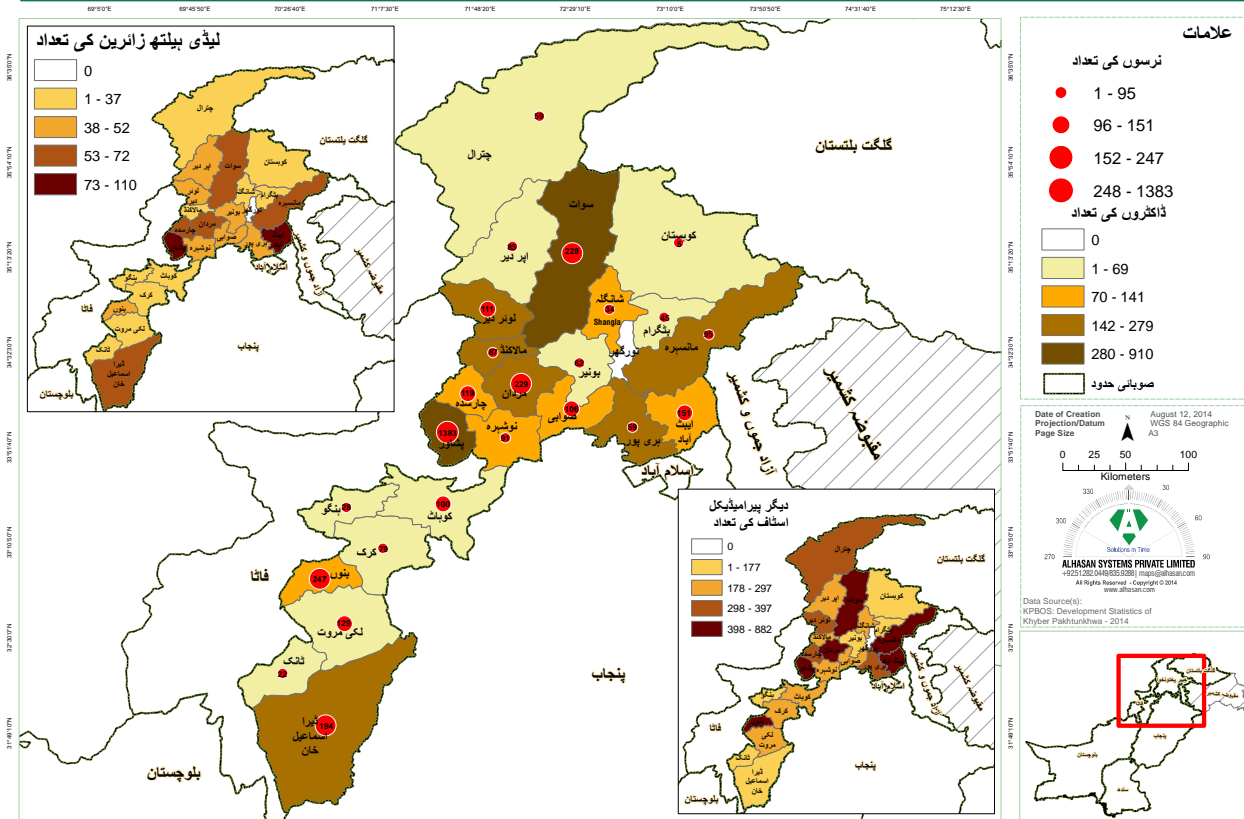
